



It is likely that Florida legislators in their search for more money to spend will be looking again this year to taxing advertising. But it isn't as simple as that. One only has to stop and consider the ponderous labor required to tax all advertising and advertising-related business and items in Florida to see that this one point alone should be enough to stop further

consideration of the subject. Imagine for a moment how difficult it would become to stay impartial and fair to Florida businessmen because to do so all advertising coming into the state would have to be taxed as well as that originating here. This would mean all newspapers and magazines brought and sent into Florida would have to be taxed, along with all national radio and TV programs, all pieces of direct mail, and even trucks, railroad cars and airplanes carrying advertising messages printed on them.

For a state built on advertising and promotion such a restrictive tax could possibly reserve our present growth pattern. This would seriously affect many businesses throughout the state. When business suffers, so do tax collections and progress. We became a great nation under the free enterprise system. Regulation and tax on advertising would stifle business.

This great state has huge tasks ahead of it, tasks in which business and industry will be the prime movers. But great tasks are never accomplished by a hamstrung free enterprise system. If great goals are to be reached we must find ways to keep our communicative free enterprise system free and clear of discriminatory

AMILIO.

Although cars kill more than 20,000 Americans every year, we seldom think of a car as a murder weapon. Nevertheless, with growing frequency, motorists are being convicted of the crime of murder by auto-

The key ingredient, upping the offense from mere manclaughter to murder, is malice. And a jury may find malice by logical deduction from the circumstances of the killing.

For example: A man who was rebuffed by his girl friend pushed her out of the car, ran her down, then backed over her prostrate body. In this behavior a jury found ample evidence of maliclous intent, and brought in a verdict of murder by automo-



Even if a driver has no specific intent to kill anybody, he may still commit murder - if his conduct is reckless enough to imply malice.

Thus, in another case, a man decided it would be great fun to drive up close to pedestrians and make them jump. After playing this little game several times, he misjudged his distance and struck down an inno-

Tried afterward for murder by automobile, the man pleaded a lack of any intent to kill. But the court found him guilty as charged.

"Malice," said the judge, "does not necessarily mean an actual intent to take human life. It may be implied, as when an act is done so recklessly as to manifest depravity of mind and disregard of human life." Still, however wrongful a driver's conduct, he is not guilty of murder if there is no cussal connection between his bad driving and the accident

smallest, lamb. How are they identified? . By the characteristic shape and size, as indicated above. There are other differences, too, depending upon whether this meat is fresh, pickled. corned or smoked. Tongue also is available canned in glass, already cooked. How is tongue prepared?

Smoked, corned or pickled tongue may require soaking before cooking. All should be cooked slowly In water until tender. Beef tongue will take from three to four hours, but the others will take less. Cook fresh tongue by covering with water, allowing one teaspoon of salt for each quart of water. Spices and vegetables may be added as seasoning. Cover tightly and cook slowly until tender. When tender, plunge in cold water and remove skin; cut off roots. Serve hot or cold, cut in thin parallel slices.
