Krider Optimistic After Washington Conference

Key Support Given St. Johns Canal

Practical and important support for the St. Johns-Indian River canal, a key development in the surge ahead being felt in Sanford and Seminole County, was gained at the recent meeting of the National Rivers and Harbors Congress in Washington.

This is the word from John Krider who attended the convention as an official delegate.

He is generally rated as having been in the front ranks of those who early saw the possibilities for increased water-borne traffic and the accompanying benefits for Sanford with its Lake Monroe and the St. Johns had solid support.

For instance, Krider recalled the settlement expressed by Henry Buckman, NRI&I president, who termed the canal as one of the most strategic in the United States and urged speed-up of the final plans so that funds could be logically asked for and procured.

In Washington the Florida Waterways Association, Inc., of which Krider is a director-at-large, held a board meeting on May 30. At that time the Sanford executive took the opportunity of inviting the association to come to Sanford for its 1968 convention, to enjoy the marina and motel which would be completed by then, and taste the joys of boating on the St. Johns.

The St. Johns-Indian River canal has been a proposal discussed for several years. At present, however, Krider, chairman of the canal district, feels that changes in length—reduced from 45 to 30 miles—and cost—estimated—reduced from \$20 million to \$14 million—have been helpful. Now, he believes is the time to push for the completion of the preliminary plans. These include the bridges and locks.

Push EDA Aid

City and county officials hope to meet with the state coordinator for the Economic Development Administration here "as soon as possible" to seek ways for North Seminole County to get federal loans to provide new industry and permanent jobs for the area.

At an informal City Commission meeting last night, commissioners met with officials of the Port Authority, Chamber and Sanford Industrial Board on ways for the county to acquire federal funds for needed projects.

Monday, the North Seminole area was designated an economically depressed area and was given a high priority for federal study loans.

Chamber of Commerce Executive secretary John Krider emphasized the first step was to "set up the mechanics making the program acceptable to economic development."

He said under the program the city could borrow money to acquire NAS property and have 10 years to pay. He also stressed the city could get a 100 percent grant for access roads to the base.

Krider urged the first step would be to get in touch with Forrest Holland, the state coordinator for EDA.

Port Authority Administrator Francis Roumillat, Jr. gave a brief background into the program spelling out its main function was to provide new industry and permanent jobs. He said "Sanford has been designated a depressed area because of the loss of jobs when the Naval base is phased out next year."

'Diamond' Project To Open In July

The Lake Mary Interchange at Interstate 4 will be completed and opened by mid-July, J. C. Lavender, county superintendent reports.

"The Interchange is being finished now and work is proceeding on schedule," Lavender said.

The county road program is still ahead of schedule with completion of improvements on Holiday Drive, Little Wewka Road, Jackson and North Streets and Dean Road expected within the next 30 days.

Only two or three projects remain to be done during this budget year following completion of these five roads. Budgeted for the fiscal year the road department was \$220,000.

The charge was promptly denied in Britain and the United States, which have declared non-belligerence in the day-day conflict.

The Soviet Union, backing the Arabs, charged that Israel started the war.

Israel, seemingly with air superiority over the front, claimed the destruction of at least 374 Arab planes. Israel admitted losing 19 planes, while the Arab commands claimed 183 were shot down.

An indication of Israel's air superiority came from a Jordanian communique in Amman. It said there was "a huge umbrella of Israeli aircraft over the whole Jordanian front."

As the war intensified, mobs attacked U.S. facilities in Damascus and Baghdad and the consulate in Egypt's Alexandria.

In addition to striking deep into the northern Sinai Desert, the Israeli army announced the virtual occupation of the Gaza Strip on the Mediterranean with the capture of the city of Gaza, Egyptian administrative headquarters.

The strip had been bypassed by Israeli forces striking south and west and Radio Israel called on the strip's residents to surrender. Most of the strip's residents are Arab refugees from the Israeli Arab war of 1948.

More than 30 miles west of the strip, the Israeli army fanned out from the captured key coastal town of El Arish in the Sinai Peninsula and seized Bir Lachpan to the southwest, an army announcement in Tel Aviv said.

The Israel column at El Arish was in a position to strike deep into the Sinai Peninsula, said the Israeli official, and Andrew Caraway and Carl Schiller, Port Authority directors.

Bradley said there was a dire need for increased units here. "There are some 1,300 sub-standard dwellings in the city limits," Bradley said.

Study of the costs of building the streets in the trailer park had been requested several months ago by the residents of Mobile Manor with a view toward the residents there participating with the county on the road construction.

Sanford summer recreation program is off to a flood stage of children, according to Jim Jernigan, director of recreation and Parks, with opening day Monday having 120 elementary age children in attendance.

"This morning (Tuesday) I look out over the Civic Center pool and see nothing but a sea of children," he said. Parents bring their tots in and leave them in the care of qualified supervisors, for the hours of 8:30 a.m. to Noon.

Advance registration for the Elementary day Monday was up over 200 Monday. For Special Activities for teenagers, over 100 advance registrations have been received. This seems an indication of a successful program for 1967, Jernigan said.
