The Old And Young

The Gainesville Sun in a recent edition has brought to our attention a number of other luminaries who figured largely in the affairs of the world in bygone days. Martin Luther, it says, was only twenty-nine when he wrote the manifesto which led to the Reformation.

Thomas Jefferson was thirty-three when he drafted the Declaration of Independence. Alexander Hamilton was aid-de-camp of Washington at twenty, and at thirty-two first Secretary of the Treasury.

Napoleon was twenty-seven when he was appointed to the command of the Army of Italy, and thirty-five when he crowned himself Emperor of the French.

James Fox was Lord of the Admiralty and a thorn in the side of George III at twenty-one. William Pitt became Chancellor of the Exchequer at twenty-three, and Prime Minister at twenty-four.

Balzac wrote seventy-nine novels between the ages of thirty and forty-three. James Bryce had written "The Holy Roman Empire" at twenty-six. Benjamin Franklin had written "Poor Richard's Almanac" at the same age.

Ruskin wrote "Modern Painters" at twenty-four. Stevenson had completed "Treasure Island" at thirty-three. William Lecky had completed the exhaustive "History of European Morals" at thirty-one.

Sheridan wrote "The School for Scandal" at twenty-seven. Shakespeare had completed ten of his greatest plays at thirty-two. Newton formulated the law of gravitation at twenty-four.

Thus we can see from this that if this is the "young man's age", other ages were not far from it either. But on the other hand this is quite as much of an "old man's age" as a "young man's age".

Football At Night

There are two major purposes of athletic sports, as we see it, one to let off steam and the other to build up morale. Were it not for football, college students with a superabundance of pep might be expected to tear down their dormitories.

Now that night football is coming into vogue, it is to be expected that the game will prove even more effective in banishing cares and worries. EAT MORE VEGETABLES

Raw starches in the form of uncooked vegetables are foreseen as a possible substitute for insulin in the treatment of diabetes when it is in its early stages. This is of importance to the medical world as this disease is one of the most deadly the human race knows.

After two years of research work Dr. H. M. Rosenthal, pharmacologist of the hygienic laboratory of the United States Public Health Service, has determined that raw starches may be used without any appreciable rise in blood sugar.

The effect of insulin, it is pointed out, keeps the sugar from rising in a patient's blood after a meal. Further tests are being carried out to determine whether raw vegetables, taken as a part of a meal will not be as effective as insulin otherwise administered.
