Osteen Pridge, SR-415 east of Sanford, will be replaced by a \$2.6 million span scheduled to be completed by the Fall of 1976

During the last 20 years the citizens of Central Florida have been pleading with the state to replace the antiquated wooden Osteen bridge on SR-415, east of Sanford, where it crosses the St. Johns River and serves as a connector between Seminole

and Volusia Counties. Yesterday, the Florida Department of Transportation (DOT) opened bids for the construction of a new span which will be approximately one-half mile long and be a part of a 1.6 miles overall road project.

Low bidder of 12 different companies was Houdaille-Duval-Wright, (HDW), Inc., Jacksonville at \$2,615,255.21. DOT had estimated the bid at \$3.3 million.

Ford Gets Congress Okay

To Use Troops In Saigon

WASHINGTON (AP) - Turning aside fears of new U.S. combat deaths, Congress early today voted to give President Ford authority to use American military forces, if necessary, to evacuate Vietnamese as well as Americans from South Vietnam. But Ford is prohibited in separate bills approved by the House and the Senate from evacuating any endangered South Vietnamese with any U.S. forces other than those needed to get out Americans and their dependents.

Liquor, Sterility Linked

PITTSBURGH, Pa. (AP) - A panel of doctors studying alcoholism says it has found a definite relationship between alcoholism and male sterility. Dr. Joshua Perper, chief forensic pathologist for the Allegheny County coroner's office, says severe testicle damage was found in men with a history of alcoholism and it could result from two causes. He said damage to the liver could prevent the liver from neutralizing female hormones produced in the male, or the alcohol itself may be toxic to the testicles.

Women Warned Of X-Rays

WASHINGTON (AP) - Routine X-ray examinations for breast cancer in women under the age of 35 should be avoided because the screening procedure itself may cause tumors, a Food and Drug Administration advisory panel says. The advisory committee also called for more studies on the safety and effectiveness of such X-rays, called mammography, in women aged 35-50 years. The panel also urged physicians to determine whether female patients are pregnant before taking abdominal X-rays.

Reforming Record Help For Congress

The Congressional Record is a disgrace to Congress and should be reformed.

The most obvious abuse is the insertion in the printed record of personal reelection campaign material. Robert F. Drinan, D-Mass., recently had his entire voting record for 1974 printed in the Record, using 22 pages at a cost of \$278 per page. That's \$6,116 of the taxpayers' money.

This is a time-honored congressional prerogative but it should be curbed.

More important, the Congressional Record should be purged of extraneous matter including "speeches" never delivered (one by Hale Boggs was printed two days after his death in an Alaskan plane crash), newspaper editorals and articles, press releases and other miscellany. Such items now make the Record a confused collection.

The printed record should be an actual record of oral proceedings in the chamber. All extraneous printed or written matter should be printed if worth printing, in a separate appendix.

Some bunkum and disorder is indigenous to democracy, can't be helped and may in fact be healthy. But the Congressional Record as now constituted carries this confusion principle to a deplorable extreme.

No Public Interest

Most targets of an apparent witch hunt by the Consumer Product Safety Commission have taken a dim view - understandably -- of a commission request to reveal voluntarily the chemical formulas of their products. Only about 10 per cent of the several thousand firms

solicited have divulged the closely guarded content of the some 21,000 items with which they compete for the consumer market. In a period which has spawned the bureaucratic "leak," they are justifiably wary of pledges of computer-maintained con-

Now, under authority of the General Accounting Office, the commission is prepared to order the firms to surrender their secrets in the name of consumer protection. The goal is to find the "potential and real hazards associated with these products." The study list ranges from detergents to rust removers. Bear in mind that the commission has no specific com-

plaints with which to deal — it merely seeks a "data base." Since the formulas of products suspected of hazardous content can be readily analyzed, the commission seems to have gone beyond its mission of protecting to the meddling stage.

Card Un-American

Attorney General Edward H. Levi has reversed an earlier recommendation by the Justice Department that job applicants in the United States of America be required to prove that they are citizens or legally admitted aliens. He is troubled, and we think justifiably, by the suggestion that Americans might have to carry a "domestic passport" as a proof of their identity.

The argument for the identity card lies in the problem of

detecting illegal aliens who apply for jobs. Congress is considering legislation that would make employers responsible for keeping illegal aliens off their payrolls. It is hard to see how such legislation could be workable unless employers have some means of establishing whether a job applicant is a legal resident

Mr. Levi recongizes that an official identity card would be a surrender of "something akin to a constitutional right" for the sake of expediency in dealing with the problems of illegal aliens. Most Americans agree that persons entering the country illegally should have no right to compete for jobs with citizens and legal residents. However, we think they also would feel uncomfortable if their own status as citizens had to be confirmed by an identity card which only the government has the power to issue-or to revoke or deny. We hope with Mr. Levi that the illegal alien problem ban be solved without tightening the embrace of a Big Brother government around our individual

W. German Embassy Seized By Terrorists in Stockholm

STOCKHOLM, Sweden (AP) - Three men and two women, some of them armed with submachine guns, shot and killed one person and took several others hostage in the West German Embassy today, police reported. "Most probably these five are members of the West German Baader-Meinhof gang," an anarchist group whose leading members are awaiting trial in Stuttgart later this year, Police Commissioner Karl-Erik Stenbaeck

According to Stenbaeck, several shots were fired in the office of West German Ambassador Dietrich Stoecker, 60. The identity of the person slain was not immediately

Unconfirmed reports said the West German military attache was among the hostages, whom the terrorists threatened to kill if the building was not immediately evacuated. Other reports said the ambassador himself was taken prisoner. An unknown number of the 40 staff members were still

inside the four-story building, which is near the British and U.S. embassies.

Portuguese Head To Polls

LISBON, Portugal (AP) - Moderate Portuguese politicians believe the election Friday for a constitutional assembly is the last chance for democracy in Portugal. The country's leftist military rulers banned several parties they considered too far to the right or left and dictated the outlines of the constitution that the assembly is to write. But the moderate Socialist and Popular Democratic parties feel that they and the conservative Center Social Democrats will win a majority large enough to encourage moderate officers to curb their radical colleagues who seized control of the ruling military politburo last month.

Snake Fanciers Create 'Mystery'

NEW YORK (AP) - Snakes began disappearing from their locked cages at the Bronx Zoo and the keepers were puzzled. When one disappeared and then reappeared in its cage three days later, the keepers were dumbfounded. The discovery of some unusual snakes at a local pet shop, however, uncoiled the mystery and led to the arrest of a teenage snake fancier and his friend who police say

turned their hobby into snake snaring for-profit. The mastermind of the scheme was a 15-year-old who slithered into the snake house through an air-conditioning duct armed with a zoology book to determine which of the reptiles were poisonous, said Bronx Dist. Atty. Mario Me-

"This youngster, a snake fancier, was able to roam through the snake house at will after hours, making repeated visits to the place with the snakes and to steal them," said Merola.

The youth, who was not identified because of his age, was arrested with his alleged accomplice, Steven Gonzales, 17, of the Bronx.

On one occasion, Merola said, the younger boy opened the cage of a spitting cobra but slammed the glass panel shut just as the snake shot a jet of venom at him.
