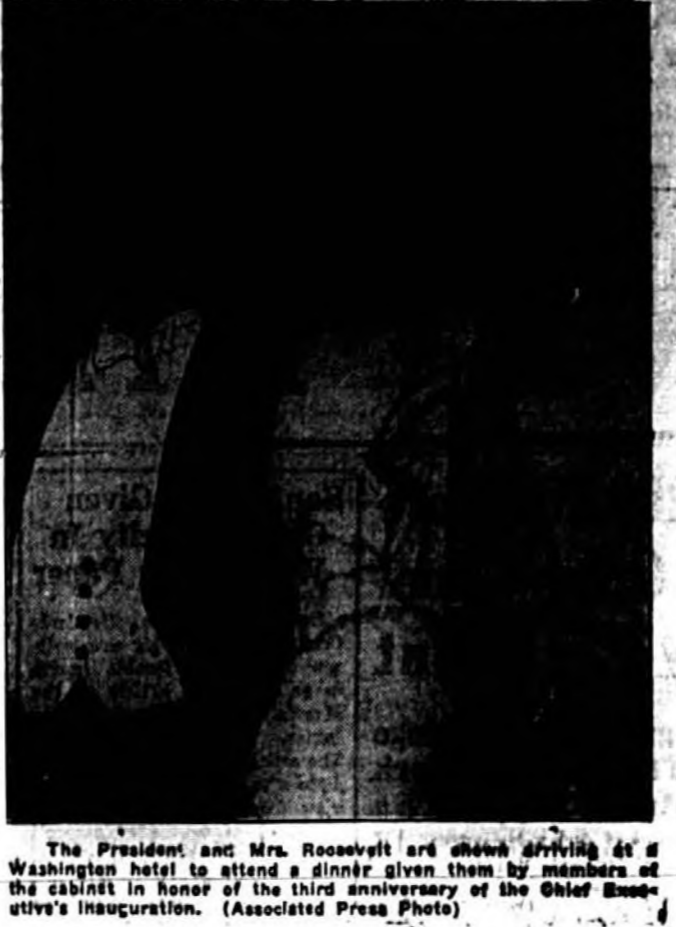

Deputies Acquitted Of Death Of Woman

ELIZABETH, N. J., Mar. 7.—Four former deputy sheriffs, charged with manslaughter in connection with the death of Mrs. Sophie Crempa in a feud with a utilities company, were acquitted last night.

A jury which deliberated three hours decided that Charles Richmond and Vincent Cardon—were not guilty.

The shooting grew out of an eight-year feud which John Crempa waged in an attempt to bring the New Jersey Service Electric Company from running power lines across his farm.

He shot crested the power lines several times, and the four deputies were ordered to serve a warrant, charging criminal contempt.

When they attempted to serve the warrant, shooting started. Mrs. Crempa was killed and her husband was wounded.

The defense of the deputies was that the Crempas opened fire first, but testimony also was produced tending to show that the family was unarmed.

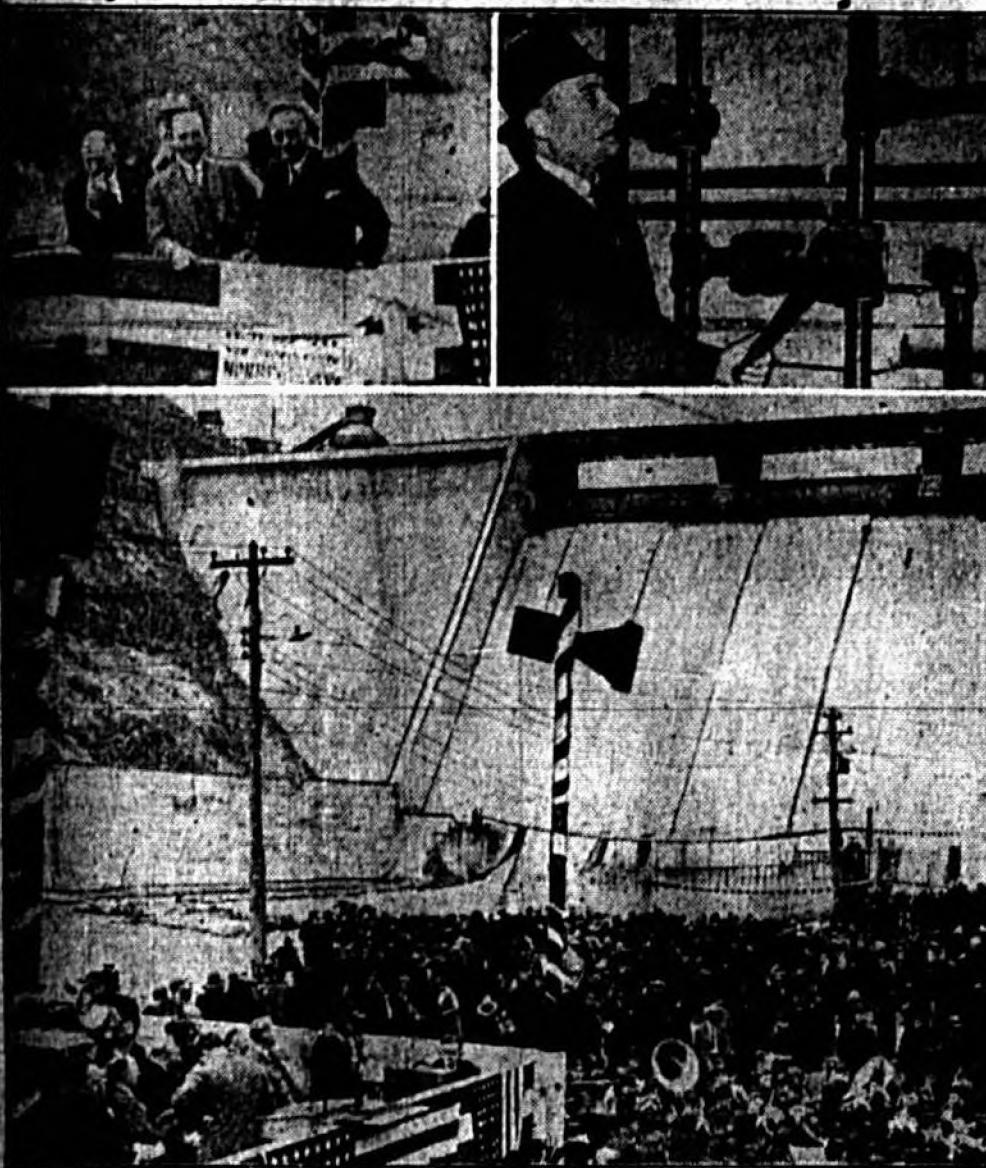

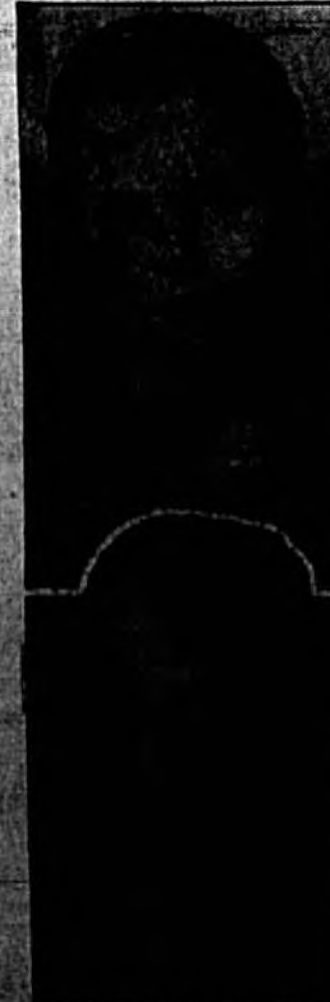

CHAMBERY, France, Mar. 7.—(AP)—France numbers Victor Emmanuel II of Italy as her most distinguished taxpayer in this region. He is assessed as owner of the domain of Honcourt on which the historic abbey stands, burial place of 45 princes of the House of Savoy. When the king's grandfather, Victor Emmanuel I, ceded Savoy to France in 1860, a special provision provided that the domain should remain the private property of the House of Savoy.
