

Move Is On In Altamonte Springs To Save Trees

BY DONNA ESTES like me. But only God can make a tree. These words by poet Joyce Kilmer were penned more than 50 years ago and ecologists today are picking up the chant. In Seminole County particularly with the upsurge in building, more and more trees that have withstood the ravages of time and the elements are being razed to the ground to make way for all sorts of developments.

In recent weeks Altamonte Springs Vice Mayor Helen Keyser and Longwood's Zoning Board have moved to save the trees by taking action to stop their indiscriminate destruction.

The pattern for the action was found in Winter Park where an ordinance on trees was recently adopted. In the enacting section, the ordinance points out "Trees beautify our city and break the monotony of endless sidewalks and miles of highways and streets... provide a setting with pleasing shades and patterns and give shade and cool the land."

It is also noted "Trees are an invaluable psychological counterpoint to manmade urban settings, camouflage harsh scenery and unsightly cityscape and soften the outline of masonry, metal and glass."

As Mrs. Keyser said when she recently saw a large oak removed to make way for development, "I took God 50 years to nurture that tree and it only took moments to destroy it."

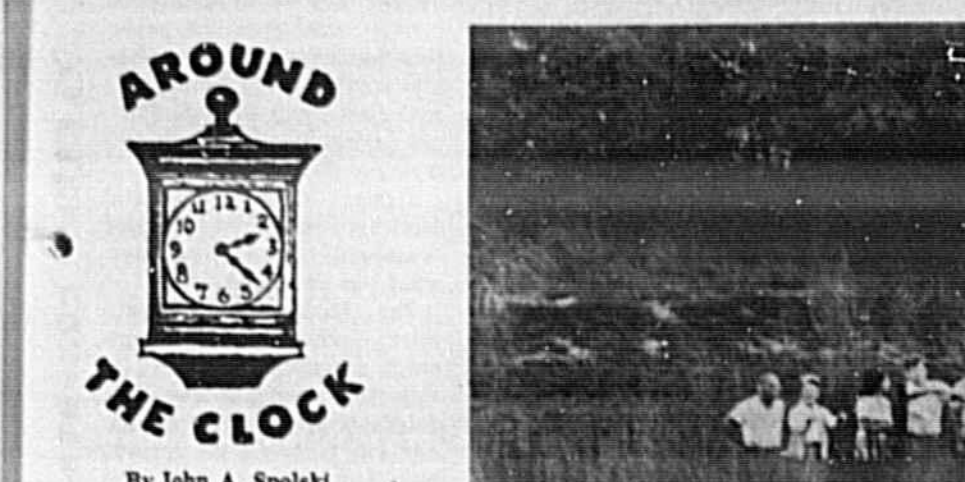

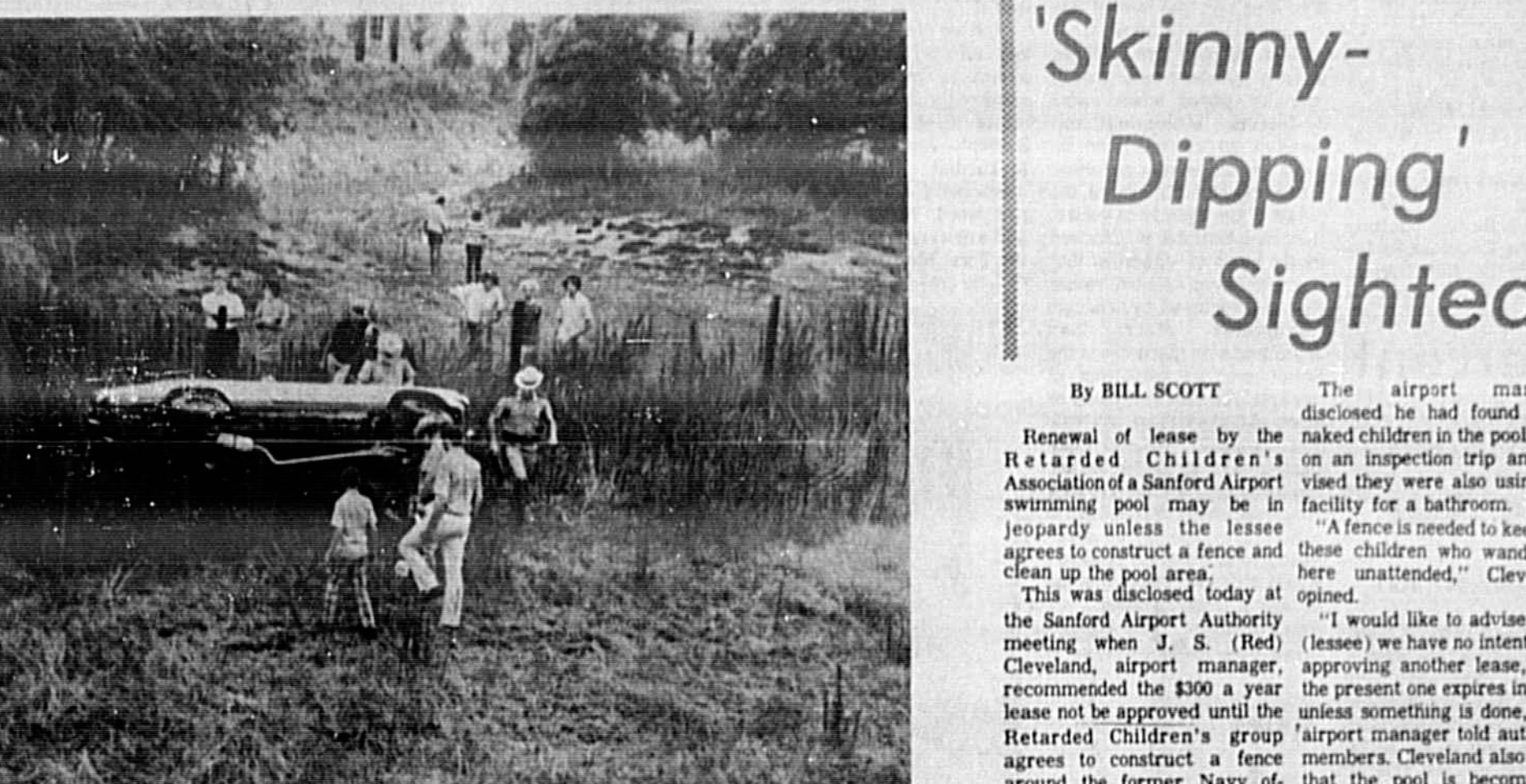

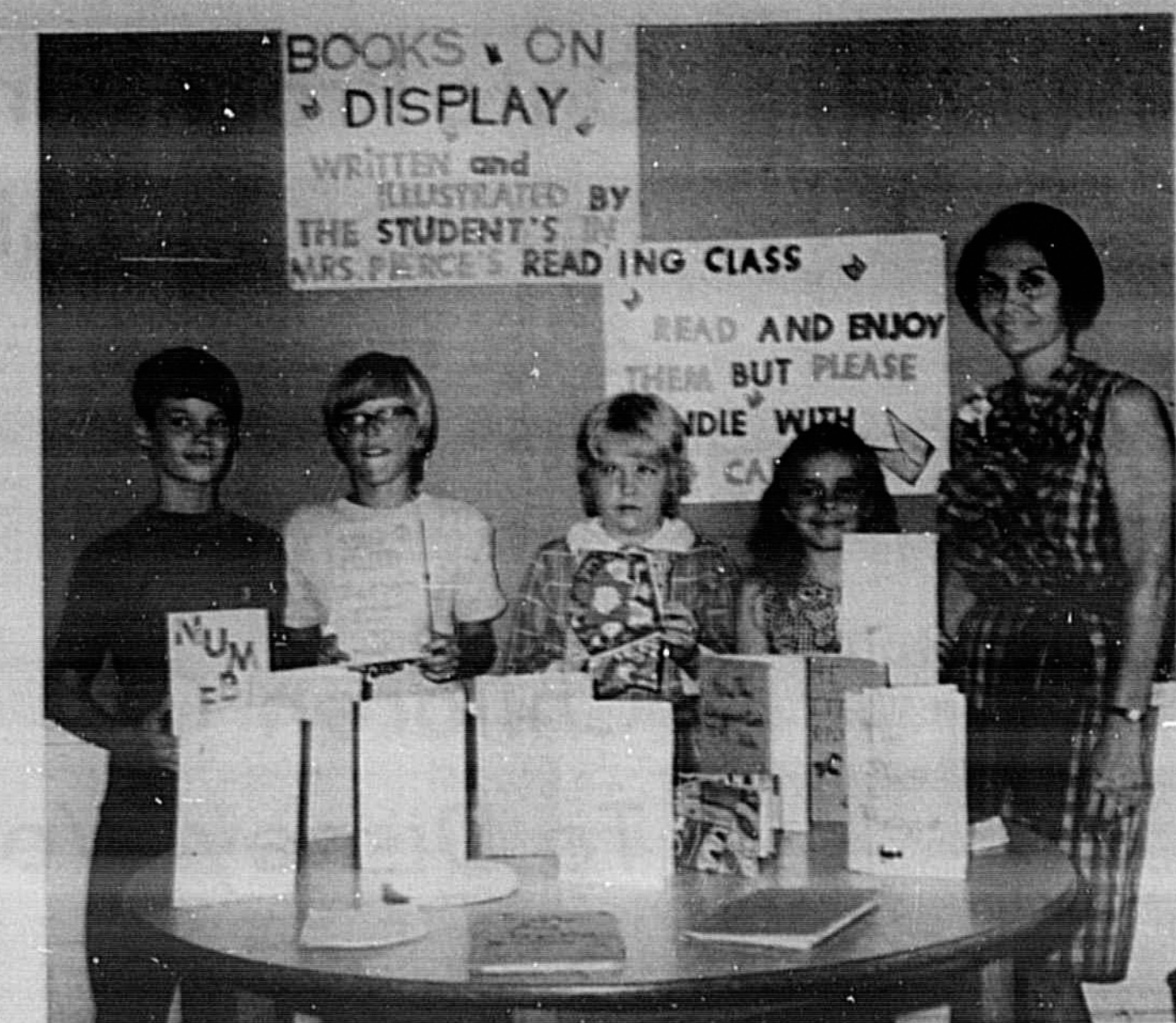

With Federal Grant Recreation Facilities Eyed

ALTAMONTE SPRINGS—An innovative idea of planting landscaping stock at the city's sewer treatment site for use in beautifying municipally-owned properties is given much of the credit by city hall staff here for the \$125,675 U. S. Department of Housing and Urban Development state approved grant from the Legacy of Parks program.

The grant must be matched by city funds to provide a one-quarter million dollar expenditure.

Cost breakdowns for the improvements include baseball and football field, \$30,000; Little League baseball field, \$10,000; two basketball courts, \$7,500; tennis courts, \$6,000; picnic components \$15,000; playground, \$10,000; pool, \$75,000 and parking and landscaping, \$46,500, all at the civic center and recreational complex for a total of \$200,000.

At the Hermit's Trail Park is planned a total expenditure of \$18,000 with breakdown as follows: playground, \$10,000; picnic area, \$2,000; existing building repair, \$2,000 and landscaping, \$4,000.

Pollution Fight Aided By Trees

The importance of saving trees was stressed by Seminole County Pollution Control Officer Larry Adair in an interview with The Herald and the idea of an ordinance to stop land developers from unnecessarily destroying them was termed a good one.

Adair said that while many land developers find it easier to clear all the land with one swoop and perhaps less costly, trees play an important part in the environment.

"Other than their esthetic value, trees through photosynthesis remove carbon dioxide from the air and convert it to oxygen," Adair declared. He pointed out that often the land is stripped bare of large trees and replaced by "little spindly ones" which in 10 years are still small ones.

In addition to esthetic values and photo-synthesis, muddy run-off during rain storms end up in streams thus polluting them.

Adair also pointed out when too many trees disappear and are replaced by too many cars and too many people, a polluted atmosphere results.

The Longwood Zoning Board one week ago began its study of an ordinance to require land developers to acquire permits giving reasons before any trees are allowed destroyed. The board is expected to recommend adoption by the City Council of the ordinance in July.

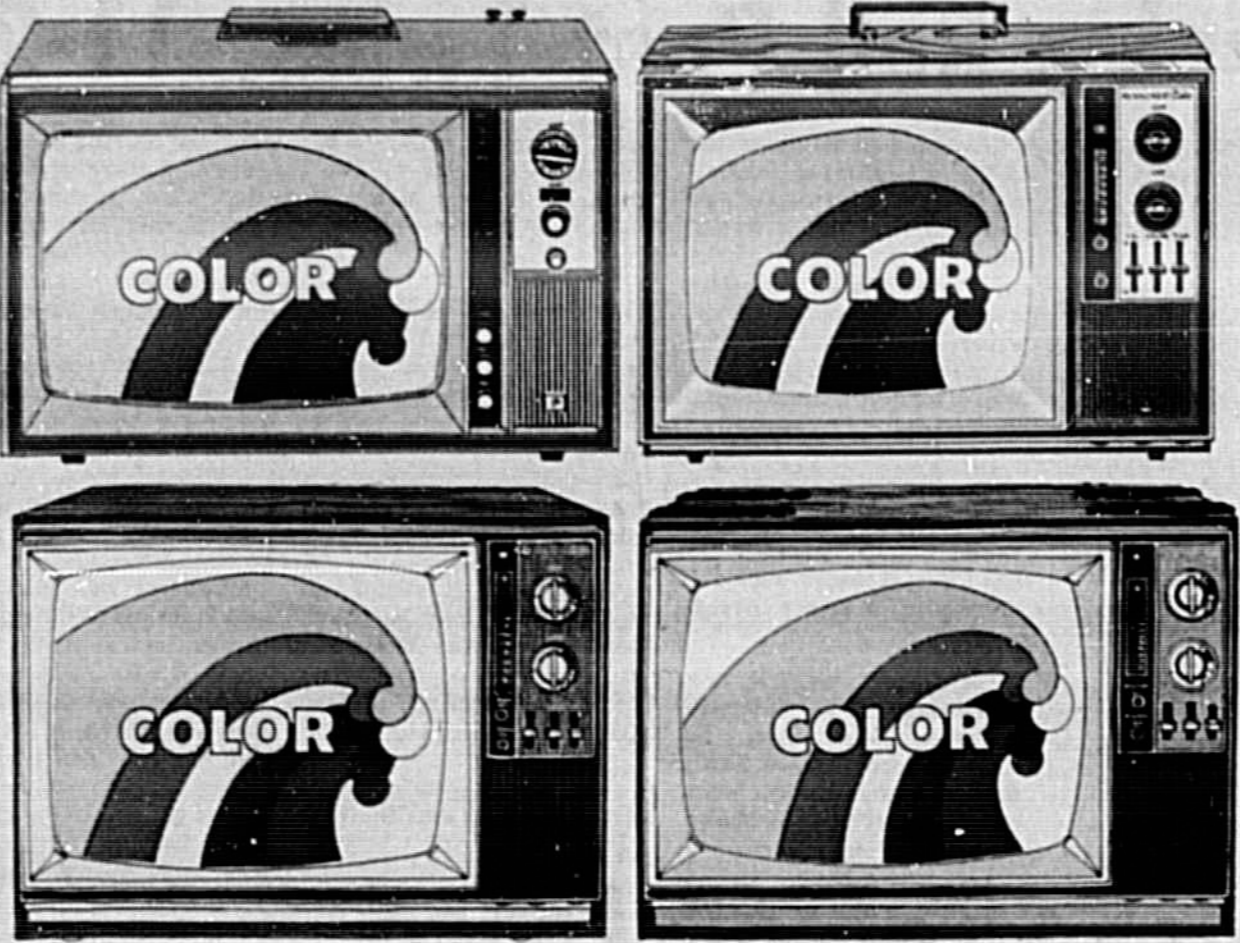

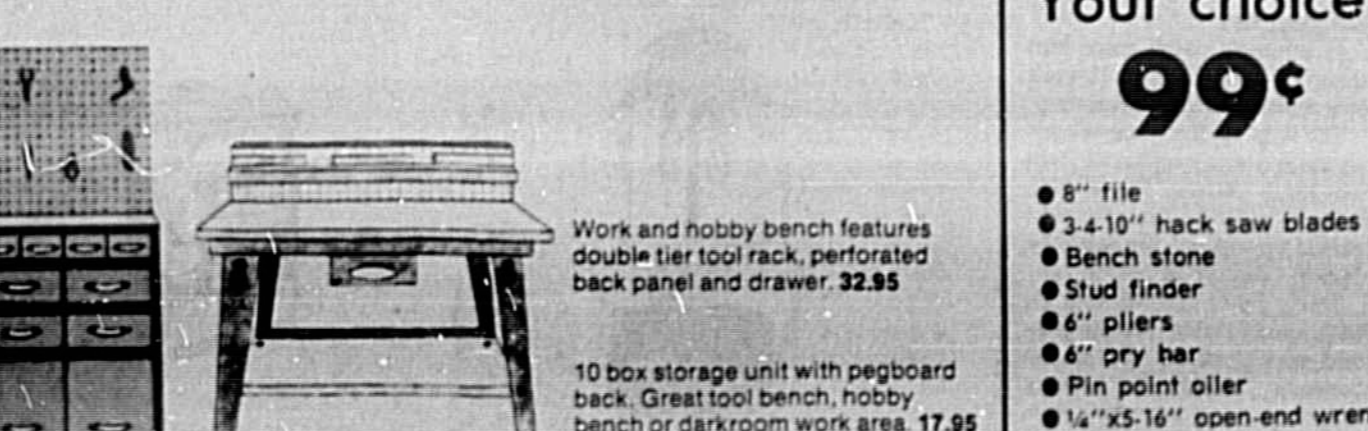
