Saying he was speaking for School Supt. Bud ayer, Pelley said, "You people have been hired as teachers first. All collective bargaining sessions, as of right now, will be held after school hours."

Rosenthal called that "unrealistic" and said "It's just not going to work." Rosenthal said he hoped to complete the contract before teachers go being finished by June because the school board won't know until the end of the legislative session what funding will be.

"You've closed the door on during school hours bargaining sessions," Rosenthal argued. But Pelley said it's still an open matter. He said at some later date school official could amend their position.

After the meeting, Pelley said he would be "tickled pink" to see contract negotiations complete in the 60-day time frame allotted by PERC. The negotiator also said he wasn't stalling on issues, but firmly believed it would take 19 working days to study the contract proposal.

As far as finishing before teachers go home Pelley said the SEA negotiators, who also are teachers, would just have to stay and bargain if a contract wasn't wrapped up before that time

Emergency Aid Passage

Rests On Ford's Appeal

WASHINGTON (AP) - Sen. John G. Tower says President Ford will have to be "extremely persuasive" to get Congress to approve emergency military aid funds for South Vietnam. The Texas Republican is chairman of the Senate GOP Policy Committee and a principal backer of administration foreign policy. He spoke to newsmen as Congress awaited recommendations from President Ford to a joint session of Congress Thursday night.

Vietnamese Navy On Scene

WASHINGTON (AP) - The North Vietnamese navy has moved a small number of highspeed, missile-firing boats to a base near South Vietnam, U.S. intelligence sources report. The sources said the presence of even a small number of the Komar class boats represents a potential threat to U.S. naval vessels operating in the area off South Vietnam. There are more than 25 U.S. Navy ships and some 4,000 Marines within a few days' sailing time from South Vietnam and Cambodia.

Two Daughters Still Missing

KENSINGTON, Md. (AP) - Fifteen days after their 13and 11-year-old daughters went out for some pizzas and did not return, John and Mary Lyon still await the call that could end their ordeal in either grief or joy. The case of the missing Sheila and Kate Lyon has attracted massive publicity in the nation's capital. It also has baffled the best minds of the area's law enforcement agencies, including the FBI. Police are virtually convinced the two blonde youngsters are not runaways.

Altamonte May **Revoke License**

ALTAMONTE SPRINGS - City Clerk Phyllis Jordahl was notifying the Florida Police Benevolent Association (FPBA) today the city commission has set a hearing for 4:30 p.m. next Tuesday to consider revoking its occupational license for misrepresentation in telephone solicitations.

The hearing was set last night at the request of Police Capt. David Gunter. Gunter and Sanford Police Benevolent president, Mike Tindell, presented 73 written complaints about the telephone solicitations from Sanford area residents. Complainants said the telephone solicitors from the FPBA office at 222 Sanford Ave. Altamonte, are saying the calls are made under the auspices of the Sanford Police Department.

Gunter said the solicitors are indicating those who refuse to

ionate may have problems driving in the Sanford area. The police captain reminded he closed down the operation some weeks ago because the FPBA did not have a city occupational

license. He said the city received complaints from city residents the solicitors were using pressure tactics to get donations. Before the occupational license was issued, the Police Department was assured by state officers that no further calls

would be made to the Altamonte Springs area, he said.

Gunter estimated the telephone solicitation from the FPBA in the area is an \$80,000 annual business. Tindell said the Sanford association is not connected in any way with the state group and receives no assistance from that organization. He said the local association sponsors fund-raising events periodically to raise money for various charitable causes.

Gunter said he is researching state law to determine if the police department can, during the intervening seven days, order the FPBA to cease operation until the hearing is held. Once the license is revoked, City Attorney Joe Davis said, ontinued operation could bring criminal penalties.







Controls Stifle **Hungry Nations**

President Ford promised the United Nations last September that the United States of America would cooperate in a "global policy" to meet the

At that time there were estimates that up to 500,000 persons faced severe hunger around the world, and that about 100,000 of them would starve before June, 1975. There was major concern about the exploding populations of underdeveloped nations. India, for example, anticipated that its population of 600 million persons would double in 25

Officials at the November World Food Conference set the shortfall in grain at 7.5 million tons a year in the 32 nations suffering the most from

It is a grave problem and the United States is doing more than its share to help, as President Ford promised. However, a recent U.S. Department of Agriculture study makes it plain that financial and commodity assistance is only a part of the problem. The sad fact is that some poor nations don't grow enough food to feed their citizens because their own governments have adopted restrictive agricultural policies that hold back farm production.

The list of restrictive policies in backward wants to be paid \$1 for every time his name nations sounds like a roll call of depression-era farm programs in the United States. These disincentives include price controls on farm products, non-competitive buying of commodities by the government, export controls, export taxes, sale of imports of subsidized prices, regulation of money exchange rates, limitations on credits, restrictive land laws, limitation on farm size and restrictions on transportation of agricultural products. To cite an international example, the Department of Agriculture report says production of palm oil in Zaire has been declining since government controls were put on producer prices in 1968.

President Ford insists that the United States should help developing nations to help themselves A self-help policy is indeed the only practical solution to world food shortages.

As food-deficient nations receive outside help they should also study their own problems more closely. It is possible that have not nations can move another step toward closing the food need gap on their own.

A year and a half ago, when the Arab oil embargo disrupted our oil supply, the United States of America imported 17 per cent of its oil. The total now has reached 40 per cent and is growing. An increasing amount of the oil comes from the politically unstable Middle East.

President Ford said recently that "if we do nothing, in two or three years we may have doubled our vulnerability to a future oil embargo." William Simon, secretary of the Treasury, , adds that unless something is done our dependence on the Organization of Petroleum Exporting Countries could reach 50 per cent of our oil use in four years.

WASHINGTON - (NEA) - The present debacle in South Vietnam is, in considerable measure, a story of the indecisiveness and self President Thieu cannot make up his mind. He

says yes one day, no the next and then maybe. Or goes back to his original stand, then comes back a few days later and cancels everything out. This has always been so, at least since Americans became involved as Vietnamese advisers, thus privy to "insider" meetings and decisions. Friends close to Thieu as a general years ago, and others who have known him in-

timately as president, tell the same story. When the pace is slow, Thieu's zigs and usually cause no traumatic tragedies. Compromises are worked out, decisions eventually made and something gets done.

But these, obviously, are not ordinary times. Saigon will collapse unless Thieu gets hold of himself - or some strong-willed leader takes

Thieu made his withdrawal decisions privately, canceled them once, then resumed them. Commanders in the field and junior officers in scattered units did not know what to do. Neither, of course, did the sergeants or privates. So they panicked. It was every man for himself. The South Vietnamese army is not strong on

indoctrination. It depends rather on leadership When officers are uncertain or doubtful about what to do, the troops go to pieces. When generals are indecisive, many officers flunk out. N.V!etnamese Troops 40 Miles From Saigon

SAIGON, South Vietnam (AP) — North Vietnamese troops fought their way into the heart of a provincial capital 40 miles east of Saigon today in the five-week-old Communist offensive's first attack on a major city in the capital region, the South Vietnamese command reported. The attack on Xuan Loc, the capital of Long Khanh province, began before dawn after a 2,000-round artillery barrage. Street fighting was reported around a church

and the bus station, but later field reports said most of the

North Vietnamese had been driven from the city, leaving

small pockets of resistance. The battle promised to be the first test of whether the demoralized South Vietnamese army could make an effective stand after its devastating retreat from the northern and central provinces. However, it was too early to tell whether the attack on Xuan Loc was the start of an offensive against Saigon itself.

'We've Been Seduced

PHNOM PENH, Cambodia (AP) - "The Americans appear to be great humanitarians. They give temporary aid, but ultimately they think only of themselves," the former government minister said. "We in Cambodia have been seduced and abandoned."

Resentment against the United States is mounting among Phnom Penh's political elite. It is being stoked by a growing feeling that the U.S. Congress will turn down further military aid to Cambodia and that its delay on the vote is a parting act of cruelty.

The domino theory is not a debating point here in higher political circles. It is accepted as an undeniable law. Government leaders insist that if the United States deserts Cambodia, all of Southeast Asia will go Communist. They argue U.S. honor will be spoiled and Asian allies may well side with the Communist regime in China rather than believe the bankrupt word of the Americans.

Crowds Line Funeral Route

TAIPEI (AP) - Crowds ten deep lined the 15-mile route as the body of President Chiang Kai-Shek was carried to the Sun Yat-sen Memorial at noon today and placed in state there. Thousands burned incense sticks and candles on improvised Buddhist altars for the 87-year-old Generalissimo, a Christian convert. Preceded by a military band and honor guard, the glistening black coffin rode on a military truck from the Veterans Hospital, where Chiang died Saturday night.

Loaner' Receives Probation

A 24-year-old former Altamonte Springs resident, arrested last August on loansharking charges, was put on two years probation yesterday in the states of Ohio and Michigan by Circuit Court Judge A. J. Hosemann Jr. at Sanford.

Carl D. Cammerucci, 24, resided at Altamonte Springs when arrested by Sheriff's agents. He entered a plea of no contest Dec. 16 to three counts of the lesser and included offenses of attempted loansharking. Maximum sentence on the third-degree misdemeanor pleas could have been three years in jail.

Cammerucci said he is now working in Cincinnati, Ohio, and is required to travel to Michigan each week. The court withheld adjudication of guilt on the pleas and placed him on probation in the two northern states under a reciprocal probation supervision compact. "It is the conclusion of the court," Hosemann said, "that you just exercised judgment."

When Cammerucci was arrested, detectives said the arrest resulted from a two-andone-half month investigation after a complaint by a Seminole-Orange County businessman. Agents would not comment on the size of the alleged loansharking business, or any possible link to organized crime.

Detectives explained that loan sharks operate on the principal of large, short-term cans paid back at an exorbitant interest rate.

In a separate case Hosemann sentenced 18-yearyears in prison for violation of probation in a burglary case.

"But the world doesn't need reduced cattle production, Far from it. What the world needs is more food - beef and other animal protein, grain, fruits lives at stake decisions must be made on facts, not on slogans."


