



Nixon's Order: No Deals

BALTIMORE, Md. (AP) - Before he resigned as president last week, Richard M. Nixon ordered his aides not to seek any deals preventing his future prosecution, the Baltimore Sun says. Quoting what it call a streetletive sources, the Sun-

said in a story in today's editions that Nixon ordered his key aides, even before his final decision to resign, to make no approaches to Congress for lenient treatment. The Sun also said it was told that the subject of immunity for Nixon was not discussed when White House Chief of Staff Alexander M. Haig Jr. visited special prosecutor Leon Jaworski shortly after then Vice President Ford was informed of Nixon's decision. Haig has refused to discuss his conversation with Jaworski. Jaworski has said no deal was made or requested regarding immunity to prosecution.

Volunteer Army 'Success'

WASHINGTON (AP) - Secretary of the Army Howard H. Callaway apparently was premature in proclaiming the allvolunteer Army a success. Now he says the coming year will tell. "The fiscal year we are now entering will provide us a most severe test," Callaway told a Senate Armed Services Subcommittee. On July 1 he said "the volunteer Army proved that it was a success" by ending the 1974 fiscal year slightly over its manpower goal.

Evers Indicted On Taxes

FAYETTE, Miss. (AP) - Mayor Charles Evers, who often had government support in his battles for civil rights for blacks, is now preparing to defend himself on federal income tax charges. "I will repeat that I haven't done anything wrong," Evers said Tuesday after he and his former wife, Nannie Laura Evers of Jackson, Miss., were indicted on charges of tax evasion. The federal indictment alleges that for the years 1968, 1969 and 1970, Evers paid \$3,614 in taxes when he should have paid \$56,237. The indictments said his three-year income was \$179,556, instead of the \$20,219 reported.

'Little Brother' Gets Help

MILL VALLEY, Calif. (AP) - A band of pint-sized foresters is struggling to save the life of Little Brother, a mammoth, 200-year-old redwood tree in Northern California's Muir Woods. Last winter, flood waters from a nearby creek undermined the shallow roots of the 100-foot tree and it appeared in danger of toppling. The 125 children, ranging in age from 5 to 15, discovered the threat to the big redwood, which measures 20 feet in circumference, while on an outing from Mill Valleys Hillwood Academic Day School early last month. Since then they have been working in shifts of about 15 two and three days a week to save the forest giant.

Mandel Marries Girlfriend

ANNAPOLIS, Md. (AP) - Gov. Marvin Mandel has married Jeanne Blackistone Dorsey, a half hour after his first marriage was formally dissolved by a judge. The unannounced but not unexpected marriage war performed in a 15-minute ceremony on Tuesday at Har Sinai Congregation in Baltimore by Rabbi Abraham Shusterman, a friend of Mandel and the man who supervised the 37-year-old bride's conversion to Judaism. Mandel, 54, left his first wife, Barbara "Bootsie" Mandel, on July 3, 1973, saying he was divorcing her after 32 years of marriage to wed his long-time girlfriend. The former Mrs. Mandel resisted the governor's marriage plans and refused to move out of the executive mansion for several months after Mandel's an-



Alaska's No Place To Go Job-Hunting

Government press releases are usually read only for comic relief. They are obviously selfserving and are useful only to the extent that they keep thousands of other writers off the unemployment rolls.

Still, as they say, even a blind pig finds an acorn every now and then, and so it is with government flacks

Just the other day, for instance, we received a communication from the U.S. Department of Labor which, in view of the rising unemployment rate, particularly in the construction field, might, if read and heeded, save a lot of people a lot of grief.

We recommend it highly to anyone planning to travel to Alaska in search of employment:

"A good many workers are being lured to Alaska by stories of high paying jobs on the oil pipeline, only to find no work and great hardship when they get there.

"Today, about one out of every eight Alaskans unemployed and these residents have been promised and are getting first crack at jobs on the pipeline. We are informed that there are enough unemployed Alaskans to do most all the work needed on the project. "Anyone having special skills who think they

might be needed on the pipeline, should check with the nearest office of the public employment service, which will have information on any job openings in Alaska.

"No one seeking work should go to Alaska without a job commitment in writing from an employer before leaving home.

"Alaska is a grand and beautiful state, but is is no place to be a stranger and stranded without a job. In the state as a whole, the cost of living is about 35 per cent higher than in the rest of the country. A hamburger, for instance, costs two dollars or more and a milkshake about \$1.60. Costs are even higher in Fairbanks, where, for example, it costs about \$150 a month more for a one-bedroom apartment, if you can find one, than for a twobedroom apartment in Anchorage, if you can find one, there. The one-bedroom apartment in Fairbanks, if available, rents for about \$375 a month. In addition, it gets extrememly cold. In the winter months, upcoming, the temperature will normally drop to 60 degrees below zero along the pipeline."
