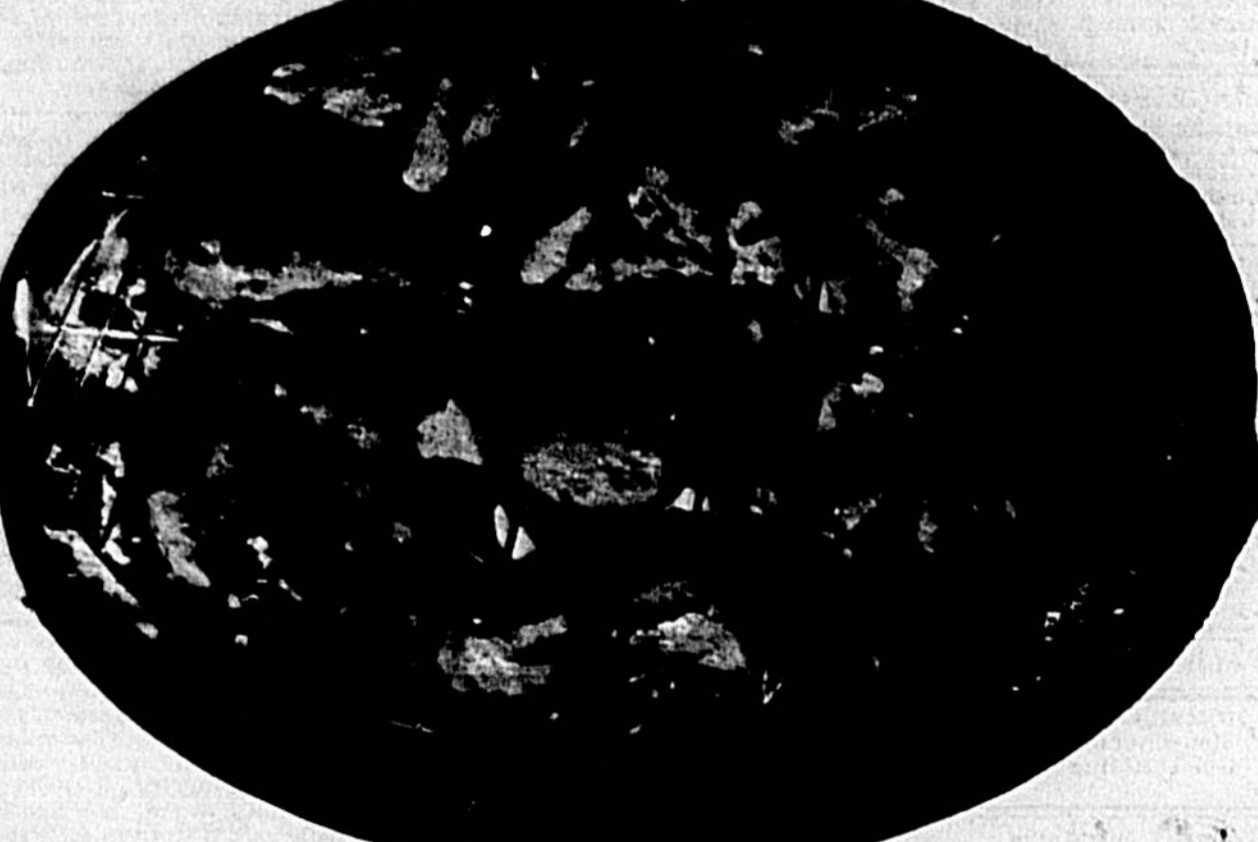

**Booming Economy In Seminole Co. Revealed In Sales**

**AROUND THE CLOCK**  
Further evidence of Seminole County's booming economy was revealed today with release of the gross sales totals for the months of May and June, which showed Seminole County has exceeded the top 20 counties in the state of Florida in the rate of increase in retail sales during the two months period of the report for May and June.

But the weather bureau again forecast a build-up as the storm moved north of Puerto Rico. A hurricane hunter aircraft located the storm center at 1 a.m. (EST) 350 miles east-northeast of San Juan, Puerto Rico. It was moving toward the west-northeast at 12 miles an hour. Peak winds were in squalls near the center. Gale winds covered a 300-mile wide area.

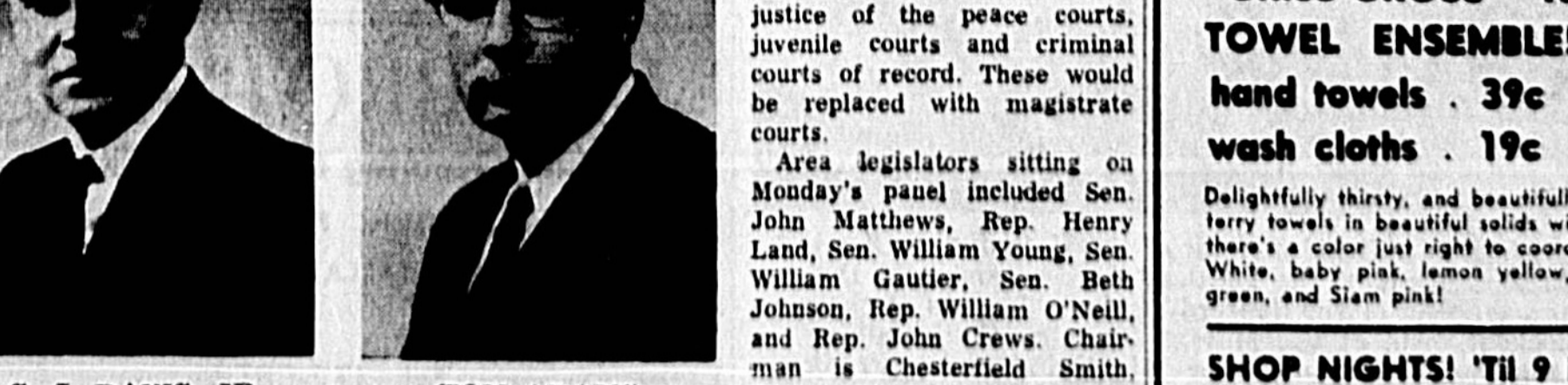

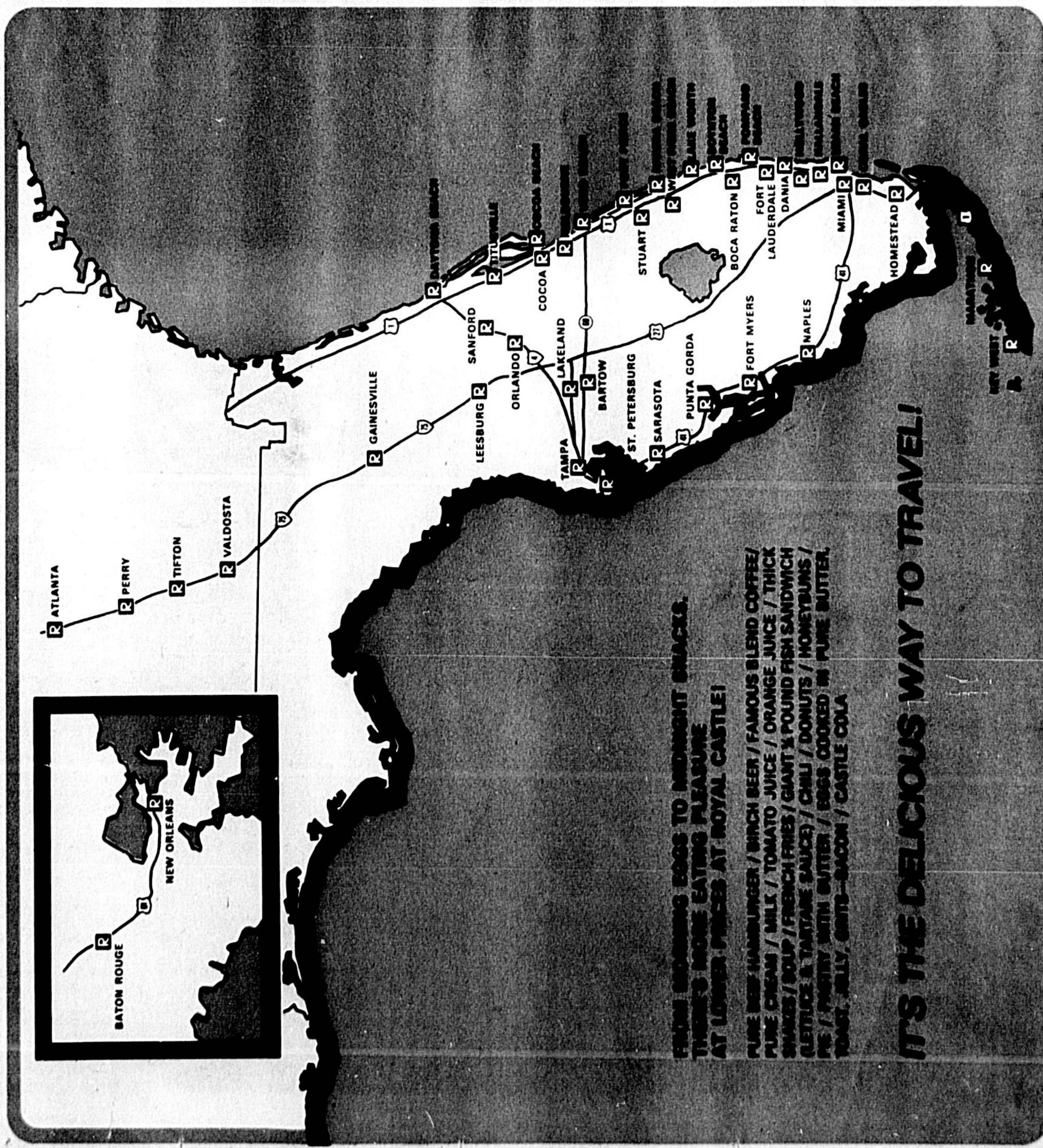

## Increase Million Budget Eyed '66-67

Public Instruction of Seminole County approved Tuesday to a \$9,157,688 school year 1966-67. This includes the budget for Junior College which totals \$440,850. Increase in schools in the one through 12 grades is approximately \$2 million, or \$1 million for increases in teachers and personnel. Total net is \$5,162,400. Increase granted Seminole County is par with those of counties with a population of 55,000. (All in this area pay \$100,000.)

**Warning Issued To Parents**

Parents of nearly 1,000 Seminole County school children were warned today that unless they fill out and hand in their "freedom of choice" forms, issued in April, the students will not be able to enter school here Aug. 25.

Thomas Richey, supervisor in charge of pupil personnel services, said that under federal law every student must indicate his choice of schools in writing, even if it is the same school he attended last year.

Expected enrollment this year is 15,647 students. More than 15,000 have filled out the forms, which have been filed and assignments made. The U.S. Office of Health, Education and Welfare has been notified of compliance with federal law under the Civil Rights Act, Richey said.

"Under this act, every student must, by law, be accorded his free choice of which school he wishes to attend. It is mandatory that this choice be made and students whose names are not on the roll will not be admitted until the form is completed," he pointed out.

Persons new to the county can pick up the forms at any school office or at the school administration office on Commercial Street. Others, who have not signed the forms, or have lost their copy, may also pick up new forms.

Administration officials said that Seminole County schools have been accepted by the U.S. Office of Health, Education and Welfare as being in satisfactory compliance with 1966 school desegregation guidelines, which include the desegregation of schools, facilities and increased desegregation in pupil enrollment.

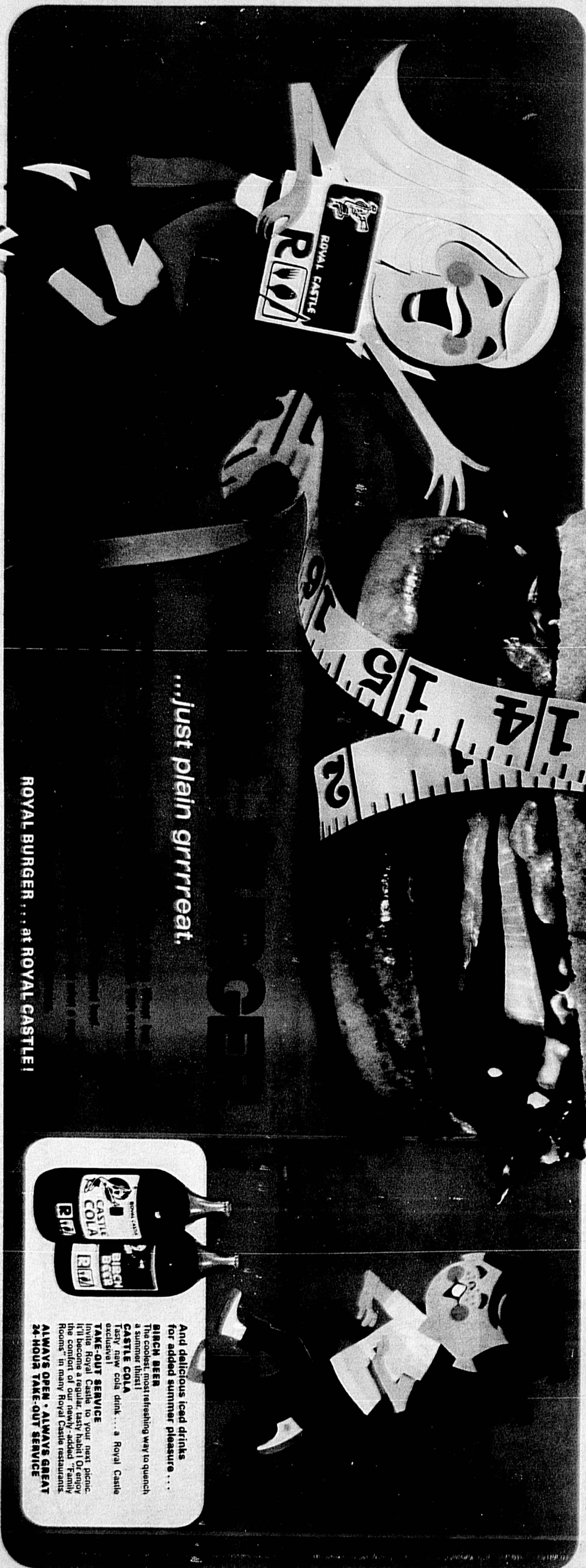
