

It was, therefore, with a sense of comfort that the words and meaning of the letter written by the somewhat overshadowed Secretary of the Interior Walter J. Hickel to Mr. Nixon on the subject of alienation of the nation's youth was received.

It is fashionable in some quarters to carry an uncritical torch for the young. Those so minded seem to feel that the mere circumstance of being under 25 gives one a tail-hold on the

We are not among these torch bearers; we feel that when the young spout foolish thoughts they deserve their comeuppance, just like the rest of us. This does not mean, contrariwise, that in our judgment people of middle age and beyond are always right. In fact, on balance the elders, if only because the latter tend to be so inflexible in their outlook.

We are moved to quote from a letter printed by a Southwestern newspaper. The writer, who acknowledged being "what is vulgarly called a question of giving 18-year-olds the vote: "I am beginning to think the country might benefit if all of us at ages 45, 50, 55 and 60 should have to give evidence of having acquired at least one new or discarded at least one old idea in the privilege of voting."


Lyman Flash Ferguson
