ing death of a Midway area resident in a Sunday morning incident. Stephen E. Boston, 31, 1720 Strickland Avenue, was charged by Seminole County investigator L. J. Kriz with murder after Tyrone Henderson, 23, was killed in a 4 a.m. affray that occurred on U.S. 17-92, south of Sund a land Estates.

Kriz reported Henderson was dead on arrival at Seminole Memorial Hospital at 4:30 a.m. from a gunshot wound.

He stated Boston was arrested shortly afterwards by Deputy O'Dell Hunt and placed

The incident occurred, Kriz said, after Henderson, accompanied by Boston's wife and four other persons, including a sister-in-law, were riding in Boston's car to Eatonville to a night club. When they returned, they met Boston in another

car just south of Sanford and turned around. Boston also saw his car and he stopped on the highway to allow Henderson, the driver, to return. According to Kriz, Boston is alleged to have shot Henderson after the man alighted from the car.



How long has it been since you gave the fate of these prisoners any thought at all? How long will the

people of America take to rise up in a chorus of moral might which will be heard and heeded in We believe that it should be done and done at

once. Bringing the fighting men back from Vietnam is, of course, a matter now which has been embraced

How long will the people of the United States by the Nixon administration and used as a major positive "end-the-war" step to be applauded.

This we applaud! But we are persuaded that the advice which seems to come out of the highest circles who are knowledgeable about the entire Vietchallenge, to be patient and go slow on the POW situation is one which the American people can

Hanoi, it can be logically and factually concluded, is well aware of what the public sentiment is concerning any issue which involves them.

If it is admitted that internal dissension over the Indo-China war is something which Hanoi growts with ill-concealed delight as their sources of information in the United States relay such news, the contrary must be equally valid. Let the people of the United States arise and

flood Hanoi with letters in which their continued silence about our men now captive is made an issue about which there is no division at all in any quarter.

The statistics alone are shocking. The "Democratic Republic of Vietnam" - North Vietnam admits holding only 450 American servicemen as prisoners. But there are 1,140 men listed by the Defense Department as MIA (Missing in action.) Who are they? Where are they? How are they?

The most impressive and authoritative agencies have asked these questions. Major moves have been made to force Hanoi into providing answers. Yet a stubborn silence continues. Every avenue mass communications has been used to bring this ugly situation to the attention of the public.

The full force of TV programs have shown the

silence. Newspapers, such as this, have printed in terviews with families of the POWs. What Hanoi has allowed to reach mass media is just enough to arouse the doubts and fears concerning those POWs who were not allowed to appear. We are well aware of the demands being made

on our readers for action along political lines as this election year moves towards the climactic November But this matter of the POWs is not political. It is deeply moral. It is deeply personal. It is a matter

of good faith on our part. It is a matter of exerting moral might effectively. Reach for your pen. Write a letter to: "Office of the President, Democratic Republic of Vietnam, Hanoi, Vietnam, via Hong Kong." Express your deepest feelings. Mail it! And let your prayers support suffering of the loved ones who wait in a fog of it in this vital mission!

#### Curb On Gifts

A recent caution issued by the Internal Revenue Service is a depressing backlash of strife on the nation's university campuses. The IRS has distributed a set of cautionary guidelines that include warnings to individual contributors to colleges and universities.

A gift may be denied federal or state tax deductibility if the IRS rules are not heeded Their trust is to punish a donor if the college to which he contributes carries on propaganda intended to influence national legislation, In addition, a tax-exempt institution is prohibited from participating in any "political campaign on behalf of any candidate for public office."

This evident threat to freedom of exprescannot be allowed to stand without challenge. under these rules a donor would have to anticipate a college's official behavior before making a gift, or alternatively circumscribe his gift with conditions that no institution could predict, demand or control. This is a matter that should be threshed out legally as soon as possible. - West Point (Miss.) Daily Times Lead-


