Atomic Ack-Ack Appears To Join

The atomic era moved another military step forward yesterday as history's alghant recorded blast flamed in the sky six miles above the Nevada desert. The burst came from a device dropped from an Air Force B36 bomber, flying at 40,000 feet ar higher. The detonation occurred above 20,000 feet—six times as high as any previous nuclear blast. Small as it was in the range of A-waspons, this prototype of a nu-clear air-to-air missile probably packed anough punch to wipe out an entire formation of enemy plames. 
The Eisenhower Administration appears to be doing an adequate job of keeping this country militarily strong. But, according to a group of 20 freshmen Congressmen, it is not doing enough to capture the admiration and win the support of the so-called backward nations throughout the world.

These 20 Congressmen point to the electrifying effect made by President Truman when he proposed the Marshall Plan, which, however costly it may have been, did stop the onslaught of Communism in Europe. They say that President Eisenhower and Secretary of State Dulles have the imagination and command the support of enough of Congress to institute a similar plan for Asia and the Middle East.

The United States has been so busy drawing defense lines and trying to make up its mind whether to go to war over Quemoy and Matsu that it has neglected the psychological and economic aspects of the "cold war." The vast aid-for-Asia program envisioned by Harold E. Stassen some months ago has been all but forgotten.

The fact is that this country has the resources to institute a broad aid program for the underdeveloped countries. The reception given President Eisenhower's stom-for-peace proposal indicates the response that awaits a realistic program of economic and technological aid. Certainly there is no better way of building a long-rang defense program. If It is a matter of alternatives, such a program of technological and economic aid would not be nearly so costly to this country as a WAL.
