





Court Asked To Outlaw **Private School Segregation**

WASHINGTON (AP) - The Justice Department is urging the Supreme Court to outlaw segregated private schools that for years have allowed white parents to avoid sending their children into integrated public classrooms. Segregation in private schools violates an 1866 civil rights law, and allowing it to continue could bring about "two school systems - one private and white, the other public and desegregated," the department contends.

Solicitor Gen. Robert H. Bork and department civil rights attorneys outlined that position in a brief submitted

to the Supreme Court on Thursday. The justices have agreed to review the issue in a case involving two black youngsters who were denied admission to two all-white private schools in the Virginia suburbs of Washington, D.C.

Spending Debate Slated

WASHINGTON (AP) - The Senate begins debate on Democrat-backed bill that gives President Ford virtually everything he asked for defense but rejects his plea for cutbacks in domestic programs. The bill, calling for a spending target of \$412.6 billion,

recommends rejection of Ford's planned increase in Social Security taxes, but envisons a somewhat smaller reduction in income taxes than the President

The Democrats, who control Congress, say their proposed budget would promote economic recovery more rapidly than would Ford's package, and that it would not

Ford To Visit Texas

WASHINGTON (AP) - President Ford is making his first campaign-season journey to Texas, apparently hopeful of unveiling before the state's May 1 primary the endorsement of former Texas Gov. John B. Connally. Ford was flying today to San Antonio and Dallas on the first leg of a two-day, four-city tour that will be followed two weeks hence by another trip during which Connally may surface as a traveling companion and tubthumper



MIAs Are Not Negotiable

The possibility has emerged that Secretary of State Henry Kissinger will be going back to Paris for talks with representatives of North Vietnam -shades of the Paris meetings that produced a Vietnamese truce agreement in 1973.

Our State Department is looking toward a "normalization" of relations with Hanoi, and Mr. Kissinger is expected to press for an accounting of Americans still listed as missing in action in the Indochina war. The North Vietnamese have given only token compliance to their 1973 agreement to help establish the fate of the missing.

Officials in Hanoi, meanwhile, have been reminding American visitors that under the same 1973 agreement the United States had promised to provide reconstruction aid to both Vietnams. They even claim that former Precident Richard Nixen had pledged a specific amount - \$3.25 billion.

The implication from Hanoi is that Americans want to talk about MIAs, the North Vietnamese want to talk about aid, trade and other benefits that night go along with "normalization." However, while there was some linkage between these two subjects in 1973, it does not exist today.

The 1973 truce agreements went out the window when the North Vietnamese blatantly ignored them to build up a massive military force in South Vietnam, finally overrunning the country after the withdrawal of U. S. troops and curtailment of our military aid to Saigon. The provisions for democratic procedures to establish the political future of South Vietnam were ignored.

It takes unabashed nerve for the Hanoi government to be appealing now to Article 21 of the 1973 agreements, which provided that the United States would "contribute to healing the wounds of war and to postwar reconstruction of the Democratic Republican of Vietnam, and throughout Indochina.'

If there are to be new talks in Paris, they should start with a clean slate. The obligation of North Vietnam to close the records on missing soldiers does not arise from the 1973 agreements. It is an obligation of any decent government to do as much after a cessation of hostilities.

North Vietnam used American prisoners as pawns to negotiate the 1973 agreements. This time around, our government should make clear that the MIA's are an issue to be settled before there is any discussion of a new relationship between the United States and North Vietnam. It should not be part of any trade-off.


The question of future U.S. relations with Hanoi and the other new Communist governments in Southeast Asia must be faced sooner or later not because of what Hanoi wants from us, but because that part of the world cannot be ignored in our foreign policy. The time to face it is after the most important unfinished business of the Vietnam war - the fate of 800 Americans still listed as missing -- is formally dealt with by the government in Hanoi.

Chautauqua Made Impact

By David Poling

Any consideration of the impact of religion upon American life must include the genius of the Chautaugua movement, initiated by two Methodist churchmen - the Rev. John Heyl Vincent and Lewis Miller. Dr. Vincent carried a special interest in Sunday School training and materials. Miller had developed and built a church school hall in Akron, Ohio, widely copied and acclaimed in the 1860s. The merger of interests and personalities led to the creation of Fair Point on Chautauqua Lake, New York, with a two week conference in 1874, for the training and inspiration of Sunday School leaders. The growth and extension of

the Chautauqua movement meant nothing less than a lifechanging experience for millions of people. 


