Six arrested after deputy attacked

SANFORD — Six people who were attending a company party near Sanford were arrested Sunday morning after becoming involved in a fight and resisting attempts by a Seminole County deputy sheriff to stop the fight.

Deputy Matt Hardesty was on patrol near the Day's Inn parking lot at 4650 State Road 46 when he saw two people arguing. One had another in a head-

lock. When Hardesty attempted to break up the fight, others attending the holiday party attacked Hardesty, according to Steve Olson, a spokesman for the Seminole County Sheriff's Office. "When backup arrived, deputies saw

one man on top of Hardesty and several people around him," Olson said.

Six people were arrested, including 29-year-old Jimmy Edward Chaudoin, who is listed as the owner of Jim's Logging in Geneva. The charges include battery on a law enforcement

officer and resisting an officer with violence.

Four employees of Jim's Logging who were also arrested include Kristopher Clay Jenkins, 23, Deneed Ann Clark, 35, Anjanette Audry Libby, 24, and Fred Nightingale, 33.

Geneva resident Sandra Lynn Jones, 33, was also arrested during the incident.

Hardesty sustained scrapes, scratches and bruises. His uniform was also torn, according to the incident report.

Schools receive \$500,000 grant

SANFORD — The Seminole County school-district has been awarded a \$500,000 grant to support a learning center based at Hamilton Elementary School in Sanford.

The \$552,950 grant will support a new Hamilton Technology Learning Center, which will open June 1, 2000. Students from Pine Crest and Midway elementary schools in Sanford will also be eligible to participate in the program.

Seminole County's grant

award is among \$67 million in grants announced Monday by Vice President Al Gore to 125 communities across the nation. Through the grants, community learning centers will be established in 517 schools.

The 21st Century Learning Centers program allows schools to stay open to provide after-school, weekend and summer activities.

"There is nothing so important than ensuring our children are safe and receive a high-quality education," Gore said. "These funds will help keep

Sanford man arrested after fleeing from police

SANFORD — A Sanford resident is charged with possession of marijuana with intent to distribute after fleeing from police during a routine traffic stop.

Sanford resident Felipe Moran, 19, was arrested on Monday after trying to allude a police officer in a traffic stop. Moran cut through a corner on his motorcycle shortly after 12 p.m. to avoid running a red light at Celery Avenue and Mellonville Avenue in Sanford.

Moran fled from Sanford police, who caught up with him at Summerlin Avenue,

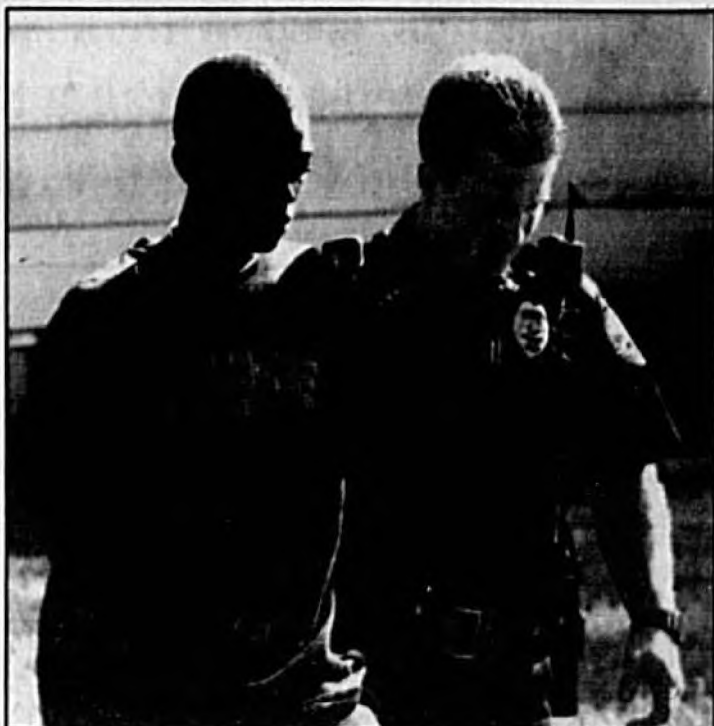
near First Drive. He was stopped at Rosenberry Lane.

"He tried to cut through an area where a barbed wire fence had been put up," said Cleo Cohen, spokesperson for the Sanford Police Department. "When he ran into the fence, that stopped him."

Moran proceeded to fight with Sanford police officer David Morgenstern on foot, and Morgenstern was able to make the arrest.

Police confiscated \$443 in cash that Moran was carrying at the time of the arrest.

Moran faces charges of battery on a law enforcement officer, resisting arrest with violence, and possession of marijuana with intent to distribute.

Armed robber holds up Sanford pawn shop

SANFORD — Police are searching for a man who stole an estimated \$10,000 in cash, three handguns and jewelry from the Cash America Pawn Shop in Sanford on Friday.

The suspect robbed the store, located at 2397 S. French Ave., shortly after 7 p.m. on Friday while brandishing what appeared to be a semi-automatic nine millimeter handgun, according to Sanford police.

An estimated \$10,114 in cash was stolen, as well as three handguns valued at \$440. An estimate on the value of the jewelry stolen is not available,

police said.

One employee was held by the suspect while he committed the robbery, and the remaining employees were ordered into the safe area. One customer was also ordered into the safe, according to the police report.

The suspect ordered the employee who was being held to fill a white pillow case with cash from the safe, as well as with jewelry from the store. The suspect removed three handguns from a shelf as he was leaving the store, police said.

He fled the store, heading north, the police report said.

The suspect was described as 5'7" to 5'10", 110 pounds, wearing a black ski mask, green

army jacket and black pants, the police report said.

Police believe the suspect was driving a white Ford LTD or Mercury Marquis.

A witness told police he observed the car parked on the north side of Headliner Hair Styling located at 2303 S. French Ave. The witness then watched the vehicle leaving the area with the lights out, heading east on Katherine Court, the police report said.

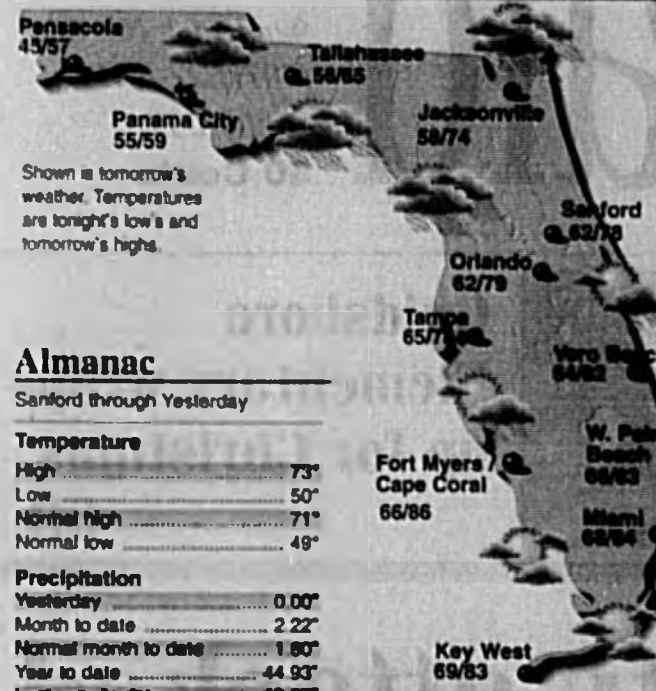
"We believe that probably was the suspect's car," said Cleo Cohen, a spokeswoman for the Sanford Police Department.

The suspect is facing charges of armed robbery and grand theft.

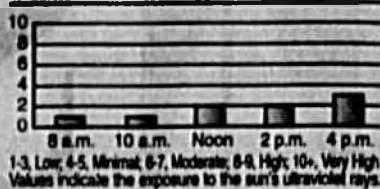

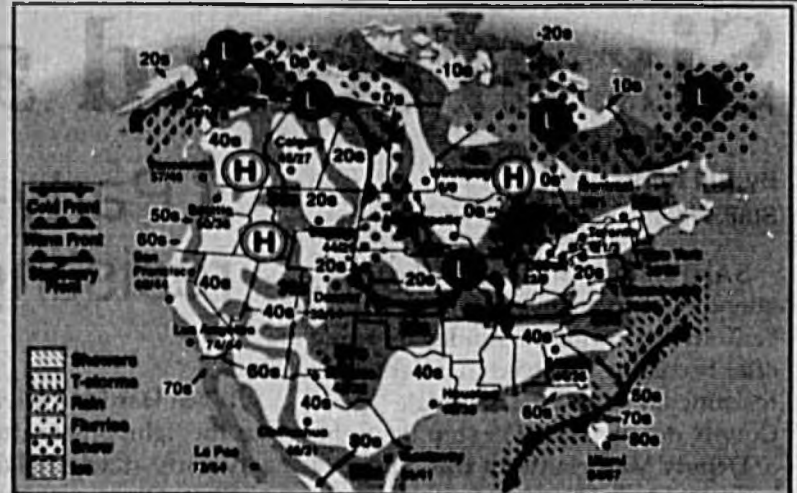

Dave the Barber had triple-bypass surgery in November.

His photo gallery of movie cowboys kept watch on the shop for two months as Donna and Cheri cut hair and told everyone Dave Dreifuferst would soon be there.

True enough, Dave is cutting hair again at his Palmetto Avenue shop in Sanford.

Just like the cowboys who maintained a law and order, Dave faithfully tends to his special brand of barbering. In the last 33 years, he has put his comb and scissors to just about everyone who has a hair on his or her head. Ride on in, buckaroos.

Blue-eyed boys have received their first cuts from Dave and so have their blue-eyed children. Old-timers have been coming

back for three decades. Dave's barber shop is home to most of us. Dave isn't just our barber, he's our brother. And we love him.

Good conversation at the barber shop is as American as the singing cowboy, and good conversation is part of the \$6 customers pay for a haircut at Dave's barber shop. You want stony silence (and no cowboys), go to the mall and pay \$20.

Dave took over ownership of the shop six years ago when A.L. Thomas retired.

After 27 years as a sidekick, Dave was Sanford's head cowboy.

Shirley Long said she knew a good guy when she met Dave 36 years ago. He was in the Navy, a storekeeper stationed in Sanford. They married and raised four boys. One of the boys is deaf, another requires special care. Dave and Shirley have both close to them at their

Geneva home. Neighbors say they've seen Dave on his bicycle the past week, "It's true, I'm testing how strong my heart is," Dave said. "I'm not going to overdo it. I'm grateful to be feeling this good. I may even try some baseball next month. I want to go back to left-field."

At 59, Dave fancies himself as a better-than-average athlete. He won a bronze ribbon in the 100 yard dash at last year's Golden Age Games. He competes in basketball, also. Because of his faulty ticker, Dave didn't compete in this year's games. But he'll be back.

Shirley Dreifuferst said she expected Dave to return from the barber shop just after noon on Monday. When he wasn't back after 1 p.m., she called. He was fine, finishing a haircut, swapping stories about Lash LaRue, the Lone Ranger and the Durango Kid.

Raines expects to be back with Yankees by next season

SANFORD — Despite his battle with lupus, Sanford native Tim Raines expects to play again for the New York Yankees next season.

Raines, 40, said that his agent is negotiating with the Yankees for at least a one-year contract. He contributed to winning two world championships while playing with the Yankees from 1996 through 1998.

"I feel like I've got a couple more years left," Raines said. "If I'm going to do it, I'd rather do it in a Yankee uniform. We're working on at least a one-year deal, and hopefully a two-year deal, and we'll take it from there."

While the Yankees won their third World Series in four years in 1999, Raines signed a one-year contract with the Oakland A's. He was placed on the disabled list during the second half of the season by the A's after being diagnosed with lupus.

This off season, doctors have told Raines the disease is in remis-

sion. Lupus is a disease of the skin characterized by remissions and exacerbations of a scaling, red, muscular rash. The lesions contain plugged follicles that can cause atrophy. The disease is limited to the skin in 90 percent of patients, but may eventually spread to the immune system.

"I'm feeling fine," Raines said. "It's in total remission. I'm starting to work out, and the doctor gave me clearance to play. I feel like nothing happened right now."

A 20-year Major League veteran, Raines was born in Sanford and currently resides in Heathrow with his wife and children. He graduated from Seminole High School.

A left fielder, his career statistics include 807 stolen bases, 2,561 hits, 1,542 runs scored, and a lifetime .295 batting average. Raines is one of only four players with 2,000 career hits, 500 stolen bases, 100 home runs, 1,000 runs scored, and 100 triples. Lou Brock, Ty Cobb and Honus Wagner, the only other three players to achieve the feat, are in the baseball Hall of Fame.

Raines had his most productive years with the Montreal Expos from 1981 through 1990, when he was a seven time All-Star selection, led the National League in stolen bases four times, and won a batting title.

"I feel 100 percent," Raines said. "I feel like I can do everything I did before. Everything is fine."

His son Tim Raines, Jr., is in the minor league system of the Baltimore Orioles. Raines, Jr., who also graduated from Seminole High School, is expected to advance to the AA level with the Orioles this upcoming season.

Raines hopes that he can play long enough to be in the Major Leagues at the same time as his son.

"It's not so much to play with him as it is to be in the big leagues together," Raines said. "If we do play together, that would be great."

Raines was the grand marshal in the city's Christmas Parade on Dec. 11. It was the first Christmas Parade in Sanford that Raines has participated in since 1996, after

Raines helped the Yankees win the World Series.

"It's one of the biggest crowds I've seen for this in a long time," Raines said. "I've done so many that I can't remember. It seems like there are a lot more floats here than before."

He has been an active supporter of youth programs in the Sanford community throughout his career, particularly D.A.R.E. programs for elementary school children and

athletics at Seminole High School.

The recent parade along First Street in downtown Sanford began at 11 a.m. and lasted until 12 p.m. Participants started at San Juan Avenue and proceed to Myrtle Avenue.

Raines was among 50 participants riding floats in the parade. Santa Claus and several Disney characters also participated. Sanford Main Street was the parade's sponsor.

UCF criminal justice project targets sexual offenders

A project at the University of Central Florida's Criminal Justice Department will put sexual offenders' information and known whereabouts in map form for law enforcement agencies by next summer. Public access to the information will likely soon follow.

The Florida Department of Law Enforcement (FDLE) has a \$67,000 contract with the university to put every registered offender in the state on a map, along with the locations of schools and day care centers. The map will first be put on the CINET used by law enforcement agencies; a second

project will put it on a public web site. "This information is already available in copy form," said K. Michael Reynolds, UCF criminal justice professor, "and our project will make it user friendly by adding the geographic component."

Under state law, FDLE must notify schools and centers of any registered sex offender within a mile of their campus. This program will speed that process by printing out mailing labels to the schools to be notified. Another project underway at the university is to automate the Brevard County sheriff's pawnshop reporting system, speeding the efforts to track stolen goods.

Orange, Seminole and Osceola county detectives will be entering data about major crimes in their areas on a computer server run by the Criminal Justice Department at UCF.

Exchange students need host families

Foreign high school students are scheduled to arrive very soon for academic program homestays, and the sponsoring organization needs a few more local host families.

According to Pacific Intercultural Exchange (PIE) Executive Director, John Doty, the students are all between the ages of 15 and 18 years, are English-speaking, have their own spending money, carry accident and health insurance, and are anxious to share their cultural experiences with their new American families. PIE currently has programs to match almost every family's needs, ranging in length from a semester to a full academic year, where the students attend local high schools.

PIE area representatives match students with host families by finding common interests and lifestyles through an informal in-home meeting. Prospective host families are able to review student applications and select the perfect match. As

there are no "typical" host families, PIE can fit a student into just about any situation, whether it be a single parent, a childless couple, a retired couple or a large family.

Families who host for PIE are also eligible to claim a \$50 per month charitable contribution deduction on their itemized tax returns for each month they host a sponsored student.

For the upcoming programs, PIE has students from Spain, Germany, Latvia, the Former Soviet Union, Finland, Argentina, Brazil, Mexico, Paraguay, Australia, Sweden, Yugoslavia, China, Belgium, Vietnam and many other countries. PIE has also been invited to participate in a special government-funded program to bring scholarship students from the Newly Independent States of the former Soviet Union to the United States. PIE is a non-profit educational organization that has sponsored more than 18,000 students from 40 countries since

its founding in 1975. The organization is designated by the United States Information Agency and is listed by the Council on Standards for International Educational Travel (CSIET), certifying that the organization complies with the standards set forth in CSIET's Standards for International Educational Travel Programs.

Doty encourages families to contact the program immediately, as it will allow the proper time for the students and hosts to get to know one another before they actually meet for the first time.

Sanford area families interested in learning more about student exchange or arranging for a meeting with a community representative may call PIE, toll-free, at 1-800-631-1818. The agency also has travel/study program opportunities available for American high school students as well as possibilities for community volunteers to assist and work with area host families, students and schools.

Record numbers expected to travel roads during holidays

HEATHROW — AAA Auto Club South, headquartered in Heathrow, predicts a near record number of Americans will be filling the highways this Christmas - New Years. They predict the number, 44.6 million, will be only slightly below last year's all time record of 45.2 million.

According to Diane W. Jones, project manager for AAA, approximately 35 million people plan to travel by auto this holiday, while another 9.6 million will travel by train, plane or bus. Each of the figures represent a one percent decline

from 1998.

Jones said a survey of 1,500 adults, on which the estimates were made, indicate 41 percent of the travelers will be heading into a city for the holidays, while another 30 percent are heading from the cities out to rural areas or small towns. The rest say they will be heading to beaches, lakes, mountains, state or national parks, and a few said they simply didn't know yet.

In another report from Heathrow's AAA, Yoli Buss, director of traffic safety says gasoline prices in Florida are expected to increase 5.3 cents per gallon during the holidays, rising to their highest pre-

Christmas level since 1990.

OPEC (Organizations of Petroleum Exporting Countries) members have stated that they must work toward stabilizing the oil market," Buss said. "This means that we may begin to see gas prices stabilize as we head toward the New Year.

Buss said Floridians can expect to see self-serve regular unleaded prices averaging \$1.33 per gallon. Mid-grade unleaded should average \$1.44 and premium unleaded at slightly over \$1.52. Although prices vary by a few cents from city to city, the Orlando area, which includes Seminole and Orange Counties, is right at average.

Food safety suggestions can keep brown-bag bugs away from lunch

Parents who do their food-safety homework can protect their children's brown-bag lunches from hungry bacteria.

"Bacteria love school-room temperatures, which allow them to multiply quickly when there's also a source of food and moisture," said Debby Demory-Luce, a registered dietitian with the USDA/ARS Children's Nutrition research Center at Baylor College of Medicine in Houston.

To keep harmful bacteria at bay, she offers the following suggestions.

Before school begins:

Add well-insulated lunchboxes or bags, insulated bottles for hot and cold foods and several days' supply of freezer gel packs to your back-to-school shopping list.

Stock up on shelf-stable foods, such as canned fruit or

puddings with pop-top lids, peanut butter, crackers, fresh fruit, bottled water, single serve packets of mayonnaise, and boxes of 100 percent fruit juice. Disposable silverware and individual hand wipes are also a good idea.

At home:

Wash hands, food preparation surface and utensils with hot soapy water before making lunch-box fare. Wash raw fruit and vegetables thoroughly.

Avoid using mayonnaise or mayonnaise-type dressing as a spread or salad base for take along lunches that can't be refrigerated. Handle other perishable foods like sandwich meats with care.

Prepare lunch-box offerings the evening before and store in the refrigerator or freezer. Frozen sandwiches, bottled water and juice boxes offer addi-

tional protection and will usually thaw completely by lunchtime.

Tightly wrap cold foods in waterproof plastic and pack around a frozen once pack or juice box.

Pre-heat or pre-chill insulated bottles to maximize the protection they provide. Fill with piping hot water or ice water and let stand a few minutes.

At school:

Store lunchboxes and bags out of direct sunlight and away from schoolroom radiators.

Discard leftovers. Gel packs and insulated containers won't keep foods safe all day.

After School:

Wash lunchboxes, gel packs and insulated bags with hot, soapy water and air dry. Using a little baking soda helps control food odors. Return gel packs to the freezer.

Could it have actually been broccoli Popeye was eating all these years?

Q: Is broccoli more nutritious than spinach?

A: Broccoli and spinach are both nutritional powerhouses, says Dr. Michael Grusak, a plant physiologist with the USDA/ARS Children's Nutrition Research Center at Baylor College of Medicine. Both are rich in fiber, vitamins and minerals, and low in calories.

Each has specific nutritional strengths, however. Spinach is richer in iron, folate and vitamin A, but broccoli provides more vitamin C and calcium. In addition, broccoli provides more vitamin C and calcium. In addition, broccoli and other cruciferous vegetables, such as Brussel sprouts and kale, contain glucosinolates. Glucosinolates are a group of phytonutrients thought to help the body detoxify carcinogens and increase human resistance to cancer.

But, before going overboard on either broccoli or spinach, remember that variety is the spice of life and key to good nutrition. So, don't worry which is more nutritious—eat both!

Q: Although I want to breastfeed my new baby, I don't want to give up having an occasional glass of wine. Any advice?

A: Timing and moderation are the answer, says Dr. Judy Hopkinson, a lactation physiologist with the USDA/ARS Children's Nutrition Research Center at Baylor College of Medicine in Houston. Alcohol does get into breast milk when you drink. But, if you limit yourself to an occasional single three-ounce glass of wine and wait two hours or more before nursing, your body will be able to clear both your blood and milk of alcohol, making it safe to breastfeed.

Exposure to alcohol could become a problem for your infant, however, if you nurse too soon, drink too much or drink frequently. A baby's body metabolizes alcohol very slowly, so even a small amount can affect nursing and sleep patterns. Initially, alcohol reduces nursing time by inducing sleep. But several hours later, it was the opposite affect and begins to interfere with sleep. Regular alcohol exposure can also affect a baby's behavior and coordination.

Q: I say that fat accounts for 20 percent of the calories in 80 percent lean ground beef. My husband disagrees. Who's right?

A: He is. According to nutritionists at the USDA/ARS Children's Nutrition Research Center at Baylor College of Medicine, ground beef labeled 80 percent lean is 20 percent fat by weight, not by caloric content.

What makes this distinction important is that each gram of fat yields 9 calories, while a gram of protein yields just 4. For example: a 100 gram burger (about three and one-half ounces) made from 80 percent lean ground beef contains a total of 260 calories and 20 grams of fat. Since that 20 grams of fat yield 180 calories, the percent of calories from fat is 180/260, or nearly 70 percent.

Although this might be surprising, don't let your new insight turn you against iron-rich red meats. Remember, the heart-healthy goal of keeping your fat calories to 30 percent or less of total calories applies to your overall diet, not a single food. So, on days when you want to enjoy a lean beef burger, just remember to control the

portion size and watch your overall fat intake during the rest of the day. This is easier if you choose more fruits, vegetables and whole grain foods, and few high-fat snacks and conveince foods.

To save on calories and fat, you might also want to consider some alternatives to ground beef:

Q: Is home-made baby food healthier than store-bought?

A: Commercially prepared baby food is nutritionally equivalent to the home-made version, says Dr. Debby Demory-Luce, a registered dietitian with the USDA/ARS Children's Nutrition Research College of Medicine. So, the decision comes down to personal preference.

Some parents enjoy making their own baby foods and find it more economical. The texture of home-made foods can also be easily varied to promote chewing skied in babies who are developmentally ready.

Should you decide to make your own baby food, be sure to keep cleanliness and food safety in mind during the preparation and storage. Clean hands, preparation surfaces, utensils, and containers are a must. Also, avoid adding sugar, honey, salt, or seasonings to your baby's food, whether purchased or home made. Adding honey is particularly dangerous because it can harbor a bacteria that causes a potentially fatal illness in babies less than 1 year of age.

kids off the streets, out of trouble and give many the extra help they need to realize their full potential."

An estimated 200 students and 150 community members will participate in the Hamilton Elementary School learning center, according to the grant.

Students in kindergarten through fifth grade will receive tutoring in reading and math and participate in a summer technology camp. There will also be adult literacy classes for parents.

The school-district will hold programs in partnership with the Orlando Science Center, the West Sanford Boys and Girls Club and the Central Florida Zoo.

District officials said they were not expecting to be awarded the grant, which they applied for during spring 1998.

"We had at one point been told we wouldn't get it," said Jeanne Moon, the grant writer for the school district. "We were really shocked when we found out about it."

Transportation and baby-sitting will be provided through grant funding to assist families who participate in the program.

The program sponsors tutoring for students, academic enrichment activities, technology education, as well as drug and violence prevention counseling.

Extracurricular activities that can be provided through the grant include chorus, band, drama, and the arts. The grant also provides for supervised recreational activities, and services for youths with disabilities.

The 125 programs receiving new grants are located in 38 states and Puerto Rico. The average grant award is \$500,000.

The grant is part of an effort by the Seminole County School District to improve test scores at the six elementary schools that received "D's" on the state's accountability report.

"We currently have about 120 of our students participating in an after school program," said Hamilton Elementary School Principal Nan Parker.

Governor Jeb Bush's one-year old A+ Plan provides for schools to receive letter grades based on a standardized test measuring math, reading, and writing achievement, as well as on school attendance, discipline, and high school graduation rates.

Wicklow, Hamilton and Midway elementary schools have the lowest Florida Comprehensive Assessment Test (FCAT) scores in the district in both reading and math. Pine Crest Elementary School received a "D" based on its FCAT scores for reading and

writing. Idyllwilde and English Estates received "D's" based on Florida Writes! test scores.

The grading system is part of the same education reform package that created a plan for parents in schools receiving an "F" twice in four years to receive vouchers for private schools.

Five of the six schools with "D's" in the state report are located in Sanford, while English Estates is in Fern Park.

In August, a school-based After School Extended Day Program was developed for four of the six schools that received "D's." Several days per week, students receive tutoring from the time school ends until 5 p.m. The school district provides students with transportation to their homes.

The schools participating in the extended-day program include Wicklow, Hamilton, Midway, and Pine Crest elementary schools.

The Success For All reading

program developed by Johns Hopkins University has been implemented in Hamilton and Midway elementary schools.

Although Winter Springs Elementary School did not receive a "D," it is also participating in the program.

Weekly meetings are held at each school to organize support services. The schools are focusing on developing mentoring programs, as well as developing the curriculum.

Evening workshops are being planned for parents to assist in the preparation for the Florida Comprehensive Assessment Test and Florida Writes.

The schools are struggling with high poverty levels, absentee rates, and with a large portion of students that are mobile, moving in-and-out of school

during the school year.

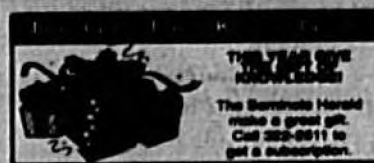
At Hamilton Elementary, 91 percent of the students qualify to receive free or reduced lunches, according to school officials.

Four of the schools — Midway, Hamilton, Pine Crest, and Wicklow — have poverty levels above 70 percent. Idyllwilde and English Estates elementary schools have poverty rates of 48 percent.

Wicklow Elementary School has a 60 percent mobility rate, which reflects the number of students moving in-and-out in a year. The remaining five schools with "D's" all have mobility rates ranging from 30-to-36 percent.

The six schools with "D's" also have high absence rates. For instance, 20 percent of Pine Crest Elementary School students were absent for 20 days or more last year. The state's is 8.7 percent.

Hamilton, Wicklow and Midway elementary schools have absentee rates ranging from 10.4 to 11.7 percent. English Estates has an 8.3 percent absentee rate, while Idyllwilde has a 7.1 percent absentee rate.

other."

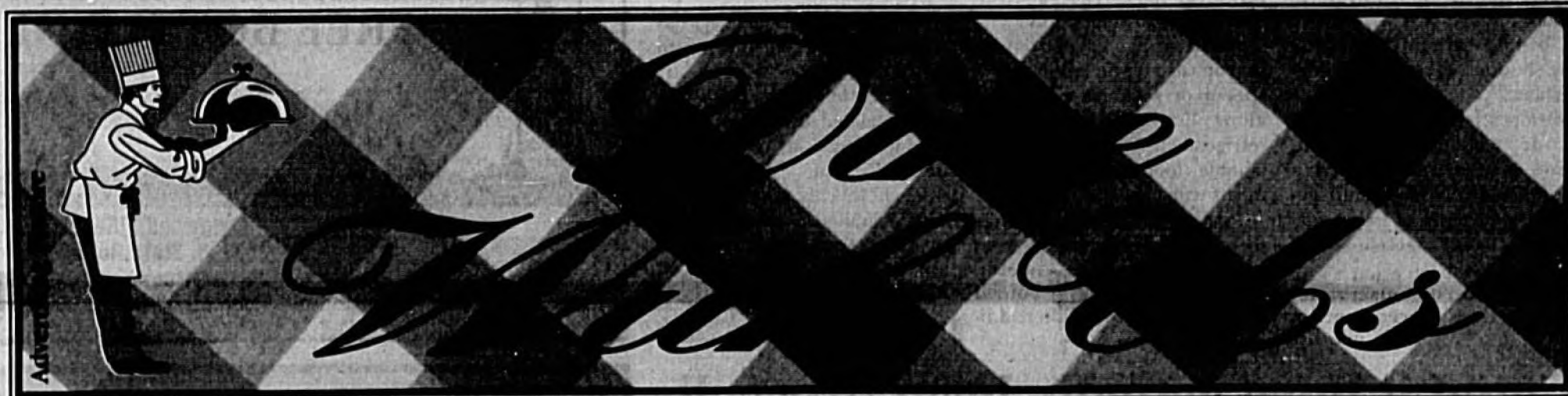
Ferrell was telling his Santa story to customers on Monday. His shop had plenty of business. This is the *beck* of the season.

Settlement reached on Fisheating Creek suit

OCALA - The parties in a lawsuit involving Fisheating Creek and 18,000 acres of adjacent wilderness, signed a final settlement Thursday.

The strip of land along the creek in Glades County is some of the finest hunting land in Florida, particularly for Osceola turkeys, and it also offers a wealth of wildlife viewing, camping, hiking, biking, canoeing and boating opportunities.

The plaintiff in the case was the state agency that holds title to much of the state's lands -- the Board of Trustees of the Internal Improvement Trust Fund of the State of Florida. Other parties (interveners), including Save Our Creeks, Inc. and the Environmental Confederation of Southwest Florida, joined the trustees in negotiating the settlement with Lykes Brothers, Inc.

The Nature Conservancy also assisted in negotiations. The Department of Environmental Protection and the Nature Conservancy then entered into a multi-party agreement to acquire the property.

Terms of the settlement require that the Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission (FWC) operate the land as a wildlife management area, which will be open to public use with a strong law enforcement presence on the area and on Lykes Brothers property nearby. Lykes Brothers retains ownership of a 41,600-acre tract, adjacent to the area, but has agreed to a conservation easement to limit development of the property.

The terms of the settlement include provisions that the state will purchase 9,781 acres from Lykes Brothers, Inc., and Lykes Brothers will issue a quit claim deed to an additional 8,383 acres, relinquishing any rights the company has to that acreage.

Lykes Brothers will retain ownership but will accept a conservation easement for the adjacent 41,606 acres. The company will be able to continue timber and grazing operations and leasing hunting rights on that parcel, although it may not open the land for dense development.

Assistant Director Tim Breault said he expects the area to be one of Florida's best sites for Osceola turkey hunting, hog hunting, bowhunting and muzzle-loader hunting. Hunts will be controlled through the quota hunt system, in which the number of hunters on the area at a given time will be limited.

The settlement does call for setting aside up to 50 quota permits for Glades and Hendry county sportsmen to hunt wild hogs on the area.

"We'll be taking a look at the possibility of offering a private concessionaire the opportunity to operate camping facilities and possibly a canoe rental concession," Breault said.

Nonhunters will find the area to be an excellent spot to view such remarkable

Gerhart fastest in ARCA test at Daytona

DAYTONA BEACH - Defending champions sent serious messages to the competition at Daytona International Speedway over the weekend as Daytona's 1999 ARCA 200 Champion Bobby Gerhart and 1999 ARCA Bondo/MarHyde Series Champion Bill Baird topped the speed charts during testing for Speedweeks 2000's Pro2Call 200.

Gerhart's Chevrolet Monte Carlo blistered the 2.5-mile trioval at an attention grabbing 188.009 mph, while Baird, also in a Chevrolet, turned an impressive lap at 187.383 mph.

Rounding out the top five were Frank Kimmel, Daytona resident Dan Pardus and Ron Hornaday.

The quickest lap seemed to surprise everyone in the garage area except Gerhart.

"We certainly did our homework before we came here," said Gerhart. "That's what we expected when we unloaded

from the truck, and that's the statement we want to make as defending champion here."

ARCA's implementation of new rules designed to slow and stabilize the cars left many crew members shaking their heads. The key to going fast for some was the intangible called experience.

"We've always run well at Daytona," said Baird. "I've sat on the pole here, turned a lot of laps at this place, so when we come back here in 2000 we'll unload prepared to win."

Pardus had similar thoughts. "We're top five on the speed charts," he pointed out. "At Daytona you don't necessarily have to qualify on the pole to be competitive in a race situation. This car drafts well and drives comfortably and we're going to get a few more tenths out of it before February."

Of the 34 ARCA Bondo/MarHyde teams testing at Daytona, the Dale Earnhardt Inc. Chevrolet Monte Carlo was getting the most attention.

Driver Kerry Earnhardt turned in a top 10 speed of 184.805 mph.

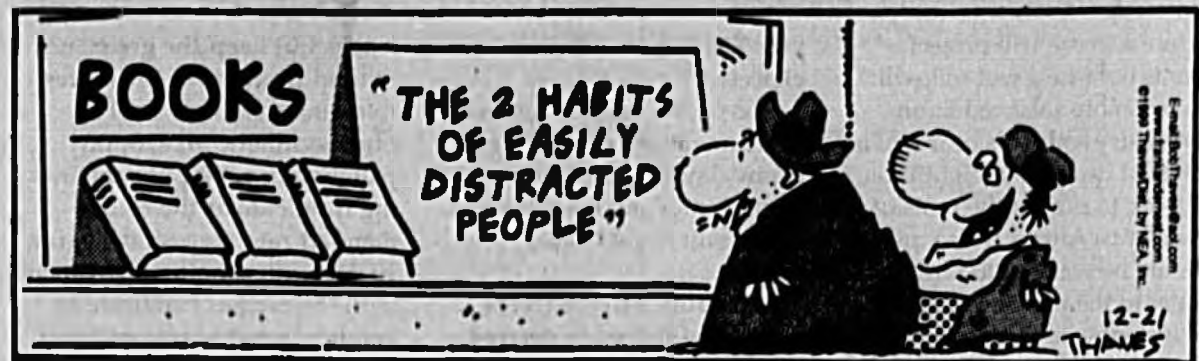

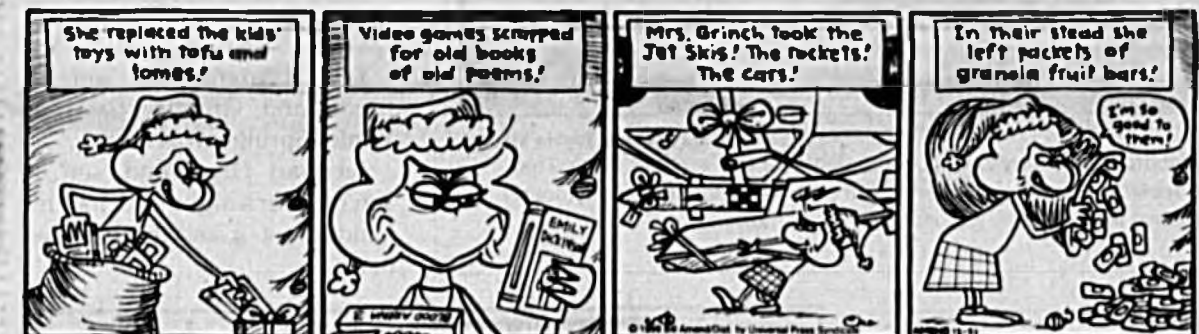

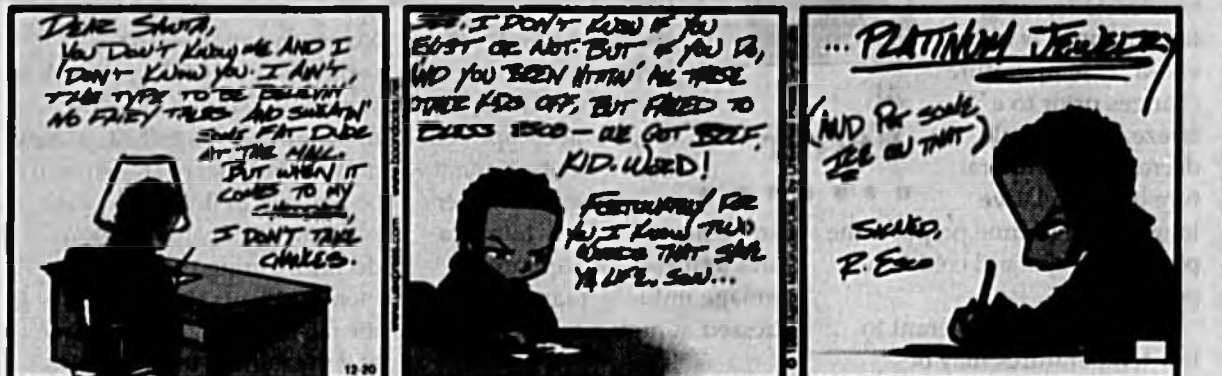

Win at Bridge

The magic comes early

 You probably know who wrote this: "How confusing the beams from memory's lamp are: One day a bachelor, the next a grampa. What is the secret of the trick? How did I get so old so quick?"
 Not from playing too much bridge. And there is something memorable about working out virtually the whole deal at trick one. You are East, so cover the West and South hands. Against three no-trump, your partner leads the club four: queen, ace, five. What would you do now?
 Why?
 North is right to raise to two no-trump instead of showing his diamond support. If game is on, it will be in three no-trump, not five diamonds. What is South's shape? Well, from West's opening lead, you know South has four clubs. (There is only one card below the four that West can hold, and

South cannot have five clubs.) South's three-spade bid showed exactly three cards in that suit. Also, he opened one diamond and rebid one no-trump. So surely his distribution is 3-2-4-4.
 Returning a club won't be profitable, unless the play of dummy's queen was a beginner's error. Instead, switch to the heart two, hoping partner has one of the missing honors. Here, West will win with the king and return the three, which you will duck to South's ace. Declarer will have to play a club, but your partner will win with the king, and two more heart tricks will result in one down.

Past asbestos exposure can be trouble

DEAR DR. GOTT: Are those of us who were shipyard workers during World War II at risk for health problems?
 DEAR READER: Yes, and here's why.
 In past years, asbestos was commonly used as insulating material and in manufacturing. The mineral is highly heat-resistant. In the 1940s and 1950s, scientists were not aware of the health dangers of asbestos; hence, there were very few environmental controls. This was especially true in heavy manufacturing — such as shipbuilding — and in asbestos mines.
 Beginning in the 1960s, doctors recognized the relation between asbestos exposure and mesothelioma, a malignant tumor of the lung covering. The mineral was also discovered to be the cause of asbestosis, a severe, debilitating and progressive pulmonary disorder resembling

emphysema.
 Today the mining and commercial use of asbestos is carefully regulated — or directly banned in many processes. Asbestos is now known to be a dangerous substance that causes handicaps and death.
 Because you were a shipyard worker before the hazards of asbestos were fully appreciated, you were at risk of inhaling dangerous quantities of asbestos fibers. You should now undergo periodic and rigorous lung examinations to ensure that you have not suffered any damage.
 DEAR DR. GOTT: To avoid unnecessary expense, I have been taking a friend's birth control pills, since she no longer needs them. Is there anything wrong in this?
 DEAR READER: Oral contraceptives are prescription drugs, and it is unwise for a person to take medicine that is prescribed for someone else. You are engaging in a risky practice. You might be allergic to another person's medications. More

important, it may not be right for you.
 In addition, women on birth control pills should have Pap smears performed at periodic intervals, at least annually. By taking your friend's pills, you are depriving yourself of necessary medical supervision.
 Finally, these medicines are far from harmless; they can cause hypertension and blood clots in certain women. While on birth control pills, you need to be evaluated for potential complications of treatment.
 Rather than saving money by using your friend's prescription, you should see your own gynecologist. Be frank in discussing your financial situation. I am sure that the doctor would make an adjustment in fee; he or she might even be willing to provide you with free samples of the drug. Further, birth control clinics, such as those run by Planned Parenthood, often give free or very low-cost care to women who cannot afford private medical services. Please don't compromise your own medical care because of financial reasons.

Ornamental plants also need protection from the cold

Many different tropical and subtropical plants are found in a typical Florida landscape.

While tropical plants need to be protected from temperatures below 50 degrees Fahrenheit, subtropical plants can harden to withstand freezing temperatures.

The ability of plants to tolerate freezing temperatures is influenced by temperature changes prior to a freeze. A gradual decrease in temperature over a relative long period of time prepares the plants to withstand cold temperatures.

Plants normally tolerant to low temperatures may be injured if a sudden decrease in temperature occurs. Cold injury can occur to the entire plant or

to plant parts such as buds, flowers, fruits, trunks, stems or roots. Many plant parts can adapt to tolerate cold, but fruits and roots have little ability to develop cold tolerance.

Containers
Plant roots in small containers can be frozen by low temperatures, but under the same conditions, roots of plants in the landscape will escape cold injury. Roots of plants in exposed containers can be injured by low temperatures and show no apparent damage until the plants are stressed at higher temperatures.

Soil heat
Radiating heat from soil warms the air above ground,

and low-growing plants will greatly benefit from this source of heat. Soil heat is best preserved by mulches placed around plants to protect the roots. Organic mulches such as pine bark are recommended.

Fertilization
Most landscape plants are fertilized two or three times a year. In Central Florida, usually one application is scheduled in March and another in September. Late fall applications should be avoided as it can promote untimely late flush of new growth. Fertilizer rates should be reduced in the fall because plant nutrient consumption declines during the colder months. Plants should receive in the fall about one third to one half the normal fertilizer rate.

Irrigation
Watering plants several hours

before a freeze will protect plants because a wet soil will absorb more solar radiation than a dry soil. This heat will be released during the night thus helping to protect the roots of the plants. After a freeze, plants should be watered to provide water to the plants which may be losing water through transpiration and the water in the soil may not be available because it is frozen, this is especially true in container plants.

Coverings
Materials such as cloth sheets, quilts and plastics can be placed over plants to protect them from frost damage. Covers that extend to the ground and do not touch the plant tissues, will protect plants by reducing radiant heat loss from the plants and the ground. A light bulb can be placed under the covers to provide heat to the plants when

very low temperatures are expected.

The covers must be removed as temperatures rise during a sunny day. Contact between the plant tissues and the coverings, may result in cold injury.

Pruning After A Freeze
Pruning should be delayed until new growth is visible. Dead leaves may be removed as soon as they have turned brown. Cold damaged to woody tissues can be best determined by examining the food conducting tissues under the bark. If scratching into the bark reveals black or brown tissues, continue the search until you find green tissues when scratched. Prune back to the live wood to promote healthy growth of the branches.

Cold Injury To Palms
Remove damaged portions of

leaves but keep the green, not injured portions of the leaves to maintain a high level of photosynthetic area. Spray palms with a copper containing fungicide at the recommended rate. Repeat the spray 10 days after the first treatment with the copper fungicide or another broad spectrum fungicide.

Palms growing in containers should receive a fungicide soil drench to suppress possible root infecting fungi from causing root rots. A monthly soluble nutrient solution containing minor elements can be applied to help palms recover from light freeze injuries.

To this day, she is my dearest friend, even though we have not lived in the same city for 31 years.

I deeply regret that my brother never got to grow up, live his life, get married and have children of his own to love. I have always regretted that my children never had the chance to meet and know their wonderful Uncle Mark.

If today's teen-agers feel the need to get high, please let them know this is not the way to do it. Huffing kills!
