LINDBERGH LEAVES FOR U. S. WITH LOAD OF MAIL

inaugurates New Service Between Mexico City and Brownsville Texas Field

Flies Over Rebel Infested Section
Passengers Are Also Carried Making Unusually Heavy Ship

BROWNVILLE, Texas, Mar. 9.—(INS)—Col. Charles A. Lindbergh, opening the Brownsville-Mexico City air service, landed here today at 1:35, having left Valbuena, Mexico, at 10:30 this morning.

MEXICO CITY, Mar. 9.—(INS)—Despite the fact he could be compelled to fly over territory torn by the revolution, Col. Charles A. Lindbergh hopped off at 5:56 o'clock this morning for Brownsville, Texas.

Lindbergh's flight is to inaugurate an air mail and passenger service between Mexico City and the United States. Col. Lindbergh flew a giant transport Ford plane belonging to a Mexican aviation company. A crowd of about 100 saw the famous aviator take off. His plane was heavily burdened that it was five minutes before Col. Lindbergh with his skill, could get it off the ground.

GAMBLING PROBE AT RACE TRACKS PLAN OF SHERIFF

McClendon And Three Of Deputies Will Be On Hand Tonight

When the race track opens tonight at the Sanford race track, Sheriff J. E. McClendon and three members of his staff of deputies will be on hand to make arrests if they discover any violations of the state law prohibiting gambling.

This was Sheriff McClendon's answer to a Herald query this morning regarding his plan of action. The Sheriff said his men have been ordered to gather at the track and to be on hand to make arrests if they discover any violations of the state law prohibiting gambling.

"No one is opposed to race track gambling any more than I am and I shall diligently work to secure evidence to arrest and convict anyone who violates the law in connection with the track's operation," the officer said.

Sheriff McClendon said he had given considerable thought to the race since learning several weeks ago that they would be inaugurated. He said experience had been gained by the state attorney and with enforcement officers in other sections of the state in an effort to map out a course of action.

Although no announcement has been made by the operators, the envelope system of wagering is expected to be used at the track. This is the same as is employed at the Miami tracks. It is expected that under this plan, a spectator obtains an envelope and a number and places in it what amount of money he desires to bet. He signs his name on the envelope and gives it to a clerk who receives an envelope containing his winnings.

This is said to be the most complicated system of betting yet adopted by Florida tracks. It replaced the picture race system which was reported used at Miami track earlier in the season.

Eddie McPadden, manager of the club, announced this morning that everything is in readiness for the opening tonight. The first race is scheduled for 8 o'clock. Seven races will be run. There are already 100 dogs at the track and 60 more were expected to arrive sometime today. The track will last between 30 and 40 days, Mr. McPadden said.

they started their second day's work on the case today that apparently, Walsh "knew too much" and was talking too much about the Rothstein case. At the time of the killing in New York, Walsh was arrested but was released in police court. He had broken with Rothstein about a month before the latter was slain.

Another channel of inquiry that was receiving much attention grew out of reports linking the name of Fred Pine, solicitor-elect of Dade County, with that of the accused Wilson. It is said that the men are partners in the ownership of considerable property here. Should Wilson be indicted for any thing less than first degree murder, Pine, who takes office in a month, will handle the prosecution. A first degree murder indictment would place the case in the hands of the state's attorney.

NEW YORK, Mar. 8.—(INS)—Death has claimed another member of Broadway racketeers headed by the late Arnold Rothstein and Tom Walsh, the latter murdered in Florida yesterday. When the Clyde line Shawnee docked in port today it was revealed Jack Waller, once high in the directorate of the Broadway-Rothstein gang, had either leaped overboard or had been pushed from the deck of the vessel Tuesday night, less than twelve hours before Walsh met his death. The ship was just off the coast of Florida.

New York detectives assigned to investigate the murder of Walsh were tracking down evidence which they believe will link the killing with the slaying of Rothstein and Frankie Uale here and the recent massacre in Chicago.

Ed Wilson, New York and Chicago gambler, is being sought as the slayer of Walsh.

"We've got detectives in Miami and we know there are at least 90 racketeers most of them former associates of Rothstein's congregated there at the present

time." Police Commissioner Whelan said. "The gang is beginning to tear itself apart, they're fighting among themselves, and somebody is going to talk."

Irene Walsh, one of the four pretty unmarried sisters of Fatty Walsh, denied today that her brother was formerly Arnold Rothstein's body guard. She said he had served the gambler as an expert on financial matters. "Tom had plenty of money," she said. "He was worth hundreds of thousands and was interested in real estate in Miami."

District Attorney Charles Dodd of Brooklyn went to Chicago and after a conference with police there attributed the Rothstein-Frankie Uale and Bugs Moran gang murders to the sinister hand of "Scarface" Al Capone.

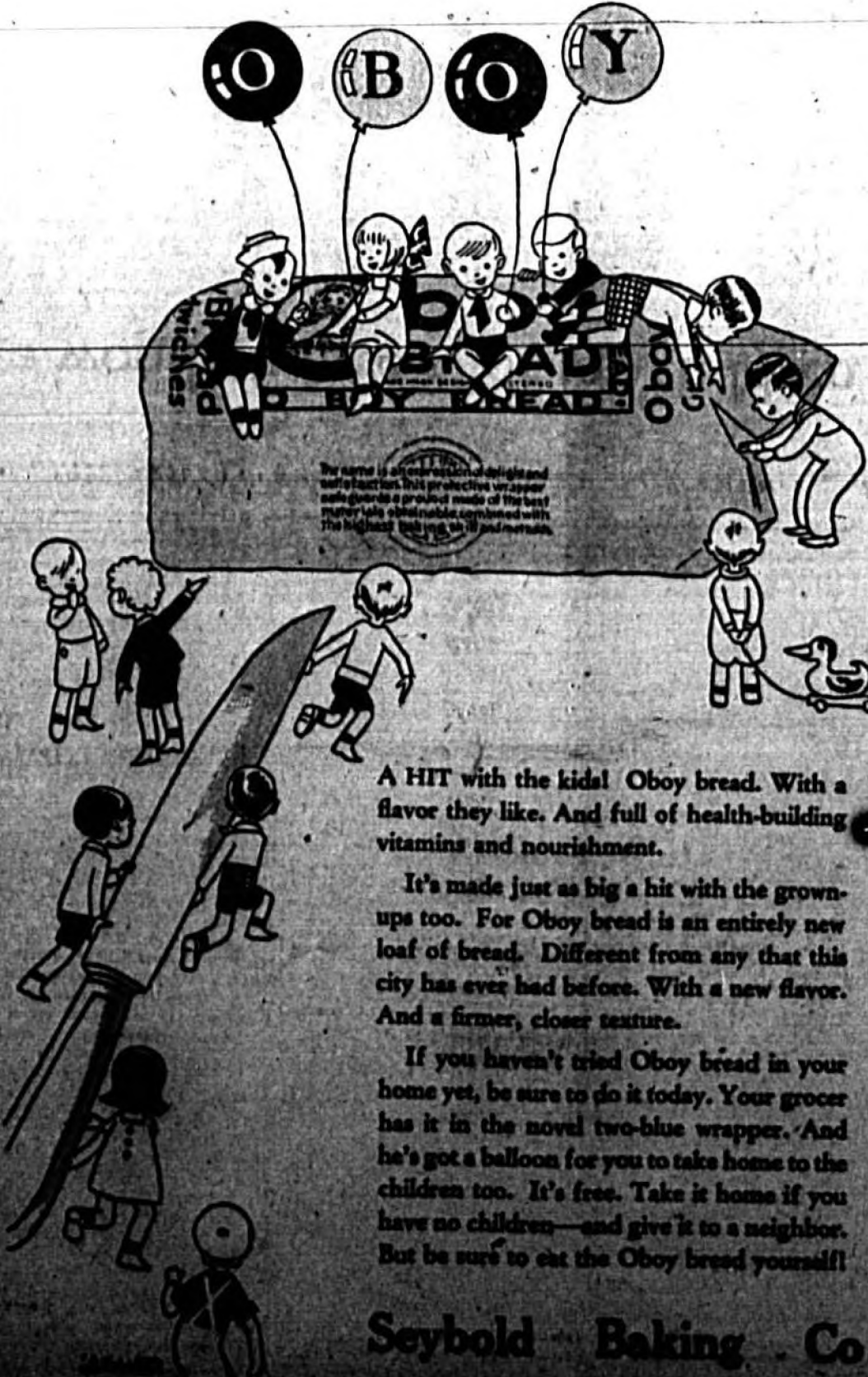

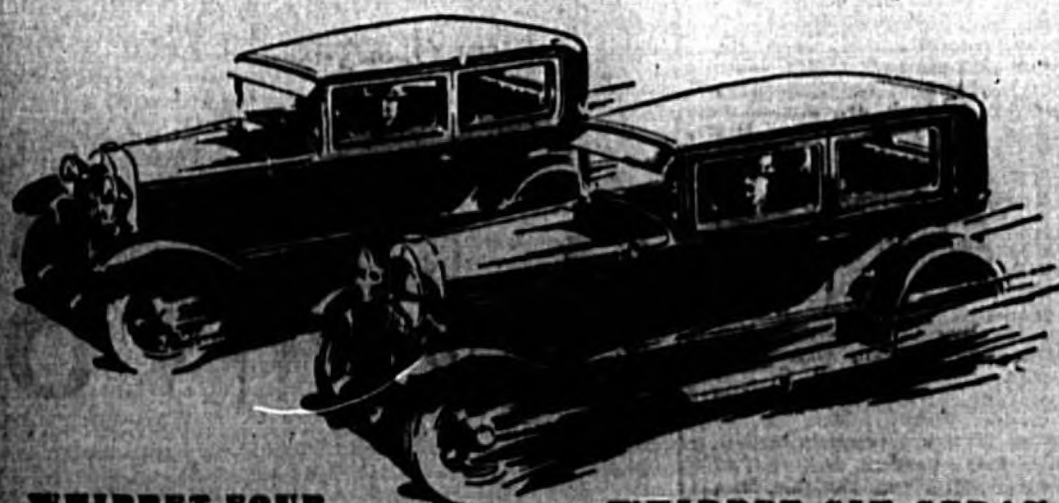

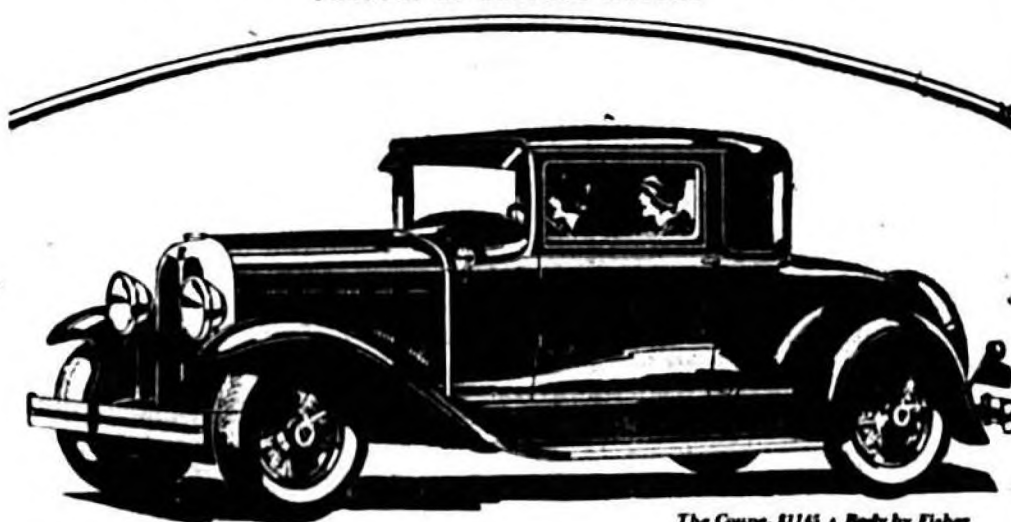
