LINDY LEAVES FOR U. S. WITH LOAD OF MAIL

inaugurates New Service Between Mexico City And Brownsville Texas Field

Flies Over Rebel Infested Section

Passengers Are Also Carried Making Unusually Heavy Ship

BROWNSVILLE, Texas, Mar. 9.—(INS)—Col. Charles A. Lindbergh, opening the Brownsville-Mexico City air service landed here today at 1:35, having left Victoria, Mexico, at 7:30 this morning.

MEXICO CITY, Mar. 9.—(INS)—Despite the fact he could be compelled to fly over territory torn by the revolution, Col. Charles A. Lindbergh hopped off at 5:56 o'clock this morning from Brownsville, Texas. Lindbergh's flight is to inaugurate an air mail and passenger service between Mexico City and the United States. Col. Lindbergh flew a giant-powered Ford plane belonging to a Mexican aviation company. A crowd of about 100 saw the famous aviator take off. His plane was so heavily burdened that it was five minutes before Col. Lindbergh with his skill could get it off the ground.

Col. Lindbergh taxied slowly toward the south, throwing up a cloud of dust so thick that it completely concealed the plane. The roar from the roaring motors of the whirling propellers threw the dust in every direction. The pilot taxied the field adjoining Brownsville Field over which the sun journeyed before it left the ground. The huge plane journeyed over the ground three or four miles before Lindbergh turned and tried to take the plane across last, rising gracefully and easily under the skillful hands of the world's greatest ace." It was a perfect "Lindbergh take off," Lindbergh turned and the plane in the air, raced back past the guitars travelling at terrific speed.

There was a heavy mist in the air and Lindbergh drove straight into it and quickly disappeared. Lindbergh was in a hurry and went no time in "showing off."

The Colonel sat at the controls. He was offered the use of extra pilot but curtly declined.

At the time he appeared on the field early in the morning he spoke to no one. He ignored salutes and extended feminine greetings from young women who were completely absorbed in his

passengers. The new air mail service from Mexico City, which will extend to York City, from Brownsville cut the time of letters from city to one day and a half.

Lindbergh plans to bring the same plane from Brownsville with both mail and passengers.

British Church Heads Seek Increase In Pay


LONDON, Mar. 9.—(INS)—The Dean and five Canons of Westminster Abbey are so poor that they have been obliged to ask for a raise in salary.


