

WASHINGTON, July 16, (AP) - President Roosevelt and Prime Minister Churchill in a virtual ultimatum told Italy today the time has come for her to "decide whether Italians shall die for Mussolini and Hitler-or live for Italy and civilization.

In a joint statement issued simultaneously at the Whits House and in London, they told Italy her sole hope of survival lies in an honorable capitulation to the overwhelming power of the military forces of the United Rations." forces of the United Nations."

The statement signaled a tarville propagands barrage which included the dropping of thousands of leaflets on Italy by Allied bombers in addition to beaming a message to the people of Italy by radio.


