Two meetings to decide cops' fate

By sunset today, Sanford's newly-selected Law Enforcement Options Committee should have a distinct sense of direction.

The committee meets 6 p.m. today at 5 p.m. with Public Ad-

ministration Service consultant George Hubler, who wrote a critical management review report on the Sanford Police Department.

Hubler is prepared to explain every detail of his report in which he labeled the SPD as "flawed...below average." He is here to clarify the role and the procedure the (one member

Schools hold special place for volunteers

Their services are worth more than \$4.5 million, but they are not paid in dollars. Their pay comes in the form of hugs, smiles and thank-yous. They are the 10,000 Dividend volunteers that give their time and services to Seminole County Public Schools. And there is a place for everyone. That was the message from Seminole County Public School Partnership Specialist Jane Lane at a Dividend Breakfast held recently at Hamilton Elementary School.

Dividend volunteers provide a variety of services. Volunteers choose the school, day and time that is convenient for them. There are approximately 20 programs in place for volunteers to choose from that cover

virtually every aspect of school life. Most of the volunteer opportunities require little or no experience. Training, when needed, and materials are provided.

Lane outlined the various opportunities to the potential volunteers present at the breakfast. Volunteers can help the staff with clerical duties or work in classrooms assisting teachers. Art-See volunteers are trained to make presentations to students using prints, artifacts and slides. Green Circle volunteers help students learn about circles of friends and including friends who may be different from themselves. Dividends may share their interest in math, science, reading and language. Bilingual volunteers are needed to assist non-English speaking students

Casselberry cops crack down on prostitution

The Casselberry Police Department conducted a decoy prostitution sting through the evening of Friday, Oct. 3, to the early hours of Saturday, Oct. 4. This is part of Casselberry's ongoing effort to curb street level vice problems and promote public health and safety.

During the evening, 15 arrests were made. Charges were broken down as follows: 15 designations to commit prostitution; three narcotics related charges; one violation probation/community control; one carrying concealed weapon; and three criminal traffic charges.

According to Casselberry Police Information Officer Sgt. Dennis Stewart, one of the defendant's accidentally turned his car into the side of a marked police car that was sitting beside him in a median

break. The patrol car was not moving and had emergency lights engaged at the time of the crash. There were no injuries and very little damage in the low speed impact crash. The driver was on felony probation for prior burglary charges and had also been drinking.

Each of the arrestees face up to a possible 60 days in jail and a \$500 fine for the prostitution charges. The state may revoke their driving privileges for up to one year for using a vehicle in prostitution. According to Stewart, the danger of robbery, theft, AIDS, and other sexually transmitted diseases is always present in street level prostitution. He also stated that this seemingly victimless crime (prostitution) may have enormous life impact on the arrestee, their family, future sexual partners and the social/health care systems due to STD exposure.

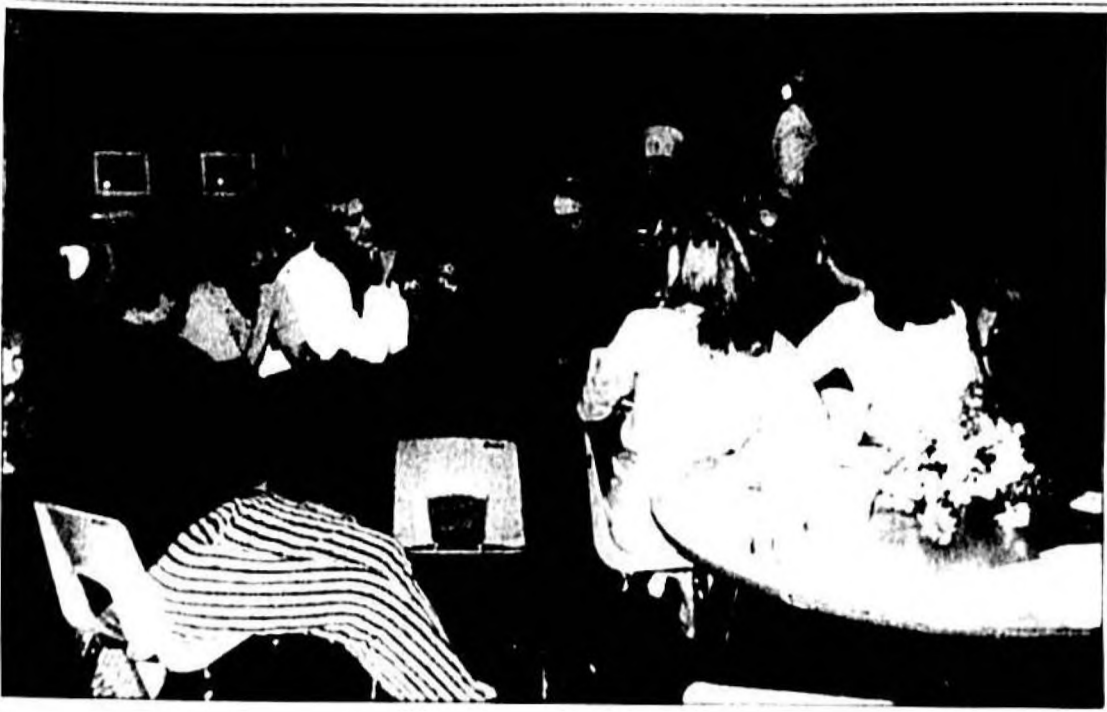

Dividends may make a long term commitment to work one on one with students in need of positive role models and adult friendships. Others may choose short term commitments such as chaperoning on a field trip or being a guest speaker. Lane emphasizes that everyone has something special to share. Volunteers share themselves. The Dividend program encourages all members of the community to be involved with education. Business and Education Partners in Excellence promotes businesses and schools working together. Partners in Excellence is an exchange of human resources between schools and businesses. This is achieved through internships, job shadowing, students displays, apprenticeships and classroom presentations. Unique programs can be designed with the cooperation of business and schools.

Hamilton Elementary School has partnerships with the University of Central Florida and Nova University. Students from the universities work as interns in the school. Interns assist teachers in the classroom, work with reading groups and participate as mentors. UCF's interns work under the guidance of the director of the University Partnership Program, Professor David Meador. The interns benefit from the practical experience. Lottery calls probed

Some Floridians are receiving calls from a firm identifying itself as "Lottery Disbursement," which is in no way related to the Florida Lottery. In responding to the computer-generated call, consumers who provide their telephone numbers are called for a collect call for as much as \$50 or more per call. The Florida Public Service Commission (FPC) is currently evaluating whether the calls comply with the Trade Regulation Rule and the Telephone Disclosure and Dispute Resolution Act of 1992.

Because the company is using the telecommunications network to conduct this fraudulent activity, it was our responsibility to put Florida consumers on alert. The Chairman, Bruce Johnson, said, "Consumers who are called for collect calls on their local telephone bills by Zero-Fax Dialing Inc. on behalf of Comet are encouraged to send a copy of their bill and a statement about how the solicitation was made to the FPC to assist in its investigation. Correspondence should be sent to the address below.

The FPC has previously petitioned the Federal Communications Commission (FCC) to adopt additional consumer safeguards to protect consumers from fraudulent telephone bills. The petition was supported by the National Association of Attorneys General. The FCC has not yet amended rules to provide for the proposed safeguards. In addition, the FPC also filed comments with the Federal Trade Commission (FTC) concerning numerous violations of the FTC's rules and the need to adopt additional safeguards. The FPC is reviewing the information that has been developed.

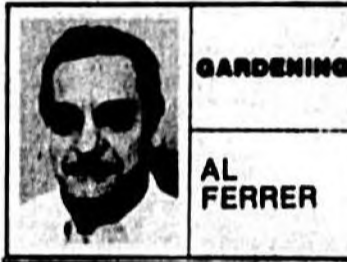

Education a smart investment

DEAR ABBY: I am a retired credit executive with more than 40 years of experience dealing with people mired in credit card payments.

In your column on credit card debt, "Free and Clear in Florida" wrote: "... it is not uncommon for people to be caught up in the vicious cycle of paying for things on credit and being able to afford only the minimum monthly payments."

We have a large segment of the population who are economically illiterate consumers and do not understand how to spend intelligently, save wisely, invest, or do simple financial planning.

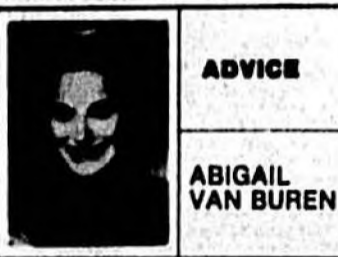
Yes, the credit card companies and other credit granters are partially to blame for encouraging people to live beyond their means, which creates financial stress for the debtors and their families. However, debtors who are poorly informed about money matters should shoulder some of the responsibility for their own difficulties.

The problem is of serious nationwide concern. An estimated 1.1 million individuals filed for bankruptcy in 1996 (up 27 percent from 1995). Besides the emotional stress for these people, such losses become part of the cost of doing business and cause consumers to pay higher prices, higher interest rates and fees.

There's now talk about revamping and toughening the nation's bankruptcy code. In my opinion, such revisions are merely Band-Aid solutions. The flaw is not only in the bankruptcy code, but also in our failure to provide programs that give students a head start in understanding consumer economics (along with the rights and responsibilities of using credit). A financial education curriculum could help students develop financial skills and money sense - knowledge that can help them use their money to the greatest benefit. Such a program would benefit both students and credit granters.

If school funds are not available now to finance a money management program, this would be a project worthy of support from public and corporate funds.

A wide-ranging group of federal government, business and civic organizations has banded together to advocate for the inclusion of personal financial education for kindergarten through 12th-grade curriculums. This new resource for educators is the JumpStart Coalition. Its mission: to improve financial literacy among youth during the next decade.

The JumpStart Coalition provides a clearinghouse for per-

sonal finance training materials. By sponsoring educational materials and lobbying for more financial education, JumpStart hopes to increase education and awareness in four areas: income, money management, saving and investing, and spending. 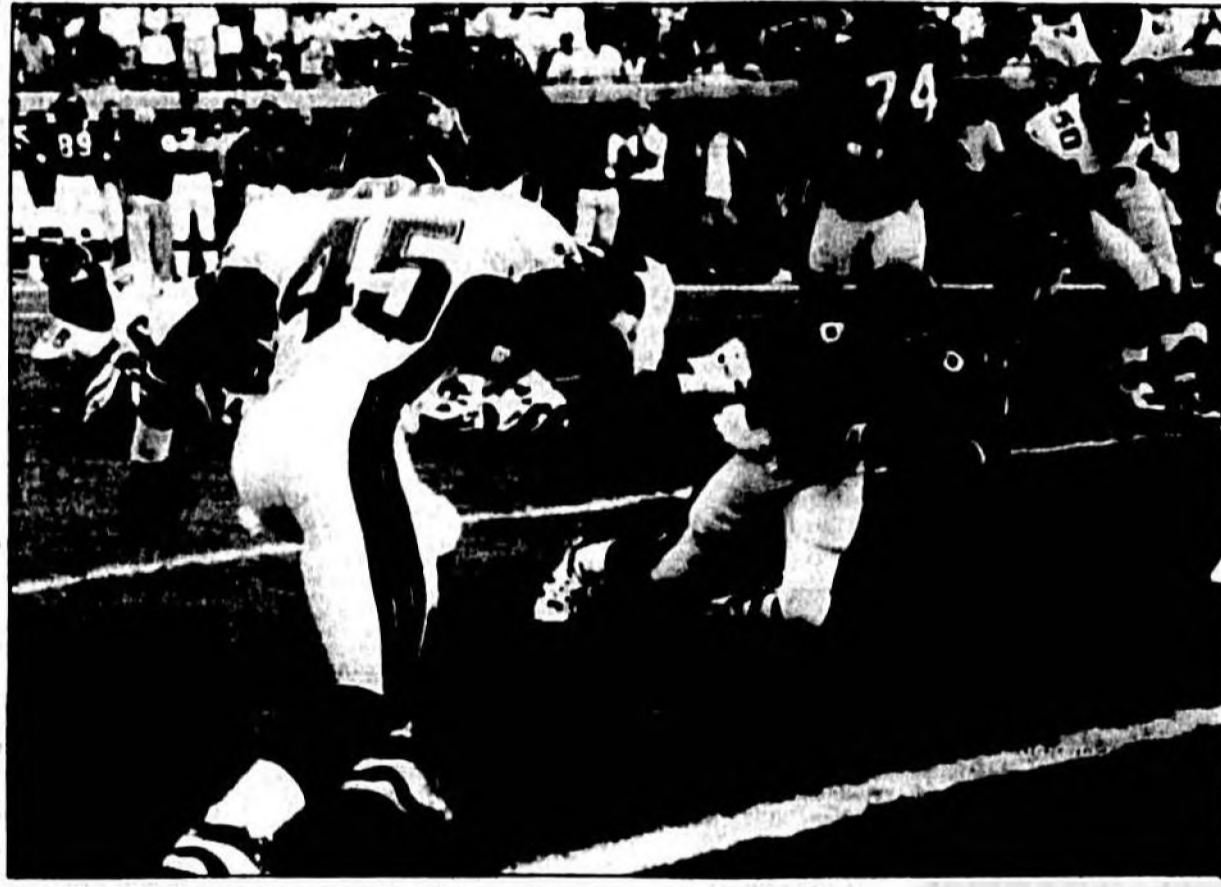

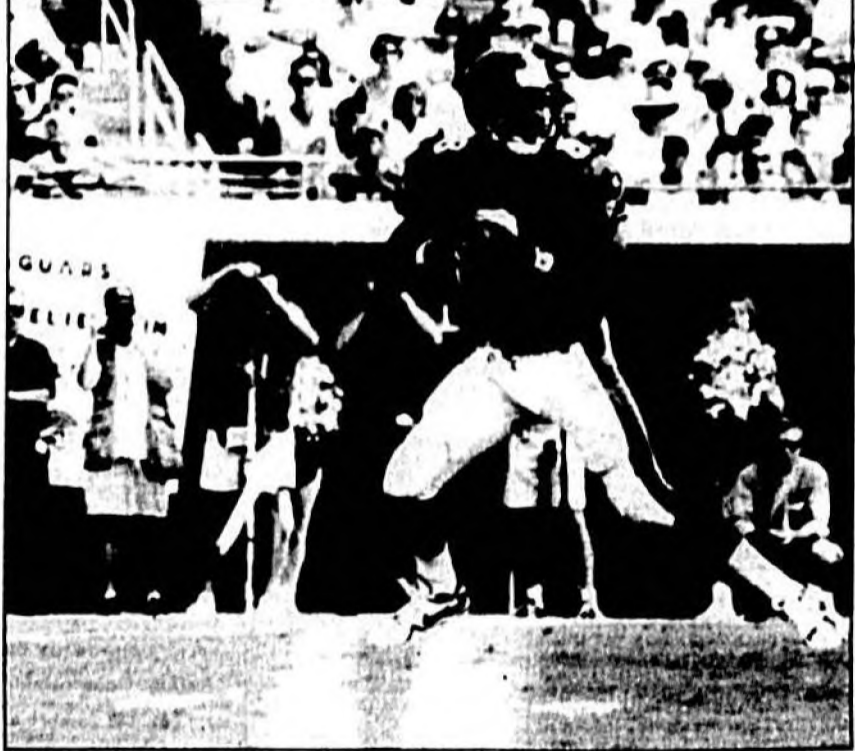

Jaguars add to Blake's woes

Jeff Blake just wanted to go home.
After the Sanford native and Seminole High School legend suffered through the toughest week of his professional career, maybe of his life, the Cincinnati Bengals' quarterback left the locker room almost immediately after the Bengals' 21-13 loss to the Jacksonville Jaguars Sunday.
Normally, Blake is as affable as any player in the league, but Sunday, after being roasted on Jacksonville radio stations and hearing some of the fiercest criticism of his career, Blake quickly left the building without commenting.
According to Bengals' publicists, Blake had many friends and family members in the stands and left to see them before flying back to Cincinnati Sunday night.
Blake's problems started last Sunday night when he was driven back to his Cincinnati home by an on-duty police officer who had pulled over Blake's car. The following day, the officer resigned before an inquiry as to why he drove Blake home while on duty.
There was no sobriety test taken at the site, but the matter has been the news of the week in Cincinnati.
On the field, he and the Bengals haven't gotten untracked. Their record fell to 1-4 in the AFC Central, three games behind Jacksonville. The rough start has squashed the Bengals' high hopes they had entering the season. Last year, after hiring Bruce Coslett at the season's midway point, the Bengals were one of the hottest teams in the NFL and Blake was never happier.
Coslett coached Blake when he was an unknown backup quarter-

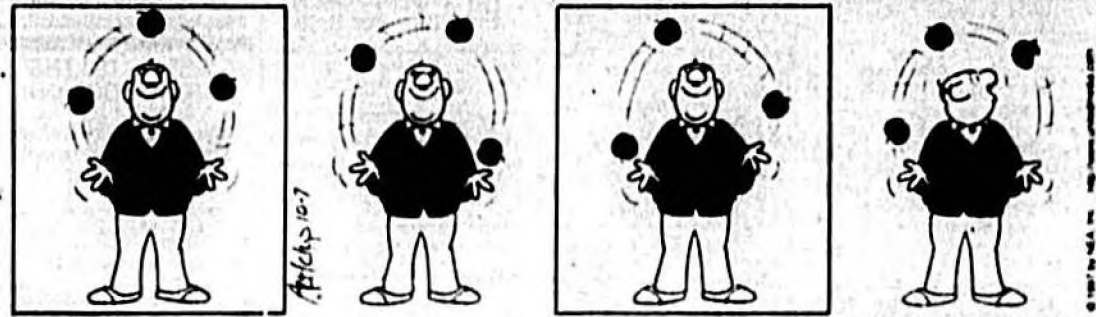

Regaining balance after a stroke

DEAR DR. GOTT: I'm 87 years old and had a stroke last year that left me weak on one side. Following this, I fell and broke my hip. Although I can get around with a cane, my balance is terrible and I am very afraid of falling again.

I am under the care of a very capable orthopedic surgeon, who confessed that he cannot help me with my poor balance. How can I regain my lost balance and confidence?

DEAR READER: With hard work and patience, you may be able to gain back some of the skills you have lost. You should be enrolled in an intense rehabilitation program, under the supervision of a physiatrist (a specialist in rehab medicine). Such programs are available through most hospitals, as well as from private non-affiliated therapy groups. You will be trained in a series of active and passive exercises to re-train your damaged muscles and nerves. In addition, the therapists will teach you techniques to help you compensate for your poor balance. There may also be many minor alterations that you can make in your home which will render your environment safer. Such alterations include better lighting, use of hand rails, avoidance of scatter rugs, relocation of your furniture, an elevator for your stairs, a change to more secure footwear, and the use of home health aides to assist you in everyday living.

As I mentioned, your recovery will take hard work and commitment under professional guidance, but the potential benefits may make all the effort worthwhile.

To give you information on your condition, I am sending you a copy of my Health Report "Stroke." Other readers who would like a copy should send \$2 plus a long, self-addressed, stamped envelope to P.O. Box 2017, Murray Hill Station, New York, NY 10158. Be sure to mention the title.

DEAR DR. GOTT: I take several kinds of pills, as well as eyedrops, for a number of medical afflictions. For the past four months, I have been greatly bothered by an extremely itchy rash that periodically appears on my face. Actually, it never goes away, but is clearly much worse from time to time. The rash looks like hives when it is really bad. My internist is stumped. What can I do?

DEAR READER: Make an appointment with a dermatologist. First, you need a diagnosis. This is the job of the skin specialist.

If my hunch is correct, you may be suffering from an allergy to one of your prescription medications. In this case, the dermatologist will have to work closely with your internist — or with an allergist — to discover which drug (or cosmetic or factor in your environment) may be causing your

rash. You should not ignore this reaction, because if you have developed an allergy to one of your drugs, the continued use of the medication could lead to serious and possibly fatal consequences, such as asthma or kidney failure. Let me know what your doctors conclude.

DEAR DR. GOTT: Please comment

on the fact that falling barometric pressure can worsen the pain of arthritis.

DEAR READER: I don't have an explanation for this phenomenon, but I believe that it is real. Some patients with arthritis — and many with old fractures of bones — experience pain and stiffness when the weather changes, especially if the barometer falls. In fact, my patients who experience this are usually more accurate than the meteorologists in predicting bad weather. When these patients complain, I batten down the hatches.

The low promotion

Woodrow Wilson, in discussing promotion, said, "Every man who takes office in Washington either grows or swells, and when I give a man an office, I watch him carefully to see whether he is swelling or growing." In bridge, we have promotion too. Which is the lowest card that can effect a trump promotion? Having typed that, I sat and thought about the problem. I have a deal in which a four does the job. Then it occurred to me a simple modification would make the three work too. And almost immediately I realized that if I don't specify a 4-4 fit, even a two would do what's necessary — as in this deal. After East opened one spade, South overcalled two hearts. Hardly ideal, with that worrisome spade holding,

but the sixth heart and two aces left him no choice. North went straight to game, of course.

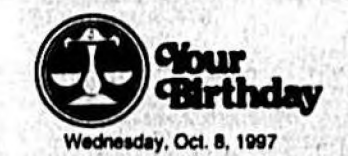
East took the first two tricks with his top spades. He could see a third trick in the diamond ace. But where was number four coming from? Left to his own resources, South would probably guess who held the heart queen because of East's opening bid. And surely West didn't have a winner. So, there was only one choice. After cashing the diamond ace, at trick four East returned a spade, which West ruffed with the heart two. When declarer overruffed with dummy's 10, East's trump holding had grown — or swelled, according to choice — into a trick: one down.

What if the opponents are in a 5-4 fit? Then I think the lowest possible trump promotion is with a three. Yet perhaps you can prove me wrong!
