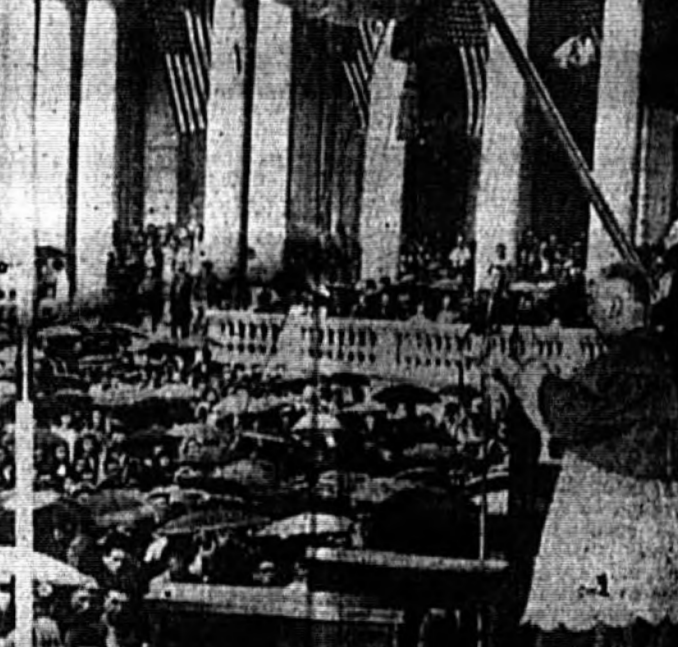
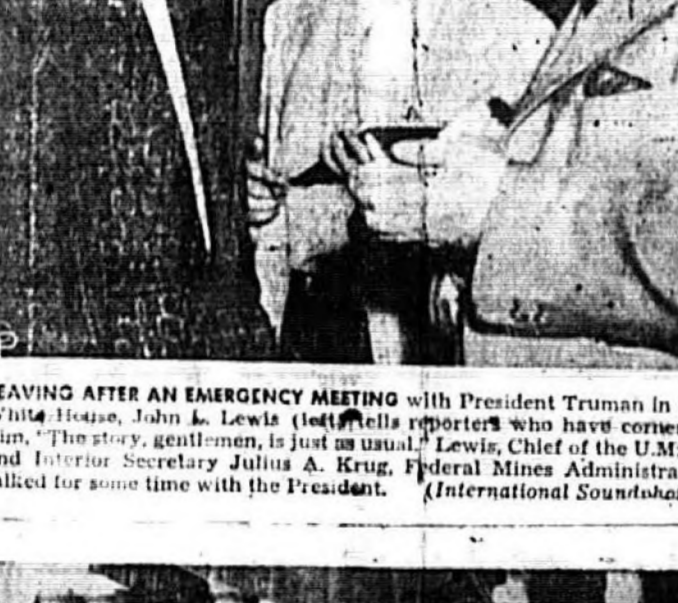

# Kettles Hurls No-Hit, No-Run Tilt

## Fed Righthander Blanks G-Men 2-0 For Seventh Consecutive Victory

HARRIS FIELD, Gainesville, June 3 — Goose Kettles yesterday afternoon knuckled his way into a select group of Florida State League hurlers when he twirled a beautiful no-hit, no-run 2 to 0 victory for Sanford over the Gainesville G-Men.

It was the 11th no-hit game in Kettles' history, the twelfth in his career. He had done everything but turning cartwheels and the helpless G-Men were unable to do a thing with the tossings of the "Goose."

The G-Men were slated to meet the G-Men in a double header but wet weather and three terrific rainstorms prohibited the playing of the dual bill. Just as the first tilt was about to get underway, the rains came. At 1:00 o'clock, just as the field was set for play, another rainstorm drenched Harris Field and most of the spectator.

At 1:30 o'clock, the sun broke through the clouds and the field, everybody got back into uniform and the game was nearly underway when another cloud burst loomed up but only a light shower prevailed for a few minutes. It was finally decided to try and get some game played and at 1:30 o'clock, hostilities began.

For the first four frames, new baseballs were being thrown in regularly and Kettles was knocking the G-Men into fits. They were unable to solve anything at all the big righthander had during the afternoon. After the new balls disappeared and wet balls were being used, Kettles used his fast ball frequently and also his curve ball sparingly. But when he got his hands on a decent sphere, the knuckler came in.

Only three G-Men got on the sacks during the contest. In the second hill, Kettles pitched for a free pass but shot on the sacks. In the sixth, Al Bryant threw into first base on a George Fultz's grounder to short. Then in the eighth, Henderson walked in other scores, but a single G-Man came within four feet of second base.

Sanford was having difficulty also with the hunting of Fultz, the able Gainesville righthander. In the sixth inning, Jessy Silverman led off with a double to right, Bryant sacrificed him to third base, and Dave Brice drove a long fly into deep right to permit Silverman to tag up and cross the plate.

The second and final Fed market rann in the seventh when Ed Levy walked and scored moments later when Byron Sharpe, who returned to the Sanford lineup yesterday after being out for some time with a knee injury, slapped a double into right-center to score the Fed manager.

Although the "Goose" was responsible for the win, he was given beautiful support by the Sanford aggregation. Brice, Silverman and Buddy Lake in the outfield gave their usual outstanding performances along with Bob Tuttle, Sharpe, Bryant and Levy in the infield. Tuttle was moved to second base yesterday since Joe Justice had left the Fed lineup. Don Zaspel's work behind the plate in handling Kettles' tosses was as usual, brilliant.

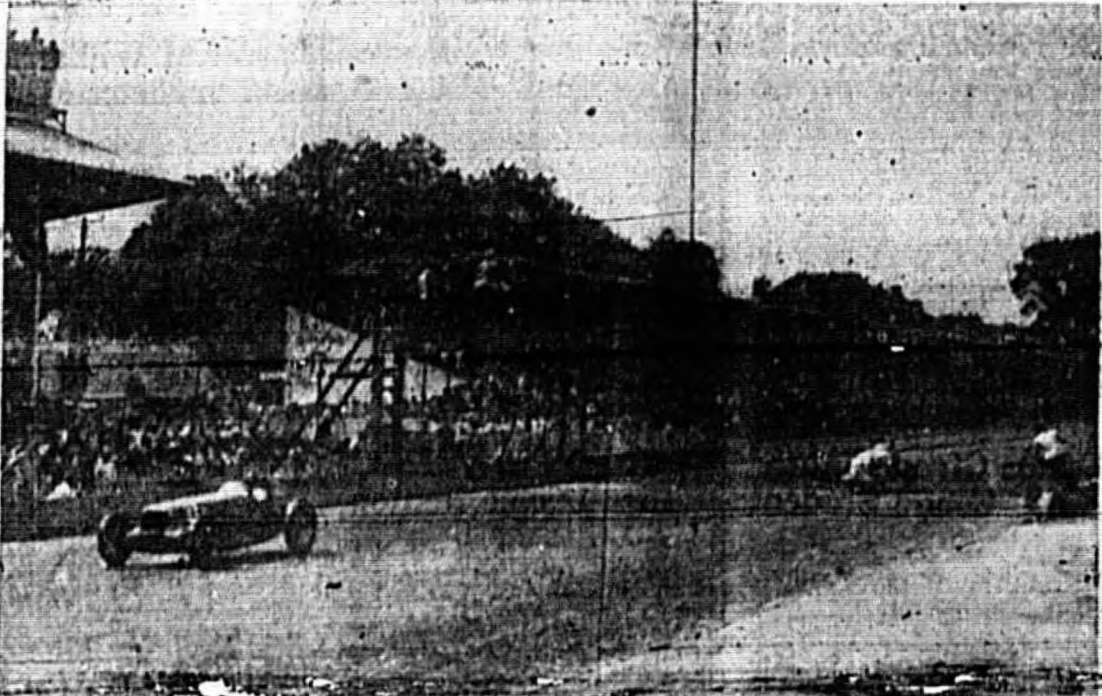

## As Robson Zooms Across Line to Win Speedway Classic

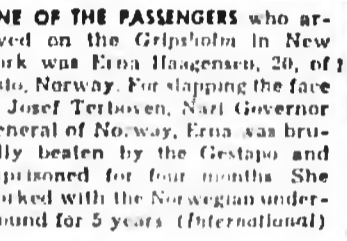
