Postmaster

When Wallace Douglas moved into his lovely home at 685 Hartley Lane last fall, he didn't dream that in less than a year he would be the first postmaster in the little community he had chosen for his retirement year.

Yet here he is, the clerk in charge of the newly opened Deltona Post Office. Douglas, with his charming wife, retired to Deltona last year after serving 83 years in the post office department in various clerical and official positions.
