



County Holds Off Approving Park Bills

reported to the BCC yesterday that the additional bills had been received by Neiswender's office for approval. Neiswender said hat he and the Commission chairman must approve the sayments and then the bills are returned to the Central Florida Zoological Society. The society then submits the bills to the society's escrow agent which pays the bills out of the escrow account.

However, the \$10,000 bills arrive at a time when county and society officials are at a standoff on the development of the more than 80 acres of parklands, because of county concern over the spending of federal grant money. Meanwhile, the new zoo off U.S. 17-92, is scheduled to open

Friday. The conflict between the county and society does not involve the development of the 31-acre zoo. In order for the society to receive \$100,000 in federal funds, the county has had to act as a channeling agent for the money. According to Neiswender, this factor leaves the responsibility of the final development on the shoulders of the county.

Neiswender reported to the BCC last week that \$186,000 of a total \$200,000 had been spent on the project. He said today that the \$10,000 "apparently is over and above the \$186,000 the Society already has expended." If the additional bills are over the \$186,000 and Neiswender

says he "assumed it is, it means the \$200,000 is just about gone." Neiswender said he was trying to contact Al Rozon, executive director of the society today to find out more information on the \$10,000 worth of bills. The Herald was unable to contact Rozon. County officials want to wind up the development of the federal state requirements of the grant in order that federal officials may close out the grant on Dec. 31. The BCC last week requested the society to halt spending any of the reportedly remaining \$14,000 of the \$200,000 until the project could be

Democrats Unable To Gather Votes

The big gains scored by Democrats in last fall's congressional elections raised the fear that a "veto-proof" Congress might endanger the traditional balance of power between the legislative and executive branches of the government. Six months of experience with the 94th Congress has dispelled that fear while at the same time raising a new one.

The Democrats repeatedly have failed to translate their two to one congressional majority into enough votes to override vetoes of legislation which veers too far from what President Ford PowerThreat regards as a responsible course on major economic and energy issues. This should give Mr. Ford some satisfaction. On the other hand, neither the President nor the American people can find much Revisited comfort in signs that the lack of discipline and cohesion within the majority party will make the 94th Congress action-proof — plaguing the nation with a "do-nothing" legislative body at a time when time that the nuclear threat is causing more there is so much to be done.

It now appears that a \$1.35 billion housing bill is the next candidate for a veto. So many Democrats share Mr. Ford's lack of enthusiasm for it because it goes overboard with costly subsidies that the veto probably would be sustained. While this would be a victory for the cause of prudent budgeting, it raises the question of whether Congress can find the will and the way to pass a less spendthrift housing bill which might fill a national need and which Mr. Ford could sign.

The record is discouraging. Disagreeing with Mr. Ford's approach to the energy crisis, Congress has been unable to agree on an approach bearing its own stamp. Faced with Mr. Ford's veto of a dam may be about to break. And the pressure is strip mining bill late last year, the new Congress ignored the President's objections and passed an almost identical one. The inevitable veto was sustained, leaving a vacuum in this area of energy policy. Veto confrontations can only be constructive if they lead to compromise on issues that increasingly profitable business for those

Beat 1 egg with 1/2 teaspoon salt; mix in the potatoes and cheese. Beat remaining egg and mix with beef, crumbs, onion, milk, catchup, mustard, herbs, pepper and 14 teaspoons salt. In a shallow baking pan, shape half the meat mixture into a 7 by 4 inch rectangle. Layer half the potato mixture over the meat, packing it down lightly. Make a second layer of the meat and top with remaining potatoes. Drizzle top with outter. Bake in a preheated 350degree oven 1 hour. Cut into thick slices to serve. Makes 6
