# Mitchell Testifies

## Nixon Boom Bombs Conspirators

WASHINGTON (AP) — John N. Mitchell said today President Nixon has been "lowering the boom" on Watergate participants since April, doing exactly what he should have done.

Sen. Daniel K. Inouye, D-Hawaii, said he didn't see much evidence the boom had been lowered on anyone except fired White House counsel John W. Dean III.

Mitchell had testified earlier that he sought to shield Nixon from word of Watergate involvement and other wrongdoing for fear the

President would take strong action and damage his own re-election campaign.

Inouye asked what strong action Nixon took after he did find out.

"I think he has done so by the appointment of a special prosecutor, removing the people from the White House that were involved in the activities," Mitchell said.

Inouye said that except in the case of Dean, fired on April 30, Nixon did not appear to have reacted strongly.

White House aides H. R. Haldeman and John

D. Ehrlichman resigned from Nixon's staff the same day, but Inouye noted that the President had said he regretted that and considered them fine public servants.

"Is this lowering the boom?" Inouye asked.

"No," said Mitchell, "but it shows a streak in the President of warmth and kindness that most people haven't attributed to him before."

Mitchell implied that the resignations of Haldeman and Ehrlichman were less voluntary than they had been made to appear in the White House announcement.

"It's my opinion, senator, that particularly during the month of April and the succeeding intervening period of time, he has done exactly what he should have done in lowering the boom by removing the people from the White House and by appointing the special prosecutor," Mitchell told the Senate's televised Watergate hearing.

Inouye said it was intense pressure from Congress that led to the appointment of special prosecutor Archibald Cox. But Mitchell said that was Nixon's action.

### \$1.4 Million Suit Hits 'Narc' Team

EDWARDSVILLE, Ill. (AP) — An Edwardsville salesman has filed a \$1.4-million suit charging federal drug agents illegally raided his home and jailed him for 77 hours.

John Meiners, 27, claims agents ransacked his home without warrants. He said they knocked a hole in his living room wall, broke the front door and a window, drank his beer and stole a stereo.

The allegations were contained in a three-count complaint filed Wednesday in U.S. District Court in Springfield.

The pre-dawn raid was carried out April 21 by agents of the Drug Abuse Law Enforcement unit based in St. Louis, Meiners said.

Meiners said that at one point an agent held a gun to his head, and some agents fired weapons outside his house.

Meiners claims in the suit that his civil rights were violated.

In addition to the \$1.4 million in damages, he also asked the court to direct his name be expunged from all federal and state arrest records made during the raid.

Two couples in Collinsville have also filed suits as the result of raids by federal agents. Mr. and Mrs. Herbert Gigolotto are seeking \$1 million in damages and Mr. and Mrs. Donald Askew \$100,000.

Meiners decided to file suit when he began to feel the Justice Department was dragging its feet in investigating the raids, his attorney said.

## CALNO Wooing County

WINTER SPRINGS — The state and the federal governments have been "under the delusion" that the Seminole County Commission is a part of CALNO, planner Al Lewis said Wednesday night at a meeting of the organization.

"And the fact that the county is not an official member is a problem in terms of programs," Lewis said, arguing that the county be persuaded to join. "It is important to CALNO and the county," Lewis said.

Winter Springs Mayor Granville Brown said all the cities of Seminole and the county governing body have been invited. "They are all sitting back waiting for us to fall on our faces," Brown said. "The county should assert dissent. I would assume they would dissent, but the best way to overcome the difficulty," Lewis said, "is to make the county a part of the organization."

Lewis, during a brief presentation, displayed a complex color-coded zoning guide map and said the most drastic zoning changes will be recommended for Longwood, which permits relatively high density development.

In other business, Brown recommended consideration be given to hiring an administrator at a salary of \$6,000 to \$10,000 annually to "keep on top of federal programs."

Councilman Dan Dorfman, Altamonte Springs, agreed.

Casselberry Mayor Bill Grier, however, balked at the proposal, pointing out Casselberry has already retained the services of a consulting firm for this type work.

He also said he was not going to obligate his city without discussion and concurrence of the Casselberry city council.

Mayor Eugene Jacques of Longwood questioned the constitutionality of the new state law requiring notice to adjacent property owners before territory is annexed and rezoned. Brown suggested a court case might be filed to test the law. "We may just do that," Jacques said.

### 8,000 Gallons Gas Feeding Black Market

More than 8,000 gallons of gasoline taken from service stations in Seminole and Brevard Counties nearly two weeks ago was apparently sold on the black market in Central Florida, according to Seminole County Sheriff's authorities.

News of the thefts wasn't released to the news media until today, authorities said because they were staking out service stations in the county in an effort to catch the thieves.

Detective Jerry Capshaw said a tanker was used July 2 to steal 3,400 gallons of gasoline from the Mobile station, located at the corner of Howell Branch and Lake Howell Roads near Casselberry.

Later that night, the same tanker apparently pumped approximately 3,000 gallons from an underground storage tank at an Exxon station on U.S. 1 in Titusville.

Wholesale value of the stolen gasoline, a mixture of regular and high test, was estimated at over \$3,000.

Security personnel from both oil companies are working in the investigation, and, according to Capshaw, this appears to be the first theft reported in the state where the gasoline was pumped from tanks at the service stations.

The majority of thefts have involved the hijacking of tankers on route to service stations.

It was the first time since the current gasoline shortage that Exxon has suffered a loss of a quantity of gasoline, company officials told authorities.

Tanks are usually left unlocked, due to late-hour deliveries by tankers, which fill them while the stations are closed.

Capshaw said his investigation indicates the gasoline is being bootlegged to stations over a multi-county area.

### Countywide Aid Number Now Ready

Seminole County's new \$150,000 law enforcement communications center is scheduled to open Aug. 1 with one telephone number citizens can call countywide for help.

Sheriff John Polk said Wednesday initial staffing of the center in the location at Sanford will be by his department and Sanford Police.

Dispatchers, using the equipment funded by federal grant, will be able to route emergency calls from citizens anywhere in the county who call 804-4111.

# Food Output May Leap

WASHINGTON (AP) — A report Tuesday by the Agriculture Department predicting farmers will harvest more corn and soybeans this year is raising hopes in the Nixon administration that the rise in food prices can be slowed.

No one says that grocery prices will go down soon, but the prospects of larger crops used to turn out meat, milk and poultry could mean a more gradual rise.

Larger crops also suggest that the United States may be able to let up in a few months on rationing soybeans and other protein feedstuff to foreign buyers.

Export restrictions were put on those products recently by the administration to assure enough for American livestock and poultry producers until new crops come in.

Soaring export demand for wheat, corn and soybeans has helped boost feed costs here at home and has been mentioned as an important factor in retail food price increases.

High feed prices are being blamed for the cutback by farmers on breeding stock for hogs and chickens, meaning that production of pork and poultry will be reduced soon.

Processors and farmers also have blamed the Nixon price freeze for predicted shortages in some food supplies.

Without substantial increases in grain and oilseed production this year, officials believe that American consumers would be headed for serious supermarket shortages by next winter and even sharper cutbacks in export shipments to foreign buyers.

The Agriculture Department says, however, that farmers fought off severe weather last spring and now plan to have 6 per cent more acres of corn and 24 per cent more soybeans for harvest than in 1972.

"This was a day that the optimist came out on top," Don Paarlberg, USDA director of economics, said Tuesday. "If there ever was a need for an abundant crop, this was it."

The report said that record crops of corn and soybeans are likely this year if favorable weather continues. A record wheat crop, 13 per cent larger than 1972, already is being harvested.

Corn production could rise to nearly 5.9 billion bushels, a little less than Nixon planners had hoped.

## Dancer's Batik Art Pays Off

NEW YORK (NEA) — Most women in Ceylon, Sri Lanka, now the official name of the jewel-like island known as the Pearl of the Indian Ocean — are content to stay at home upholding the traditions of one of the world's ancient cultures. But for Sharmalee Edirisinghe, a young lady descended from Ceylon's oldest aristocratic family, an international career comes first despite the pressures that result from breaking age-old customs.

Sharmalee, a vivacious 27, has not one successful career but two. Much of her busy life is spent as the lead female dancer of the Ceylon National Dance Company, a role which takes her away from her island home to far-reaching corners of the globe. She is the first woman of her country's upper class ever to dance professionally.

In addition to performing the classic Ceylonese festival dances, this forward thinking far-Easterner is in the process of establishing her own import business with the hopes of introducing another Ceylonese art form to the United States. An expert in the age-old craft of batik she produces original fabrics for dresses, along with coffans, shirts, blouses, skirts, scarves and umbrellas dyed and styled from her own designs.

"Batik was just a hobby for me at first — something I did to keep me busy between performances when I was traveling," she explained. "But I soon found that there is a real desire on the part of Americans to own unusual one-of-a-kind designs that are not readily available here."

A proficient artist, Sharmalee spent a year studying batik techniques at the Art Institute in Ceylon. She first incorporated her hand-dyed fabrics into fashion designs when she began to create new costumes for the women dancers in the dance group. Now she teaches the intricate dyeing process to her own students in Denver where she lives when she isn't performing or supervising a staff of native craftsmen who execute her designs in Ceylon. Her work has been exhibited in Paris, Rome, Manila, Tokyo and in several U. S. cities.

The enthusiasm of Westerners for Sharmalee's batiks is much the same reaction as that of tourists who visit her native island paradise. In fact, many of her designs are adapted from the motifs found on the walls of old temples.

Sharmalee, like an increasing number of her country women, is as comfortable in a sweater and jeans as she is in her native saris. But when the sari is still most popular in Ceylon, the draped skirts worn over American body stockings are, according to this designer, as common in Colombo, the country capital, as is the caftan in the United States.

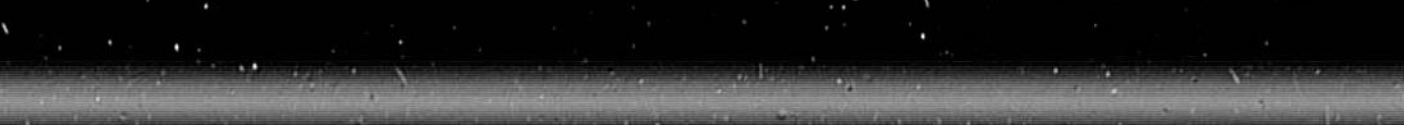

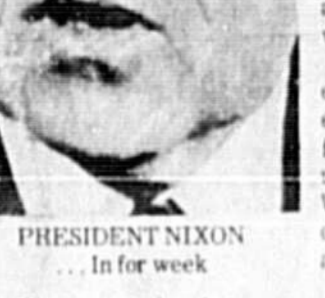
