Bush appoints Tanner to handle Wood case

SANFORD — Citing a possible conflict of interest, the investigation into battery charges against Circuit Judge Leonard Wood will be handled by Volusia County State Attorney John Tanner.

The Seminole County Sheriff's Office forwarded a written complaint against Wood after investigating a July 14 incident involving his wife Julie, who later made a trip to the hospital for examination of bruises and cuts on her face. Wood denies hitting his wife who has not filed written charges against him.

Gov. Jeb Bush reassigned the case at the request of Seminole County State Attorney Norm Wolfinger. Wolfinger said because prosecutors from his office regularly appear before Wood, he requested the case be transferred.

Fur flies over failed fund-raiser

Humane Society may have lost \$150,000 on failed concert

SANFORD — A risky gamble on a two-day "Pet Rocks" concert in April may have left the Seminole County Humane Society as much as \$150,000 in debt.

Fallout from the failed fund-raiser has left one board member calling for resignations and the Society's executive director reluctant to divulge just how much the organization lost.

Attorney Steve Mason, a member of the Society's board of directors for the past seven years, said his efforts to get an accurate accounting of expenses and

income from the April 10 and 11 concert at Seminole Greyhound Park have been stonewalled.

"The time for making excuses is past," said Mason. "It's time to answer some questions. The Humane Society's leadership should be responsible. This arrogance is a dangerous thing. The Society is a wonderful organization that does tremendous good. Now it's time for us to do some house cleaning and move

forward."

The Society's executive director, Jeff Cashatt, says Mason is a minority voice and was against the concert fund-raiser from the beginning.

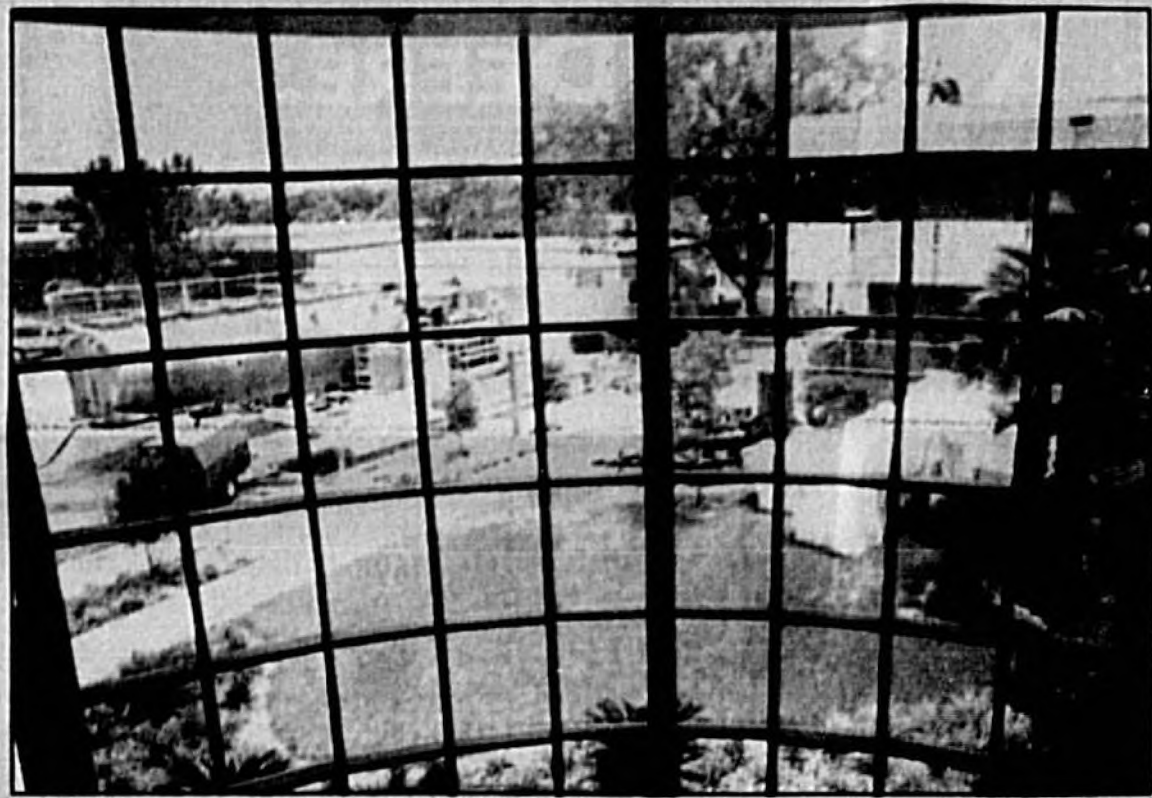
"It was a first time effort for us and we were disappointed in the outcome," said Cashatt of the rock-country double header. "We were expecting to make a substantial profit. It's time for us to move on and try something else."

Cashatt and Mason's disagreement over fund raising strategies dates back to the summer of 1998 when the concert fund raiser was first suggested. The majority of the board voted to enter into a contractual agreement with Forbidden Records, an Orlando-based promotions company to handle talent booking, advertising and promotion of the event.

At that time Mason was the lone dissenting vote. He repeatedly sent memos to other board members and Cashatt with pointed questions and concerns about whether the Humane Society should have become involved in such a risky venture, and whether the Society

Longwood police nab sexual offender

Law enforcement officials frustrated by registration loopholes

SANFORD — Loopholes in Florida state law regulating the movement and registration of sexual offenders and predators continue to frustrate municipal police agencies. The latest incident took place this week in Longwood.

Jeffrey Kevin Prescott, 37, was

arrested Tuesday by Longwood police on charges of lewd and lascivious conduct in front of two children. According to police reports Prescott, who moved to Longwood from Orange County sometime within the last three to six months, exposed himself to two neighborhood children while they were swimming in their backyard pool. Prescott was watching the girls through a fence from the adjacent property when the incident took place.

His offenses date back to 1980 and include convictions for lewd and lascivious acts in the presence of a child, burglary, attempted sexual battery on a child and resisting a police officer with vio-

lence. He was sentenced in 1991 to a total of 32 years in prison and 18 years of probation. He served only six years of that sentence, benefiting by being imprisoned prior to 1995, when state law changed, requiring inmates to serve at least 85 percent of their jail time prior to their release.

Longwood police chief Tom Jackson said the Prescott situation is a perfect example of loopholes that frustrate law enforcement officials.

"He was required to register with this police department when he moved to Longwood," said Jackson. "He had not done

County officials look to schools for park space

Cooperation by county, schools could provide community parks

SANFORD — With a shortage of neighborhood parks, Seminole County officials are looking for ways to cooperate with schools for additional space.

Seminole County is seeking have a neighborhood park within a 10 to 20 minute drive of every county resident.

The county's 10-year parks, trails and greenways draft master plan calls for elementary and middle school facilities to be accessible as neighborhood parks.

The School Board on Tuesday hosted county officials for a work session to discuss ways in which the two government entities can cooperate on projects such as the parks.

Representatives from elementary and middle schools said

that school grounds tend to already receive active use as unofficial neighborhood parks after school hours.

"What's happened is your analysis is correct," Chairman Larry Furlong said. "There is a shortage of neighborhood parks, and the schools have been drafted into becoming sub-standard neighborhood parks. We are in a sense picking up the shortage of field space. We can't do much more with our facilities than we already do."

Seminole County officials are making plans to build an interconnected system of greenways, trails and walkways. The County estimates that the total cost of the program will be \$56 million.

Included in the proposal are new 40-acre community parks in the Lake Mary-Sanford area and Oviedo, plus expansion of Lake Mills Park with the purchase of an additional eight acres.

There would be 35.6 miles of paved trails and 20.3 miles of natural trails.

The plan also would include four sites for canoe launches and a 3,000- to 5,000-square-foot nature center.

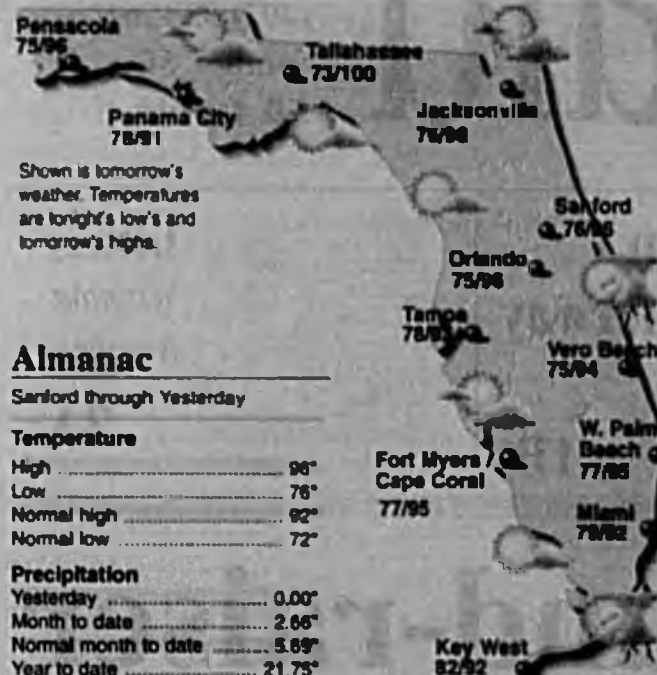

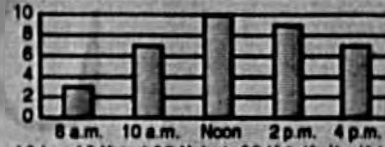

Good for Hagood - he's joined the race

The nifty automatic door at the Supervisor of Elections Office in Sanford swings open at the flick of a wrist and allows visitors ample time to step inside before it closes.

The door has had a workout the past few sultry days.

Tom Hagood came by this week to sign up for the District 3 Seminole County Commissioner's Race 2000.

Hagood is challenging incumbent Grant Maloy.

At 37, Hagood is four years older than Maloy. He also has four children to Maloy's three. No chance for Maloy to play the family card.

As a four-term Oviedo City Councilman, Hagood is a familiar name in the territory. Definitely a viable commission candidate say most political insiders.

"There's an opportunity here," Hagood said Wednesday. "I'm not coming in out of the dark. I've got name recognition. The people who have been urging me to run say they're tired of Grant Maloy voting 'no' to everything that comes up."

Recently, Maloy nixed a proposal for the county to buy 80 acres of land near Oviedo.

"There was money for it (\$1 million), and

it would have made a fine county park," Hagood said. "Now, it looks as though there's going to be a lot of little houses on that land."

Naturally, Hagood has deep interest in the southeast sector but said his candidacy is for the good of the entire county.

"I've been on the Express Way Committee, I've dealt with the sitting county commissioners," he said. "We've dealt with many similar issues."

Although a Republican, Hagood said he is not connected to either of the factions that split the Seminole Republican Party.

"I've tried not to be involved - I've been non partisan while on the city council."

Maloy said Wednesday that he felt good about running for a second-term on the commission. He said he welcomed the challenge by Hagood and that he expected there would be another candidate — possibly two more in the District 3 race.

next one (candidate) may be coming from."

If it wasn't politics, the Hagood-Maloy match-up would be a Boy Scout Jamboree — the kids next door trying to help grandma across the street, a camp out in the woods. It's more than that, of course. The winner gets a \$60,000 part-time job and a regular shot on SCTV. It means answering "Aye" or "Nay" to issues concerning the county.

Over in District 5, where Daryl McLain has been commissioner for eight years, there are three challengers in 2000. Don Nicholas and Bob West signed up early. They've been joined by ... the envelope, please — Dean Ray.

Dean Ray, the appliance man who ran for mayor and then the Sanford City Commission. Ray announced himself as District 5 commission candidate. A Democrat at that, Mr. Ray. But will he stay to election day?

The next one to swing through the door at the Supervisor of Elections Office could raise eye brows from Lake Jesup to the Altamonte Mall. Altamonte Springs Mayor Dudley Bates is being urged to challenge District 4 Commissioner Dick Van Der Weide.

Stay tuned.

had the financial wherewithal to promote the concert.

Mason also questioned the relationship of some board members with employees of Forbidden Records, and wrote, "I have been told that the total outlay that the Humane Society will be responsible for is approximately \$250,000. Considering that we have roughly \$8,000 in the bank, this would appear to be a risky undertaking."

In addition, Mason also questioned the board's wisdom in entering into a contract, since no board members had any legal expertise in the area of entertainment law. He also suggests that the board may have gambled with anticipated bequest money it expected in the future to help cover the cost of putting on the concert.

"At one point in a meeting I heard someone comment, 'We can't keep operating on dead people's money, we have to find new ways to raise funds,'" Mason said.

David Brodie, vice president of Forbidden Records says his company fully explained to the Human Society that concert promotion is a risky business.

"The very first thing we told them was that the budget for an event like this would run about \$150,000 and that with concerts you never know how many people are going to show up," Brodie said. "This is a ballsy business and Orlando is a fickle market."

Brodie said he, too, was absolutely shocked at the poor turnout. His recollection is that only 44 people showed up for the Saturday rock portion of the concert which featured artists such as Badfinger, The Fabulous Thunderbirds and others. A day later approximately 200 showed for the country portion of the concert headlined by popular artist Tracy Byrd.

"I was absolutely shocked. You can not advertise in this

Furlong and Suzie Goldman, director of leisure services for Seminole County, encouraged the schools to form proposals concerning ways the county can assist the schools in coordinating after-school activities.

School Board member Bob Goff said that he is concerned about people using school grounds after hours without adding security.

Consultant Julie Scofield of Glatting Jackson, Inc. said that neighborhood parks normally do not have security.

"Yes, but it's different when you have a \$10-15 million (school) facility in the middle of the park, with all kinds of crevices," Furlong said.

The School Board in October will discuss the master plan conducted by Glatting Jackson, Inc. for Seminole County. The plan calls for developing an inter-local agreement for public use of school facilities.

market and still draw 500-1,000 people with names like that."

Brodie said Forbidden Records acted as an agent for the Humane Society but ultimately it was the Society's event to promote.

"We had well placed media buys and began selling tickets in February at local outlets and Ticketmaster," Brodie said. "We began to track ticket sales and they were horrible. After the first day of the concert we advised the Humane Society to cancel day two. They thought the risk was worth taking."

Forbidden Records has confirmed the Society still owes the promotion company money for media buys, bounced checks, and other expenses it incurred on behalf of promoting the event. Brodie termed the sums "substantial," and said his company is getting pressure from Clear Channel Communications, owner of a number of Orlando radio stations, to pay the bills for radio advertising schedules associated with the concert promotion.

"We're going to have to deal with the financial situation between the Human Society and Clear Channel in a reasonable business manner," he said. "Where it leads, it leads."

In a letter sent by Forbidden Records to the Human Society dated May 25, 1999, the promotions company accuses the

Human Society of attempting to make Forbidden Records its "scapegoat" for the failed venture and demands payment of more than \$5,000 it claims the organization still owes it. A May 18, 1999, letter from Mason to Frizell

Management and Promotions International, based in Arizona, indicates the Human Society still owes Frizell more than \$22,000 for booking artists Wade Hayes, Tracy Byrd, and The Fabulous Thunderbirds and that a negotiation for payment is being attempted.

"I've asked repeatedly for an audit with hard data that shows just how much we lost and where the money went," said Mason. "To this date as a board member, I've received nothing."

Cashatt said the Humane Society is currently conducting an audit but that it is incomplete.

"We're waiting on substantiated documentation of some invoices from Forbidden Records," Cashatt said. "Then we'll have a better handle on a final figure."

Cashatt repeatedly denied requests for an estimated sum of losses associated with the concert.

"We're a private organization, we don't have to provide that information," he said. "We were disappointed in the outcome of the concert, we expected to make a substantial profit. It was our

first time. We'll learn from the experience and move forward."

Cashatt added that the Human Society is a responsible organization.

"We have money in the bank and we're paying our bills," he said.

Mason said he is still waiting for documentation of expenses and income to determine exactly how much was lost on the concert promotion.

Mason said the best thing for the Human Society to do at this point is to come clean with a full accounting of its losses and "clean house" of its executive management.

"Would you empty your savings account and mortgage your house and future on something you've never done before?" he questioned. "The Human Society mortgaged its future on a whim. This concert wasn't just a bomb, it was a nuclear explosion. Management of the Human Society should be held responsible for gross fiduciary irresponsibility."

that. But because laws restricting the movement and registration of convicted sexual offenders and sexual predators have changed since 1992, there's no system of checks and balances to keep track of people like him."

Jackson said because the state was not tracking Prescott, local police are often left behind the eight-ball.

"It was his requirement to notify this police agency he moved into our jurisdiction," said Jackson. "With loopholes in the law like this, a resident could have a sexual predator living on one side of them that is required to register with us and a sexual offender living on the other side who is not required to register because of the date of their conviction and legal 'grandfather-

ing."

Jackson said police agencies are required to notify residents within a specific perimeter when a registered sex offender relocates to their area.

"Some people can be rehabilitated, some people can not," said Jackson. "Why do we have 'three strikes and your out?' Here's a guy with two strikes, why should he get another chance to break the law?"

Jackson said its frustrating for police to deal with similar situations.

"We can't search out and verify addresses unless the state notifies us or the offender registers as they are required to by law."

Prescott is currently being held at the John E. Polk Correctional Facility on \$10,000 bond.

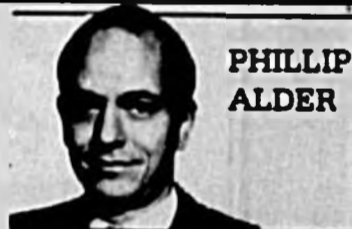

As it was, Billy Pollack (West) led the heart eight, second-highest from a weak suit. After capturing Drew Casen's (East's) queen with his ace, declarer ran the club 10 to East's jack. Casen returned his remaining heart, declarer being allowed to win with his nine, which strongly suggested that West didn't have the club queen.

For the defenders to establish and cash two heart tricks, West needs two entries. Yet it doesn't look as though he has them, does it? Well, watch!

Declarer led the club nine to dummy's king and called for a diamond. Casen found a great play when he put

in the jack. Declarer covered with the queen, and Pollack won with the king. Then, on Pollack's heart return, Casen discarded his diamond ace! This established declarer's 10, but it was only his eighth trick; if he continued the suit, West would win the third round with his nine and cash those heart tricks.

One down? No! Declarer Gautam Nandi, from Woburn, Mass., led a spade to dummy's king, then called for the spade jack, ducking when East covered with the queen. Back came a spade to South's ace. Nandi cashed the diamond 10, then exited with his last spade, endplaying East. Casen had to lead away from the Q-5 of clubs into dummy's A-8. Brilliant!

ASK DR. GOTT

Coumadin can cause bruising

DEAR DR. GOTT: Since having had open-heart surgery and receiving an artificial aortic valve three years ago, my father has been taking Coumadin. His health is good but he bruises easily. Is this normal?

DEAR READER: Yes, it is. By interfering with the body's natural coagulation system, Coumadin prevents the development of clots on the artificial valve. Such clots, if present, could be carried to the brain and cause a stroke. For this reason, Coumadin is universally prescribed for patients who have had certain types of cardiac and vascular surgery.

The drug is safe, as long as a periodic blood test (the prothrombin time) shows that the medicine is in a proper therapeutic range. The ideal level of Coumadin causes the blood to clot in about twice the time that normal blood would; that is, the clotting time is substantially prolonged. Thus, patients on Coumadin often have a tendency to bruise easily. Warning signs of over-treatment include nosebleeds, bleeding gums or blood in the urine. Most authorities recommend that patients taking Coumadin have prothrombin determinations every

four to six weeks.

DEAR DR. GOTT: On a recent blood test, I was found to have an elevated glycohemoglobin level — about three times the norm — yet no diagnosis or treatment was given. What could cause this?

DEAR READER: Glycohemoglobin is a molecule formed by the combination of blood sugar and hemoglobin, the red pigment in blood cells. It reflects, in a general way, the average sugar level in your system for the past several weeks. Thus, a high level indicates excess blood sugar — that is, diabetes.

Like any laboratory test, glycohemoglobin shows biological variation: false positives and negatives. In addition, certain drugs can interfere with normal laboratory values by disrupting the chemical analysis performed in test tubes.

I am tempted to conclude that you have diabetes, but I suggest that you address the issue with your doctor. By questioning and examining you, your doctor will be able to confirm my suspicion. As a general rule, it's prudent to avoid placing too much emphasis

on a single abnormal laboratory test without correlating it with other factors relating to your state of health; For one thing, you should probably have another glycohemoglobin determination made, in conjunction with a fasting blood sugar and, perhaps, a glucose tolerance test. I predict that they will be abnormal, too, establishing that you do have diabetes, a disease that should be immediately addressed with diet, and perhaps medication.

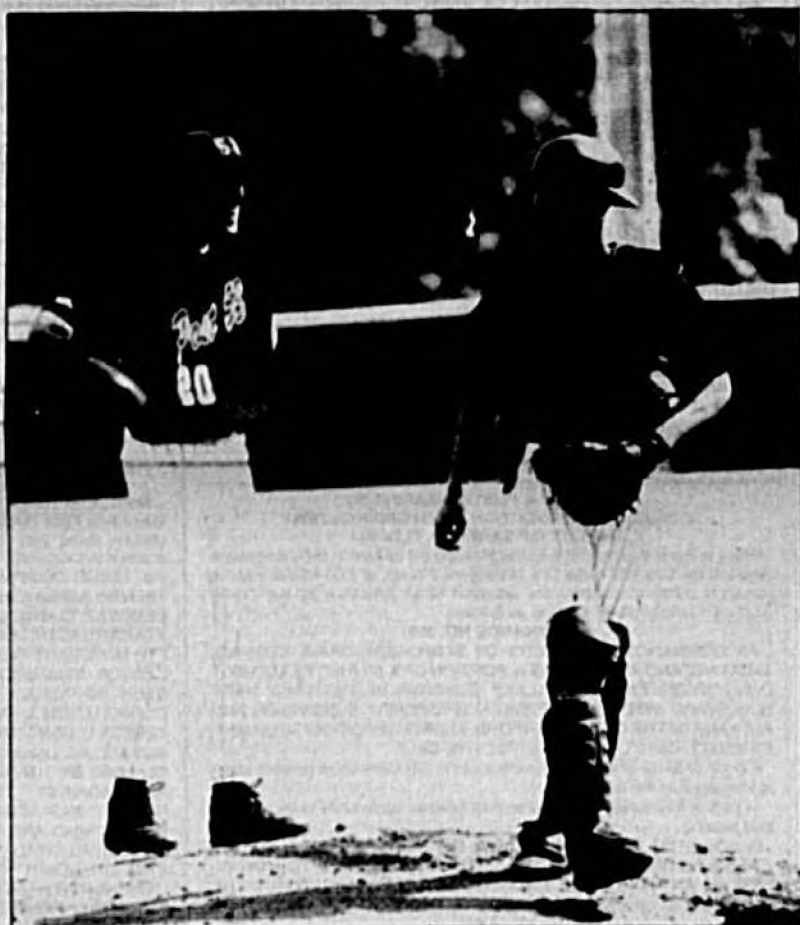
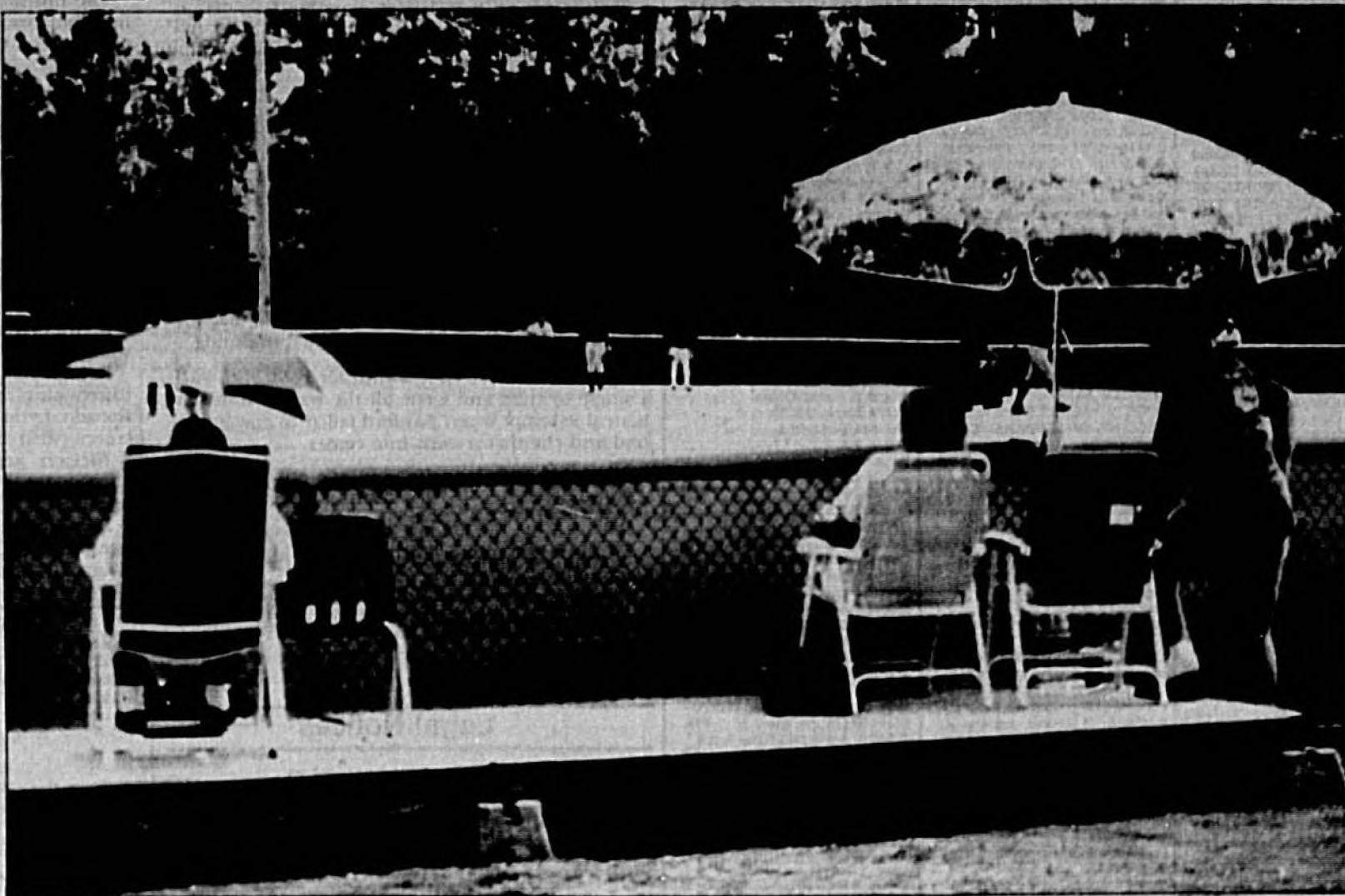
