The UNO Security Council convened in New York City resterday in an atmosphere considerably relieved of the tension which last week marked predictions for the gathering. Instead of being presented with a "fait accompli" on the troubled Iranian situation, the Council finds Russia promising to have all her troops out of Iran within five or

Friends of the UNO can hardly fail to look upon these latest Russian moves as most encouraging for the future success of this great peace organization, for it must be admitted that Russian intransigence in the current crisis, if not actually endangering the peace of the world, could hardly have been expected to do less than wreck the UNO.

And yet perhaps even more important than avoiding an open break with Russia is to keep from being duped For the UNO to appear before the world as too weak to deal with a crisis involving a major power, while bad enough, is forgivable on the grounds of infancy, but to be oo dumb to recognize the rape of a country when it occurs right before their eyes is inexcusable.

We would not like to see the UNO repeat the mistakes of the great powers during the 1930s when they saw Japan invade China in open warfare and called it a "peaceful penetration", and sat idly behind the "non intervention policy" with regard to Spain in which the only countries which did not intervene were Great Britain and the United

It is quite possible that Russia is preparing to throw her support behind the UNO for the continued peace of the world. Or it is possible that she is planning to lay low dur-ing the Security Council meetings with the intention of resuming her bullying tactics at a later date. We sincerely hope it is not the latter.


