Nixon Workers Rigged Mining Poll

mittee mailed in more than a third of the favorable response recorded in a local television poll last year of reaction to the mining of North Vietnamese waters, a

DeVan L. Shumway, spokesman for the Committee for the Re-election of the President, said he didn't regard it as rigging the poll because "we felt the Democrats would do the same thing."

That type of voluntary poll is the most stackable thing," he said. "When you're involved in an election, you do what you can. We assumed the other side would do the same thing." The final result of the poll, as announced by

Metromedia station WTTG, was 5,157 agreeing with Nixon's decision to mine Haipong harbor and 1,158 disagreeing. When WTTG reported the results May 15, it said that it had received several thousand postcards that were of a suspicious nature because they apparantly had been typed on the same typewriters. Shumway said "about 2,000 ballots and responses" were mailed by committee workers. In other Watergate developments:

-Vice President Spiro T. Agnew told a news conference, "I want to make it very clear that I have full confidence in the integrity of President Nixon and in his determination and ability to resolve the Watergate matter to the full satisfaction of the American people."

There have been published reports quoting unnamed associates and friends of Agnew as saying he was upset over the break-in and bugging at the Democratic national headquarters in the Watergate and felt the President had done too little to uncover




The grandmother of two said she hasn't had any close calls while diving although she did spot sharks while diving off Grand Cayman.



Castro 'Liberates' Cuban Women

MIAMI- Women in Communist Cuba may never have heard of Women's Lib. Nevertheless, they are "enjoying" a "liberation" all their own

The latest move regarding the fair sex adapted by Premier Fidel Castro's regime has been the incorportation of women into the Cuban merchant marine. Havana Radio announced that specially selected women would be included in the crews of tow merchant ships. The radio said the women will serve as "stewards,

pursers and majordomos. "Those who demonstrate better aptitudes and physical conditions," the radio stated, "can aspire to become officers and in the future even to command vessels." The radio reported that one Orquidea Pino is already

serving as a harbor pilot in Havana. Almost since the Castro regime took over women have had to share in full responsibilities with men in "revolutionary" tasks. Thus the large Cuban militia force includes a significant portion of militia women.

The women wear uniforms and carry weapons. They train and march and stand guard duty, as the men do. Women serve on the Committees for Defense to the Revolution, the neighborhood snoop groups. They also serve in D.G.I., the Cuban intelligence service, and one who worked for D.G.I. in the United States later wrote a book about her experiences.

Women have not been excluded from one of the hardest physical tasks of the revolution, cutting sugarcane. Each year a considerable portion of the population is mobilized and sent into the fields to cut cane. Women are out there with the men, perspiring under the hot sun and swinging their machettes at the cane stalks

During the days of the 1956-1958 Cuban revolution, women played important roles, both with the guerrillas in the hills and as part of the clandestine movements in the cities. A number of female rebels were captured, tortured and killed by the police.

Rebel women served as couriers but also set bombs and spread propaganda. When top male rebels had to move through a city they were often accompanied by women because couples are less suspect to police than are solitary

Questions Bubble Over Alaska Oil

Alaska's oil-rich North Slope is Loing to be tapped. The question is not so much when but how. That is, should the oil be piped across Alaska to the loast, as the oil companies want, or should it be transported wholly through pipelines across Alaska and Canada to the Midwest? The answer will be up to Congress, and the forces on

both sides are gearing up their arguments. Not surprisingly, a number of midwestern senators and representatives favor the Canada route. What is surprising is that numerous environmentalists do, too. It is almost as if Canada did not have an environment to be concerned about, or a sovereign government that might have a say in the matter

Points in favor of the Canada line include the facts that (1) it would avoid areas of high earthquake hazard, (2) would avoid a marine leg. (3) would interfere less with caribou migrations and (4) might be combined with a gas line in a single corridor. Also, it's argued that the Midwest needs oil more than the West Coast and that much of the oil delivered to the

West Coast would only end up being shipped overseas probably to Japan. The administration, however, through Secretary of the Interior Rogers C. B. Morton, has advised Congress that

a trans-Alaska pipeline would best serve U.S. interests and that a Canadian route is "not desirable." The Alaskan and Canadian routes are equal in terms of their effect on the land and on wildlife, says Morton, but any pipeline through Canada would involve more unavoidable environmental damage because it would be about

four times as long. "It would affect more wilderness, disrupt more wildlife habitat, cross almost twice as much permafrost and necessitate use of three or four times as much gravel that has to be dug from the earth and it would obviously use about four times as much land." Moreover, he says, discussions that have been held with

Canadian officials have made it clear that there are certain conditions the government of Canada would impose on any pipeline through Canada. These are: (1) a majority of the equity interest in the

line would have to be Canadian, (2) the management would have to be Canadian, (3) a major portion (at least 50 per cent) of the capacity of the line would have to be reserved for the transportation of Canadian-owned oil to Canadian markets and (4) at all times preference would be given to Canadian-owned and controlled groups during the construction of the project and in supplying materials

New Betting Action

The month of April this year may prove to be a good month for those with gambling blood in Central Florida, For on April 27th harness racing starts at the Seminole Turf Club. Those wagering "sport fans" who have been racking their brains trying to beat jai-alai and the greyhounds this year should find that there is an easier way.

Horses combine not only the thrill, action and monetary rewards that the others do, but also gives an intelligent bettor an opportunity to gather his thoughts between races and organize his plan to "break the bank" as all bettors plan

You will notice that we mentioned the "intelligent" bettor. This is a "title" that cannot be taken for granted. Bettors for the most part can be divided into four main

Betting Types

The first is of the chance player who usually makes up about 60 per cent of average daily attendance at a parimutuel event. These people are the ones that go to the track about three or four times a month with a limited amount of money and "guard" every dollar to the extent of making 'safe'' instead of intelligent wagers. They would rather bet a avorite color, number or name then take the time to try and understand the racing form or program. These people are there for enjoyment and an evening out. They often find that an evening at the track does not cost much more than dinner and a show and can be far more enjoyable. There is nothing wrong with this kind of betting as we said it is done by the majority of the attendance. Any track would be crippled

The second bettor is the person who believes he posseses a far greater knowledge of gambling than he really does. He knows enough to occasionally break even or maybe have a winning day. But this type can never be a consistant winner because he feels he has learned all that is necessary and doesn't have the drive to continue his "gambling" education. The old proverb that says " A little knowledge is worse than no knowledge at all" fits this type exactly. The third type is the intelligent bettor. He is classified

knowledge of "gambling" which does not include believing in lady luck. He knows when to wager and when not but most important he knows how to wager, which includes the techniques, amounts and the time to bet which are almost as important as the selection itself. The last type of bettor is the compulsive gambler. This is

intelligent because he knows his limitations. He has a vast

a "sickness" which would require several columns to do it justice. This is a illness as common as alcoholism and far more costly not only in dollars but also in ruined lives.

Yes, this April should be a fine month, but not only for the first three types of bettors but also for the compulsive gamblers, because Orlando now has a chapter of Gambiers Anonymous (GA) started by an Orlando businessman this

Whether GA will have a large enrollment in Orlando is something only time will tell, but this writer knows that GA is perhaps the only hope for those stricken with this "disease." In the future this column will be designed to help change chance players into intelligent handicappers. We will not only give selections at the Seminole Turf Club, but will explain how and why these selections were reached.

In addition, different techniques of handicapping will be explained. The compulsive gambler will also be "examined." His motives, problems and how this fine organization GA may not cure but can stagnate the growth of

NEA Science Editor NEW YORK - (NEA) -At some time during the lives of one out of every four Americans a single cell will undergo a drastic and devastating change.

The alteration may be caused by chemical irritants. radiation, infectious agents or, perhaps, it may have been programmed into the individual's body from his conception. Whatever the reason, these

cells, the tiny building blocks which form every living part of the human body, become malignant, or cancerous. Savagely the cell divides into two, then four, eight and so on. Cool Weather Comfort Anglers who like to camp lect either outdoor activity during early spring. And those who don't care to camp hints from those who do. Thanks to modern camping equipment, it's possible for the early spring angler to be comfortable if the weather

isn't spring-like all the time.

Some new camping equip-ment recently tested by Mercury outboards' outdoor recreation staff seems to be suited as well to fishing as to camping. One item they rec-ommend for cold weather anglers is a propane-fueled catalytic heater. Portable and small enough to stand on the floor of a boat, it will burn for hours and help keep hands and feet warm. As a catalytic heater it has no open flame, although it's best to place the unit well away from fuel tanks. At night the heater does double duty by warming a small tent or trailer. Extra bottles of pro-pane fuel are easily carried n your boat or car. Another propane-fueled

camping item that fishermen can put to good use is a small two-burner stove, With this it's possible to have a hot meal or fresh coffee when you want, and it saves time running back to a marina or dock for lunch. Again, for safety, keep the stove away from fuel tanks. Stoves are compact and will stow out of the way in a boat.
