





General Classification Tests

One of the first things that happens to a man when I is inducted into the Army is to be confronted with the General Classification Test. Sometimes called the "I. Q." test or intelligence test, this is so important that it may determine his whole future in the Army and to a large

extent the chance he may have of winning a commission.

To some people the tests appear very hard and to others quite simple, and strangely enough the college man is as apt to run into difficulty with them as the unschooled. But regardless of how you answer the questions, the Army can tell from the test whether you are slow and accurate fast and careless, good in mechanics, poor in history, and many similar characteristics and aptitudes concerning yourself:
