



Greater Accountability And Less Expense?

Florida is being exposed to the pressures of nolitical and governmental changes to such an extent that it might be well for all to adont some

Have no doubt about it, there is a flood of information - factual and propaganda - which will be coming our way that will take some doing to digest and convert into wise citizen action. Politically there are the elections of 1970 which are coloring the actions of both the Democratic and Republican state organizations and affecting the others in lower ranks of government. In the matter of governmental changes, there

are those which are taking place as the legislative decisions taken in Tallahassee during the first general session are implemented. We suggest that as these two factors are presented by word or deed or promise, there are two questions which every voter is entitled to ask:

1. Will this increase the accountability of the elected official to his constituency?

2. Will it reduce the mounting expense of gov-

In considering the first it is obvious that under the present system of electing legislators, that accountability is almost impossible to determine. Certainly the traditional answer to complaints

from voters in a specific area or on a specific question - say the city of Sanford and the creation of a Sanford Airport Authority - that it takes the full cooperation in the entire legislative Seminole-Orange delegation (which was lacking) to do the job properly is not satisfying.

Yet it is perfectly proper. It does have the sanction of past practice. But it surely does not allow the kind of accountability which would be created should a different means of election be devised. This unsettling question of accountability, way in which a voter could decide which candidate means what he promises and would be given machinery which would make it possible for him to ren-

impinges heavily on the debatable proposition of a change in the form of our state legislature. Would unicameral create greater accountability? Change of form of the state legislature from a two-house to a one-house structure would appear to assure not only means for greater accountability but also an affirmative answer to the second ques-

tion dealing with the expense of government. But this is neither certain nor provable. What is certain and provable is that the distribution of petitions by the increasing popular young Democratic state senator Bill Gunter and the increasingly vigorous Republican Governor Claude R. Kirk, Jr., proposing a popular vote on a unicameral form on the 1970 ballot has split the GOP and has attracted

support to the Orlando senator.

With the State Republican Party officially deciding to oppose the Kirk drive for a unicameral legislature, there should be some very interesting intra-party debates to appraise. On the Democratic side, Senator Gunter's peti-

The immediate situation which will need to be watched is the progress of the governmental reorganization which was expected to not only streamline the Florida governmental machinery but re-

Total real and personal property in Seminole County is now worth \$408,745,050, S. O. Dorminey, tax assessor, reports. Dorminey told The Herald the total taxable value of both real and personal properties in the county has risen by \$17,189,138 to the all-time high of \$270,071,065.

With the increases in land value, the county will have some \$108.807 in additional revenues at the same millage as last year. Of this amount, some \$103.367 can be budgeted. Meanwhile, with the increases the School Board, if it used the same miliage as last year, would receive an additional \$222,943 of which it could budget \$211,796.

County Commission Chairman John Alexander in dicated today a millage increase may be in the offing from the county. He said departmental budgets, currently being rechecked, indexed and compiled have many increased requests. In additional, new programs will be considered by the Commission, during budget. hearings to begin next week, including juvenile detention facilities, proper program for retention of mental incompetents, food stamp or surplus commodities for low-income families and hiring of an administrative assistant to the Board of County Commissioners.


