State In Black \$21 Million

ending July 1 showed Florida with a \$21 million surplus and potential for even more leftover funds in preparing next year's budget.

Administration Department figures released today revealed that state income exceeded even last-minute revenue estimates by \$21 million for the 1972-73 fiscal year.

If the surplus holds during the year,

it would mark the second straight year

the state has had excess funds. The 1972 Legislature had a \$267 million surplus to spend.

the just-ended fiscal year could be greater or less than \$21 million. Precise calcuations will be ready within several weeks, he said.

L. L. Qualls, economist for the Senate Ways and Means Committee, said unchanged economic conditions for the rest of the year could cause income to run \$40 million to \$50 million ahead of estimates. This figure, coupled with a \$21 million carryover, would give the 1974 Legislature a surplus in the neighborhood of \$70 million, Qualls said.

Because of uncertain economic conditions the last Legislature delayed reductions. One would have expanded the property tax homestead exemption for the elderly while the other would have increased the intangibles tax

Administration Secretary L.K. Ireland Jr. said the \$21 million was about one per cent above the estimated income. Collections for the general revenue fund totaled \$1.8 billion, he

Sales tax collections accounted for \$14.2 million of the increase. Some \$1.04 billion in sales tax was taken in during the last fiscal year, about 1.4 per cent more than estimated.







Auto Makers Seeking 'Clean' Engine

Typical of the frantic search for an engine to satisfy starch-stiff government emission controls without tacking on questionable devices like the controversial catalytic converter is the one pursued by Chrysler Corp. Its president, John Riccardo, a man who cut his eyeteeth on engine development during a long career in the automotive business, talks quite frankly about the chase for an alternative to the combustion power plant.

Riccardo notes that the National Academy of Sciences has reported an uncontrolled Wankel of equivalent power emits up to three times as much carbon monoxide and five times as many hydrocarbons as an uncontrolled conventional

Like other auto makers, Chrysler has taken a long look at the Honda engine, too.

Thawing relations between the United States and the Soviet Union have stirred fears in Europe that some of the more than 300,000 American troops stationed in allied nations may be withdrawn.

And some members of Congress are indeed pressing for a reduced military force in Western Europe on the basis of the apparent easing of Cold War But the visible evidence of the

U.S. capabilities warfare combined with the acknowledged superiority of its nuclear potential offsets the Russian show of armed might in East Europe countries. Executive Privelege Still Essential

Executive privilege, Sen Sam J. Ervin said last April, "is a skeleton that has rattled around America's closet for so long that nobody is sure what it means." In the near future President Nixon and Senator Ervin

will meet to discuss the subject and to see if they can open the The term is really a shorthand expression which means that the executive branch of government has an inherent right to keep the details of its affairs from Congress and the

courts if such secrecy is clearly necessary in the exercise of the President's constitutional functions. Always a troublesome factor in congressional investigating efforts, executive privilege again is becoming an rritant as the Watergate hearings inch toward former White

House personalities who were close to the president. In recent days a Senate committee has made a formal request to the executive branch to open more of its private files. In due time Special Prosecutor Archibald Cox is likely to do so also. Even civil suits filed by private citizens are asking that the President furnish certain executive

Americans have a great repugnance over secrecy in any branch of government, and properly so. On the other hand most citizens, including members of the Senate Watergate committee, will concede that both privacy and privilege are necessary from time to time in the conduct of the government's affairs. Secrecy, for example, is vital to the grand jury investigating Watergate. It is essential to Special Prosecutor Archibald Cox as well as to the Congress as a whole which conducts many of its affairs behind closed doors. In this regard it is noteworthy that even Sen Ervin's Watergate committee has seen fit to conduct extensive private interrogation of witnesses, including Mr. Dean and

The truth is, executive privilege, although never defined, has been used in every era since George Washington first It is apparent from reading history that the initiative for defining executive privilege must rest with the branch of

government that is concerned, the President. With the initiative, of course, is a burden of justification for its use. The consensus of all statesmen since the early days of the republic has been that executive privilege cannot be legislated. Apart from introducing inflexibility into the operations of the executive branch of government, such laws would, as attorney Gen. Elliot Richardson said earlier this spring, "disturb the kind of comity that Congress and the

executive branch have arrived at over the years." The comity may not be readily apparent to those watching the Watergate hearings, but it really is present - as the forthcoming meeting between the President and Senator

to care for own family





Anderson and Williams did more shuffling in the Kansas City Royals ball park Tuesday night than most Las Vegas card dealers do in a week. And it all made for a "losing hand" for the game itself which generated about as much excitement as an Orlando Twin batting practice

The constant shuffling by Anderson and Williams, preceeded by the Kansas City fans booing of Oakland's representatives, made for what just could have been baseball's darkest hours since the 1919 Blacksox scandal.

Q. Do you have any suggestions for selecting a laundry detergent that does a good job and can save me a few pennies

A. It is difficult to compare values in detergents because you have to figure the cost per wash load. Detergents vary in their composition; some may appear to be inexpensive, but require a larger amount than a more expensive brand would require. The instruction booklet that comes with your washing machine usually recommends several brands that will give you good results. Too many homemakers make the mistake of using more detergent than is actually needed because they think a high suds level will make the clothes cleaner. However, too many suds will slow down the washing of the machine and cause problems. You can learn by experimenting with which product works best for you in your own set of conditions. A variety of factors such as brands of washing machine, water temperature and hardness, usage habits, type of clothing washed and what type of results you expect effect the homemaker's decision.

Q. Do you have any statistics on the true performance of the 1973 Mazda Rotary Engine RX-2 Sedan?

A. Consumer Reports tested the Mazda RX-2 in 1972 and rated it high. They have now tested the RX-3 and rated it much lower than the RX-2. You should read some of the recent automotive publications that have information on the different automobiles. Car and Driver has an artical entitled, "Road and Track Owner's Survey" which would be very helpful to you. Comments about the Mazda are included. Also check "Performance Data-New 1972 Passenger Cars and Motorcycles" published by Consumer Information Series, U.S. Department of Transportation.

It Took A Year, But City Hall Lost

GAINESVILLE, Fla. (AP) - After winning a year-long battle against city hall to stay in business, Emory Singletary says he will be out today selling his tomatoes, canteloupes and watermelons just like always.

"I've been selling in the same location for seven years and I wasn't going to let anybody push me out of business." Singletary said after a six-member jury found him innocent of charges of violating the city's zoning ordinance. In a trial in municipal court Wednesday, the city claimed that an ordinance passed in 1971 prohibited outdoor displays of food, except in specified locations such as shopping cen-

City attorneys said the location of Singletary's market truck, next to a gas station, was not covered and that Singletary should be closed down. But Singletary maintained the ordinance was passed just to protect big supermarkets because he undersold them.

"It's not fair to make a law just to put one man out of business so I decided to fight," he said. Singletary said the good will he had built up with thousands of customers over the years helped him win the battle.
