Though Hagerty said the Eisen-bower visit would not be called off it was clear there would be many changes. It appeared almost certain Eisenhower would use a Douglas Plant helicopter to avoid airport mobs when he arrives June 19,

The same group of demonstralors announced they were planaing an even more massive demenstration against Eisenhower by perhaps 250,000 persons.

There was no estimate of the number injured as police clubbed students with heavy truncheons and the demonstrators fought back with bembo sticks and stones, some of which damaged the helicopter, One youth was bashed in the face as he cursed Eisen-

He fied, his glasses broken and blood streaming down his face. The mob seized a policeman and beat and stomped him until he was rescued.


