Lake Mary Chamber OKs merger

LAKE MARY — It's been rumored and discussed, but now it's official,

The Greater Seminole County and the Lake Mary-Heathrow chambers of commerce are merging.

The official announcement was made during a Lake Mary Chamber Breakfast Wednesday when more than 80 percent of the Chamber's members voted to support the merger.

Eighty percent of membership approves merger with Greater Seminole County

"The breakfast was greatly attended and was very high energy," Lake Mary Chamber Executive Director Diane Parker said. "It was a positive vote, and the few who didn't vote in favor of it were worried that we didn't have all the answers.

The merger will bring together nearly 3,000 businesses in Seminole and surrounding counties.

According to Parker, the decision to merge the two chambers has been considered for more than a year. Leading up to Wednesday's vote, the Lake Mary

Chamber's board of directors and execu-

tive board voted unanimously to bring the issue before the entire membership. The Seminole chamber has also approved the merger.

The two chambers agreed Parker, who has been with the Lake Mary Chamber since April 1990, will serve as director for the See Merger, Page 7A

Tomasso may sue county because deputies won't patronize his business

SANFORD — Not a bite. Not a single bite.

That's the sad tune James Tomasso is singing today, claiming the Seminole County Sheriff's Department "boycotted" his food and beverage business at the county's Public Safety Buildings.

Tomasso said that he thought it was an "embarrassment" to the County Commission and that he was left with no alternative but to seek legal recourse. for breech of the original con-

Clouser House seeks marker

Longwood commission considers state application

LONGWOOD - The **Longwood City Commission** will consider requesting the state to place a marker on a building in Longwood's historic district in honor of one of the city's founders.

On Monday, the City

Commission will consider submitting an application to the state's Bureau of Historic Preservation to place a 12-inch marker honoring Josiah B. Clouser on the Clouser House, located at 211 W. Warren

The building currently houses the Consignment Collection.

"Anything that brings recognition for the historic district will be a positive development for the area," said Longwood Mayor Paul Lovestrand.

Clouser was a master carpenter who built several historic buildings in Longwood, including the Longwood Village Inn. He was also the city's mayor three times, and a member of


the Alderman's Town Council when the city was founded in

Clouser worked for Demen's Mill, the builder of the Orange Belt Railway which carried passengers from Lake Monroe to St. Petersburg during the late 19th Century. Clouser was the director of the Novelty Division for Demen's Mill.

In addition, Clouser was the first President of the Longwood Cemetery in 1884.

"He was just a very prominent and important person in the city's history," said John Bistline, Clouser's great-grand-

robbery. Police do not suspect more than one person is involved in the robbery, See Police, Page ??



Until the day he might see, Ernest lives his life. He cooks, he washes clothes, he keeps his apartment uncluttered and

immaculately clean. Hoffman also watches TV. He enjoys reruns of older shows - "I Love Lucy," is one of his favorites. He remembers the program and can envision exactly how Lucy and Desi

On Sunday, Hoffman had the Super Bowl game tuned in. Heheard — but did not see — the much-talked about Christopher Reeve walking advertisement. When told what was happening, Hoffman was pleased. "What a wonderful thing what a great ad," he said. "Remember, though, this isn't yet for everyone — it's for the privileged."

Millions of Americans saw a Christopher Reeve miracle on Sunday, Nuveen Investments created an inspirational moment with its \$2 million Super Bowl TV spot.

In giving his consent to the

ad, Mr. Reeve intended to give hope to those who cannot walk - that through science and technology a cure for spinal

injuries soon will be found.

At the same time, a number of those who cannot walk and their caretakers say that the ad is misleading and untruthful. It creates false hopes

Tony Tizzio, a cerebral palsy victim and human rights advocate who lives in Casselberry, said he certainly was not offended by the spot.

"It's an upstanding development - modern technology has much to offer us. I'm pleased at the effort. It's realistic, though, only if it is accessible to every one of us."

Super Bowl XXXIV was filled with possibilities for all of society. The two teams were a huge surprise. The game's MVP, Kurt Warner, was bagging groceries a few years ago and enduring life in the Arena Football League. That's reality - not Super Bowl hype.

We were thrilled and shilled all day. To be sure, there was a dot.com overkill. We'd get a little game and then some shame. ABC went too far with its shameless Regis Philbin plugs. Federal Express had a nice

Wizard of Oz ad. The Nuveen/Reeve spot was the one that mattered. Reeve was on Good Morning America the next day to talk about it.

Obviously, Christopher Reeve is going to benefit from his stature as an actor and consultant to the president on disabilities. If a cure is found for spinal cord injuries, Mr. Reeves will receive this cure. That victory — much like Kurt Warner's — will give hope for

others.

"I don't think there's much chance for me to play in the Super Bowl or even get to date the cheerleaders," Tizzio said Wednesday, "There's probably not that much chance I will walk normally, either. I foresee the day when those like me will walk, will see, will be able to do what able-bodied persons can do. It is good to be optimistic. And it's important not to wal-

low in self pity." Some of the Super Bowl ads were clever (the cat herders) or warm and fuzzy (the vet delivering a Clydesdale). But for the million or more disabled persons who saw Christopher Reeve no longer paralyzed and walking across their TV screen there was a jolt of joy and excitement. It was no ordinary commercial. No ordinary day.

In 1926 Crooms Academy was constructed and named by the Boards of Education out of appre ciation for the sacrifices of the principal and his wife. A new day came to the life of school youth of Sanford and Seminole County.

The curriculum was again enlarged to include the senior high school grades eleven and

Our librarian, Miss Pearleen Moore is a graduate in library science from North Carolina College for Negroes.


Miss Moore is assisted in this service by several of our teachers who hold some credits in library science and a group of students. This is a memorial library to the

Negroes of Sanford, Seminole County, Florida and elsewhere. The principal has definitely made it known to all persons concerned that he wishes that the general public will have access to its services and that it becomes a definite community service at least until better provisions are made by the city. Until then, we desire that the city assume some share in providing books, etc.

Out of the funds we have on hand, we are purchasing books. The principal, faculty and students do not have words sufficient to express their heartfelt thanks to members of the boards of education, our county superintendent, there are other needs - more class-norms etc. kind in the early stages of our effort, donated half the cost of the plans, the contractors and all who had something to do in making this outstanding contribution to Negro youth and the citizenry of

The groundbreaking and construction of the Crooms Memorial Library was reported in the Sanford Herald on Nov. 11, 1949 with the above pictures. According to the Herald article at the time: "Termed by William Stewart Morrison, state architect, as one of the finest library buildings in the state, the above Crooms Memorial Library, designed by Elton J. Moughton and erected by Paul Campbell, represents the furfillment of the dreams and plans for many years of Principal J. N. Crooms, veteran educator of Negro (sic) students. After he had succeeded in raising \$6000 in donations, the County School Board and Supt. T. W. Lawton came to his aid with school funds to complete the \$20,000 project on August 17, 1949. The donations are being used for books and equipment and the library is now in use. Of concrete block construction it is located near the Academy. Its 62 foot main room is designed to hold 7,000 books. Other well appointed features in the building are fluorescent lighting, sound proof ceiling, variegated tile floors, an office, rest rooms, work room and stackroom. Two large duo-therm heaters provide sufficient heat and an electric drinking fountain, a gift of 1946-47 class supplies drinking water."

Brief sketch of Crooms Academy and names of faculty members

Crooms Academy, one of the best known Negro public high schools in Florida, has the largest enrollment of any school in Seminole county. 692 pupils placed their names in its files this term. Of this number 62 have for various reasons been dropped from the list.

The type of program and interest that has for years been manifested by its faculty have been drawing features in holding the attendance to a high percentage. The percentage of attendance for the seven months this term shows these figures: elementary division 93 percent; junior high school 92 percent and senior high school 95 percent. These figures indicate that our drop outs appear as a matter of fact in the junior high school.

Great Floridians Program, which is part of the State Historic Marker Program to honor Floridians who have made significant contributions, historically or culturally.

The nominations must be approved by the municipality in which the marker will be locat-

The Central Florida Society for Historic Preservation will make a presentation to the Longwood City Commission on Monday in favor of the proposal.

Funding for the Great Floridians 2000 program, sponsored by the Department of State and the Florida League of Cities, will expire at the end of this year. It is being held in celebration of the turn of the century.

If the City Commission approves of the application, Longwood will receive notification from the state on whether the plaque will be funded by June. The plaque would then be installed within four to six weeks. said Allison Herrington, State Historic Markers Coordinator

Out of 298 applications for plaques during the program's first year, 289 have been approved. The nine nominees who were denied did not meet the state's

criteria. Herrington said. 'As long as they meet the cri-

teria, we look at each application. very senously." Herrington said. To be eligible for the program,

a nominee must be deceased and must have been a resident of Horida while making the contributions for which they are being recognized. The state also profers that nominees make contributions that are "readily recognizable" by the public

The state requires that there should be an historic building or structure, preferable at least 30. years old, that is associated with each nominee on which the plaque can be attroed


The Raiders led that game by as many as 20 points in the first half and led the entire game until DBCC took its first lead of the game with just over a minute remaining and held on to beat SCC.





Win at Bridge

A reprise from last December

The first supplementary question in my Christmas competition asked about the backward finesse. Why would one

resort to this technique when it is much worse mathematically than a simple finesse? (It requires two cards to be well placed, whereas a simple finesse needs only one in the slot t Well, this deal should answer that question The bidding is interesting. East was correct to make a "drop-dead" response of two spades. That hand could be useless in notrump, but will be worth two or three trump tricks in spades.



After South risked a three-heart overcall, North might have passed, but he decided to try for the vulnerable game bonus. West led the spade king. Declarer saw

three top losers: one spade, one heart and one diamond. So he had to avoid a club loser. But because of his opening bid. West had to have the club queen. Should South play for West to

hold only two clubs? Delaying his decision, declarer won with dummy's spade ace and played a trump to his king. West won with the ace, cashed the spade queen, and exited with his remaining trump. South won in hand, led a diamond to dummy's queen and played a diamond back to his king. West won with the ace and returned the diamond lack, which declarer ruffed. What next? Well, West had only two hearts, so he rated to have at least three clubs. Trying to drop the doubleton queen wouldn't work.

instead, declarer led the club jack from hand. When West covered with the queen, South won with dummy's king, then finessed his club eight. The backward finesse had saved the contract. Copyright2000 by NEA, Inc.

Some causes of constant cough

DEAR DR. GOTT: In it possible to choke on one's phlegm? I seem to have an excess that causes me to cough constantly. DEAR READER: Any foreign material

that enters the truches (windpipe) can cause cough and respi-***************** ratory distress. Thick

mucus will, too, because it behaves like any fluid and can cause blockage. If you have a lot of mucus, check with your doctor to discover the reason for your problem. Chronic cough is often the result of lung disorders, bronchitts, allergies or just plain postnasai drip DEAR DR. GOTT: What

Doctor to the purpose of the two Gott little ridges between my none and upper lip? DEAR READER: None

whatsoever. These ridges, like the line you can feel with your tongue along your hard palate, are the renmants of the normal closure of the fetal head long before birth. During embryonic development, each side of the haby essentially grows independently; during pregnancy, the two sides normally fuse. When this fusion falls to occur,

the baby will be born with abnormalities of the palate and lip. DEAR DR. GOTT: Does the drug Retin-A, normally prescribed for acne, help reduce the formation of facial wrinkles?

DEAR READER: Yes. Retin-A has been shown to reduce fine wrinkles, cause age spots to fade and improve the appearance of aging skin. The medicine, which is available only by prescription and should be used under medical supervision, is applied once a day as a cream or a gel and rubbed in well. Patients sometimes develop oun sensitivity or scaly rashes from Retin-A, but the medicine is generally free of side effects. DEAR DR. GOTT: I've been

diagnosed with Paget's disease. How could I have picked it up, and just what is it? I'm currently taking Didronel twice daily and Xanax before going to bed for pain. My doctor tells me not to expect relief from the pain for at least alz weeks. DEAR READER: Paget's disease of bone, a common disorder of unknown cause, affects older adults. It is characterized by areas of rapid bone

destruction and production, leading to softened, enlarged bones that may be painful and break castly. The discase usually affects spotty portions of the skull, spinal column and legs. Paget's disease is not communicable; you cannot "catch" it from someone else, nor do you get it by doing for not doing) something. It is a metabolic disorder and can exist for many years without causing symptoms. Treatment consists of drugs to retard

the rate of bone turnover and to force additional calcium into weakened bones. Didronel is such a drug, as is calcitorum, another treatment that shows promise. Several weeks must pass before the medicine begins to alleviate symptoms. You seem to be receiving appropriate therapy for your condition. Xanax, an anti-anxiety medicine, is

not a common treatment for Paget's disease. It is useful for people with extreme nervousness. Since Xanax will not control your pain, ask your doctor to prescribe one of the many analgesics now available — or try over-the-counter pain relievers such as aspirin.
