

Faulty trusses to blame for roof collapse

LAKE MARY — Preliminary reports indicate that improperly manufactured trusses were the cause of a roof collapse at the new Lake Mary Park and Facilities Building.

The roof collapsed about 2 p.m. Saturday at the Rantoul Lane facility, injury four construction workers.

The preliminary report by city architect T. Gray Frazier, president of TGF Architects of Lake Mary, found differences between the truss engineering

Truss manufacturer failed to follow designs, used poor materials

shop drawings and the existing trusses at the site.

These include changes in the metal plate connector size, and changes in the bottom chord of the scissors trusses from 2X6 to 2X4 members," the report said.

At the time of the collapse on Saturday, the trusses had been erected and attached to the masonry walls. The plywood roof decking was beginning to be installed, but not yet nailed down except for a few nails, said City Manager John Litton.

Authorities said the four construction workers were on the roof fn the 5,600square-foot building at the time of the

Two workers received hospital treatment for ankle injuries, city officials said. Litton estimated that had the collapse occurred Monday through Friday, ten construction workers might have been at

"But for the grace of God this did not happen on a Monday through Friday,"

said Lake Mary Mayor David Mealor. The site had not yet been inspected when the roof collapsed. Frazier said that the work would have been inspected this

Robberies plague Seminole, Volusia county businesses

Authorities believe many of the incidents are related

Investigators are looking into whether recent robberies that have occurred in Seminole and Volusia counties may be related.

The suspects in at least six robberies or attempted robberies in Altamonte Springs, Longwood and Deltona this week have similar descriptions. Many of the robberies have occurred along bustling roads such as State Roads 436 or 434. as well as near Interstate-4 exit ramps, authorities said.

Seven robberies or attempted robberies have taken place in Altamonte Springs since Tuesday. Three robberies occurred Wednesday night and early Thursday morning that investigators suspect may be related, because the suspects have similar descriptions.

An Olive Garden restaurant

was robbed at gun-point late Wednesday, with an estimated \$2,600 in cash and a victim's car stolen. Another \$500 to \$700 was stolen from a Dunkin' Donuts. Both businesses are located along SR 436.

In addition, a resident of the Ravens Crossing apartment complex lost \$300 in valuables while being held up at gun-

"We are asking residents to be aware of their surroundings," said Kristen Bates, spokesperson for the Altamonte Springs Police Department. "Keep your keys in your hand, and park in well lit areas. If you see someone who appears suspicious, call the police."

On Tuesday in Longwood, a guest at a Ramada Inn along SR 434 lost cash and a room key in a robbery. The suspect had a similar decriptions to those involved in robberies in Altamonte Springs and Volusia County.

On the same night, two separate robbery attempts that were made within five minutes of each other failed in Deltona. Both incidents occurred on



"The truss's would have been removed after what we would have found in the inspection," Frazier said.

The report said that the causes of the truss failure may include truss bottom chord failure, web failure, connection plate installation failure, or inadequate vertical bracing.

Some of the lumber grades did not match the truss diagrams.

"We observed several wood members, primarily the web members, that were of suspect quality, including weathered pieces, large knots, and large areas of cross section reduction which extended into some of the connection areas," the report said.

The engineering truss shop drawings specified 1X4 "T-brac-1 ing" to be installed on many of the web members, and at some locations horizontal web bracing. According to the report, inspectors so far have not found either type of bracing present on any of the trusses examined.

Truss anchorage also does not appear to comply with contract designs, the report said.

The report recommends that the entire roof truss package be re-built, and that qualifications and quality-control inspection procedures be reviewed. In addition, the report recommends re-engineering the truss design package.

No target date has been set for resuming construction.

City officials said Fruland and Cox in Orlando performed design work on the project, out-2 lining the criteria for the trusses. The contractor is Doug Ross Construction Services, and the subcontractor is Central Florida Lumber.

Bowers thought Thompson should be rewarded for returning the wallet, but Thompson wouldn't take any money. Bowers said Thompson told him, "It's my job to run a

respectable business."

He did talk Ferguson into accepting a \$20 bill for her honesty, but she later gave it to a man who said he needed money for a taxi to get home.

Utilizing gifts - here and beyond

There's an item in a recent bulletin from Ascension Lutheran Church in Casselberry concerning Spirit-given gifts.

Ascension Lutheran's group known as Stephen Ministers has trained to be aware and to utilize the Spirit-given gifts of nurturing, caring and compassion.

These ministers also meet twice monthly to continue their education and to receive the support and supervision necessary in their continued service to others.

As told in 1 Corinthians 12:8-11, not everyone has the same gift nor all the gifts:

"To one there is given through the Spirit the message

of wisdom, to another the message of knowledge by the means of the same spirit, to another faith by the same Sprit, to

another gifts of healing by that one Spirit, to another miraculous powers, to another prophecy, to another distinguishing between spirits, to another speaking in different tongues and to another the interpretation of tongues.

> "All these are the work of the same Spirit, and he gives them to each one, just as he determines."

There was a warning to the Corinthians by St. Paul not to use these Spirit-given gifts for selfish advantage, as some in the Corinthian community

apparently were doing. The gifts were intended to build up the members of the Christian community then and now.

To those in the Stephen Ministry at Ascension Lutheran and to similar groups in churches throughout Central Florida, study and use of Spirit-given gifts isn't a sometimes or season exercise. While others get caught up in Christmas shopping and gifts under a tree, Spirit-gifted people concentrate on fulfilling their ministry.

I believe there are far more people using their Spirit-given gifts than we read about in the newspapers. We list the misdeeds of man far more than we do their accomplishments - lest they be athletes. I'm not aware of a newspaper that runs a Spirit-given gifts received and rendered.

I remember many years ago when a Jesuit teacher told me that everyone who prayed for Spirit-given gifts, would be surprised to know they already had one. It was his way of telling me I might not get the 1956 Thunderbird I was hoping to get for Christmas.

I'm thinking about the message - and the teacher. He was a scholastic at the time, studying for the priesthood. He continued to remember me and write for more than 40 years. We lost contact last year when both of us moved.

The last time I saw Father Frank, he was on a break from his teaching at Loyola Catholic High School in Baltimore. I imagine Father and inspired hundreds and hundreds of young men. His was a special gift - a Spirit-given one.

Robberies

Continued from Page 1A Deltona Boulevard, near an Interstate-4 exit ramp.

One robbery attempt made in a NationsBank parking lot, the other in a Best Western Deltona Inn parking lot.

'Volusia County Sheriff's investigators are searching for the gunman and consulting with the Seminole County Sheriff's Office as well as the Altamonte Springs Police Department, which reported similar offenses Tuesday," said Volusia County Sheriff's Office spokesman Gary Davidson.

Police responded to an armed robbery and auto theft just before 12 a.m. Wednesday at the Olive Garden in Altamonte Springs, 300 West State Road 436.

At about 11:34 p.m., two employees of Olive Garden were each struck in the head and ordered to sit down and be quiet as they entered a restroom, according to the police report.

The black male suspect then left both victims in the restroom and entered the business office where he struck a third employee, Wendy Burnes, 32, in the head and ordered her to open the safe, which she did. The suspect took an estimated \$2,600 in cash from the safe.

The suspect then escorted Byrnes to the restroom where the other two victims were and asked, at gun-point, if anyone had a vehicle in the parking lot. Byrnes turned over a key to her teal 1996 Kia Sportage.

The suspect, who is described as 5 feet 5 inches tall, 145 pounds, wearing black slacks and a white T-shirt, left the scene with another black male in the Kia, the police report said.

At 1:24 a.m. on Thursday, police responded to Dunkin' Donuts at 635 E. State Road 436 in Altamonte Springs in reference to an armed robbery by four to five black males who left the scene in a dark blue or black Cadillac or Lincoln. An estimated \$500 to \$700 was stolen, and police were unable to locate the vehicle, the police report said.

A black male apparently showed the clerk a silver colored semi-automatic handgun and demanded money from the register, according to the police report.

The black male is described in the police report as 18-21 years old, with a goatee, nearly six feet tall, weighing 160-180 pounds, and wearing a "Chicago Bulls" cap tilted to the side with a blue hooded seat shirt ripped across the stomach and khaki pants.

Witnesses said that a second black male removed an unknown amount of money from a bank bag. The suspect is described wearing a long sleeve brown shirt and black baggy

pants with a dark blue towel covering his face, according to the police report.

The third recent robbery in Altamonte Springs occurred at Ravens Crossing Apartment Complex, 806 Ravens Circle, at about 2 a.m. on Thursday.

Two black males apparently attacked David Sousa, 39, as he was walking to the breezeway that leads to his apartment, according to the police report. Sousa told police that as he

reached the stairwell he was struck over the head with a silver colored hand gun. He was thrown into the back seat of his vehicle, as the suspects unsuccessfully attempted to steal it.

The pair then fled the scene on foot. Sousa's briefcase, which contained his wallet and day planner valued at about \$300. was stolen, the police report said. Sousa was transported to Orlando Regional Medical Center for treatment.

Sousa described the suspects as black males, 18-22 years old and nearly six feet tall. One was wearing a multicolored knit cap with dark sun glasses, and the other a dark ski mask.

On Tuesday an unidentified man walked up to Robert Showalter in the Ramada Inn at 2025 West State Road 434 in Longwood, a guest from California who was attempting to get a soft drink, placed an

unknown object against his back and made him face the wall.

Showalter told investigators

that he believed the object was

either a gun or a knife. The suspect took a handful of change that Showalter handed out of his pocket, as well as his room key, according to an inci-

dent report from the Seminole

County Sheriff's Office. A description of the man who attempted to rob the Ramada Inn in Longwood on Tuesday matches the description of the man who has participated in other robberies in Volusia County and Altamonte Springs,

according to investigators. On the same night, in Deltona, an armed gunman was thwarted in two separate robbery attempts moments apart. First a gunman was thwarted by a bank customer who refused to comply, and then by the threats of a victim's 82-year-old father. No one was injured in either incident.

The first incident occurred shortly after 7 p.m. at the NationsBank on Deltona Boulevard. A 50-year-old couple had stopped to use the ATM machine when the suspect demanded their money, according to a Volusia County Sheriff's Office spokesman.

The couple had not yet received cash from the machine, refused the robber's demands,

and instead got back into their

The suspect kicked the passenger window several times then ran away. The victims then returned to the ATM machine to retrieve their bank card and contacted the Volusia County Sheriff's Office.

Four minutes later, deputies responded to an attempted armed robbery in the parking lot of the Best Western Deltona Inn, also on Deltona Boulevard. A 38-year-old man said he was locking his car door from the outside when the armed suspect

DEAR READER: I'm not sure. Prednisone and other steroid drugs can be of ines timable help in treating certain diseases, such as asthma, allergic cers and blood disorders, polymyalgia.

DEAR READER: Very successful, as you and thousands of patients can attest. Prosthetic valves are truly one of the miracles of modern science. Several types are widely used; I do not know the specific brand you have, but they all work on pretty much the same principle. The valve is a caged-ball device that replaces the diseased valve, blocks the valve opening, and prevents backflow of blood. The Starr-Edwards prosthesis was one of the earliest and most efficient artificial valves. In addition, porcine valves are often implanted in humana whose hearts malfunction because of valvular disease. I am sure that your cardiologist or cardiac surgeon would be willing to sit down with you, show you a valve similar to yours, and explain much of the fascinating technical history of these remarkable inventions.



When I entered the business, I drank scotch and wore trousers and flat shoes and took to heart the advice not to write a "woman's" sports column because no one would accept me. Without thinking too hard on it, I strove to be a little man, which made perfect sense at the time. Men served as the sole model of human competence in the workplace.

This, it strikes me now, was like a cat striving to be a dog. It smacked of self-loathing, even if we didn't think of it that way. It suggested that femaleness was

Three major publishers released books earlier this year that examine what it means to be female, from the neurons in our brains to the cycles that regulate our bodies. Time magazine put the topic on its cover this spring. Medical seminars on gender-specific biology that attracted only a handful of doctors four years ago now fill to capacity. Researchers are feeling free to explore the science behind Venus and Mars without being accused of setting women back.

'What my book does, I think, is say, 'Let's look at ourselves and not feel defensive," says Dianne Hale, author of "Just Like a Woman: How Gender Science Is Redefining What Makes Us Female" (Bantam), published last month. Hale and the authors of two similar books have been described as "femaleists" rather than feminists. There is no political agenda in the books, though they probably would have been branded as sexist just 10 or 15 years ago.

"The social landscape has changed, so that now they can put these books out there without being lambasted," says comedian Rob Becker. A decade ago, when Becker first began performing "Defending the Caveman," his one-man show about hunter men and gatherer women, some critics called it insensitive, stereotypical and out of touch. But audiences loved it. They recognized what Becker was saying: All the well-intentioned, politically correct theories in the world can't, and shouldn't try to, change evolutionary biology. The show became the longest-running one-man show in the history of Broadway and is still selling out in theaters across the country.

"What bothers me about people saying men should be like women or women should be like men or that everyone needs to be the same," Becker says, "is that what they're really saying is that we're not OK the way we are."

We're finally moving to the point when we can stop making comparisons altogether and understand that we are what we are. Then when someone asks who is better, men or women, we'll answer as Samuel Johnson did: Which man? Which woman?

Volunteers may help combat Alzheimer's

DEAR ABBY: In past months, some of the letters in your column have dealt with forgetfulness and aging. I would like to inform your readers about a research study designed to address the issue of memory loss found in normal aging compared to that seen in early Alzheimer's disease.

The Memory Impairment Study is taking place at 60 to 80 sites across the United States and Canada, and holds promise for medical intervention against the development of Alzheimer's disease. The study will investigate two treatments that will, we hope, lessen the likelihood of developing Alzheimer's disease in people with a condition known as mild cognitive impair-

Mild cognitive impairment refers to a type of memory loss beyond that which is expected during the course of normal aging. Symptoms typically include forgetting recent experiences on an increasingly frequent basis. Persons with mild cognitive impairment are otherwise normal, engage in the usual activities of daily living, and do NOT have a diagnosts of dementia or Alzheimer's disease. Nevertheless, it appears that

such individuals are at higher risk for developing Alzheimer's

For the study, we are looking for men and women between the ages of 55 and 90 who are in good general health but are forgetful for their age. They must have a partner who is familiar with them and can accompany them to their clinic visits. The study will run for three years. Clinic visits occur approximately every six months. We will be testing two treatments in comparison to a placebo (an inactive pill).

Volunteers for this study are key to helping us provide hope for the millions of individuals affected by Alzheimer's disease.

We greatly appreciate your support for research in Alzheimer's disease and hope your readers will contact us if interested.
