

#### Iranians Killed In London Brought To U.S. Embassy

TEHRAN, Iran (UPI) - The bodies of two Iranians London were carried to the occupied U.S. Embassy today in a protest by thousands through the streets of

The demonstrators also paraded past the Iraqi Embassy. Iran has charged that Iraq, on orders from the United States, engineered the London siege, which ended after the two men were slain and crack British commandos stormed the building.

The march followed another political setback at the hands of hard-line Moslem fundamentalists for President Abolhassan Bani-Sadr, who has favored a negotiated settlement for the release of the American hostages held for 192 days.

Foreign Minister Sadegh Ghotbzadeh received the bodies earlier at Tehran airport and declared the two men had "given their lives for Islam, their country and

Bani-Sadr, whose moderate party placed second in the parliamentary elections, was dealt a second blow Monday by the Revolutionary Council's refusal to nominate his choice for prime minister at this time

#### Rusk Feels Yugoslavia Safe

ATLANTA (UPI) - Former Secretary of State Dean Rusk said Monday the Soviet Union probably won't impose military force on Yugoslavia too soon after President Tito's death, calling such a move

## Senators To Consider Paddling Bill

banning paddling in their schools, which passed 87-27 Monday, has about two weeks to make it through the Senate Education Committee if it is going to be voted upon in the state Senate this session, said state Senator John Vogt, D-Cocoa Beach.

The bill guarantees teachers the right to paddle students no matter what their principals say. Under current law, a principal can refuse to allow corporal punishment in his or . Vogt said there is no companion bill in the

Senate, so if the bill makes it through the Senate Education Committee the Senate will be voting on the House version. He said he is in favor of corporal punishment, but thinks allowing teachers to use it without consulting school administrators is

"a risky way to go."

Vogt said. "The principal is supposed to be punishment without the principal's

#### Graham Signs Life Care Bill

TALLAHASSEE, Fla. (UPI) - Gov. Bob Graham has signed into law a bill letting "life care facilities" issue low-interest revenue bonds after being assured by the sponsors a legal defect in it will be fixed. The proposal HB 25 was amended to give the Department of Health and Rehabilitative Services authority to ensure minimum acceptable levels of care in the facilities, but some of the necessary language was omitted, leaving HRS's jurisdiction unclear. Graham signed the bill Monday, saying he has been

assured by the sponsors, Rep. Sam Bell, D-Daytona Beach, and Sen. Warren Henderson, R-Sarasota, that corrective legislative will be passed, Graham said. Life support facilities are condominium apartment omplexes offering medical and health care to their usually elderly tenants. #### U.S. Awash In Refugees

The last thing the Carter administration needs just now is another crisis, either foreign or domestic. But it is getting both in the waves of Cuban refugees washing ashore in Florida.

These refugees have already overwhelmed local and state agencies and are fast presenting Washington with the necessity of hard choices affecting the domestic economy, the federal budget, and the conduct of American foreign

Nor-is the building refugee crisis confined to those fleeing Fidel Castro. As many as 40,000 Haitian boat people have landed illegally in the Florida Keys within the last year. Meanwhile, the administration is admitting 14,000 Indo-Chinese refugees each month for permanent resettlement in the United States. And, while undocumented workers from Mexico and Central America are not considered refugees, the thousands who cross the border each month add that much more to the flow of desperate foreigners entering this country.

Given present circumstances in Asia, Latin America and the Caribbean, this flow is likely to continue. Indeed, it may well increase.

The obvious starting point in defining such policies is a recognition, however reluctant, that the United States cannot afford to admit all of the untold millions of persecuted and dispossessed who would like to settle here. So, distinctions must be made and priorities must be established.

For decades, U.S. law has differentiated between economic and political refugees, a distinction recognized as well by the United Nations. Yet. Mr. Carter has blurred this distinction by implying, for example, that the United States will accept Haitian boat people despite the State Department's official determination that none would suffer persecution or retribution if returned

And, of course, the administration has simply refused to confront the necessity for a rational, workable policy to cope with undocumented aliens entering the United States from Mexico and Central America.


All this inevitably complicates the traditional task of granting sanctuary and providing for legitimate political refugees, particularly these like the Vietnamese — for whom the United States bears a special responsibility. Nowhere are the resulting difficulties more evident at the moment than in southern Florida. Resolving the crisis will require more than federal funds for tent cities and emergency rations. 





#### Chrysler Closes 2 Plants;

**Auto Jobless Rate Soars** Steadily growing layoffs, permanent and temporary in the auto and steel industries, now total more than

290,000 workers. In new developments, the Chrysler Corp., announced it plans to permanently close two more plants, idling 2,560 workers, and the steel industry - hurt by the auto industry slump - says its layoffs have hit at least

16,000 employees.

Auto industry layoffs totaled about 275,000 em-

ployees, according to Detroit figures. Economists believe the recession began in March when the Federal Reserve, in trying to reduce the 18.1 percent annual inflation rate, widened its tight money policy with regulations sharply restricting credit

Auto sales dropped 30 percent in April from a year ago and home buying plummeted, reflecting in part the high interest rates on consumer loans.

#### Senate Hikes Defense Bill

WASHINGTON (UPI) - The Senate has revive programs long given up for dead and passed a defense budget \$8 billion larger than the House plan, setting up a tough fight between House and Senate negotiations

over the next year's spending. The conferees planned to begin work today on a compromise between the two proposals for fiscal 1981 spending, with each side set on balancing the budget for the first time in 12 years. Just hours before the budget passed Monday,

report initial success in dogs with a new approach to breast cancer treatment that combines safe doses of an anti-cancer drug with a new process that apparently liberates natural cancer killers.

They say the net result is a magnified tumor killing effect that acts quickly and spares healthy tissue. Drs. S. Terman and William T. Shearer of the Baylor College of Medicine emphasized, however, their pioneering fusion of two classes of anti-cancer weapons is in early stages of development. They said there is a big jump from dogs to humans.

If subsequent work confirms the findings, the twostage attack on cancer would be particularly attractive for cancer therapy because it uses the body's own immune system components and drug doses so low they do not produce harmful side effects.

#### Court Adjusts Miranda Rule

WASHINGTON (UPI) - The Supreme Court ruled 6-3 today that a criminal suspect's Miranda rights are not violated when casual remarks by police draw incriminating statements from him.

The majority opinion said the requirements of the court's 1966 Miranda decision are triggered when "a person in custody is subjected to either express questioning or its functional equivalent." "But," it said, "since police surely cannot be held accountable for the unforeseeable results of their

words or actions, the definition of interrogation can extend only to the word or actions on the part of police officers that they should have known were reasonably likely to elicit an incriminating response."





In a reversal of its decision last week, the Seminole County Commission Tuesday approved sponsorship of a program that will spend \$105,681 of federal money to pay CETA-qualified workers \$3.10 per hour to learn how to look for a job. Commissioners Sandra Glenn and Bill Kirchhoff remained against the proposal, but it passed 3-2.

Commissioners Richard Williams and Bob Sturm changed their votes. Commissioner Bob French voted for the proposal Williams said he wouldn't mind "trying it until September."

Under the proposal, participants would be paid \$3.10 per hour to attend a 30-hour-per-week, three-week course on job hun-The county was allocated \$112,500 under Title VII of CETA to


