The Manpower Problem

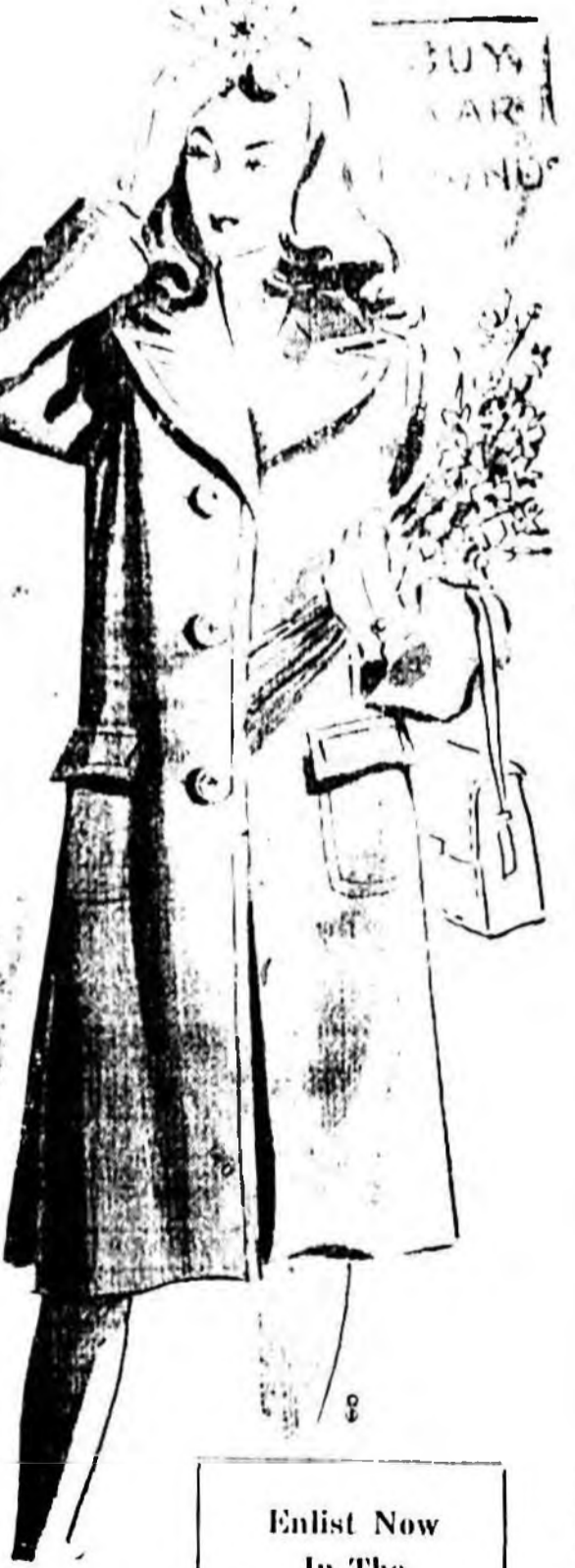

Everglades Sugar Crop Is Threatened

CLEWISTON, Feb. 8.—Labor shortages are threatening the Everglades sugar crop, which was expected to produce a record 100,000 tons this year.

Joy W. Morgan, president of the United States Sugar Corporation, said the company needed 1500 additional workers but was unable to find them.

"We in Florida are experiencing the shortage of farm labor that will strike the whole country in a few months," he said. "Florida needs help now."
