Routed from his bed and taken to the prosecutor's office, Shepherd was confronted by Dr. Famin. He was asked about introducing typhoid germs into the body. Mrs. Shepherd, coguardian of Young McClintock, was taken to the prosecutor's "office later." She was permitted to return home after brief questioning.
