Youth With Broken Neck Looses Fight To Save His Life

PITTSBURGH, Mar. 19. (INS) -Death emerged the victor today in one of the gamest fights for life against insurmountable odds on record. After a two and a half year fight against the offects of a broken neck, young Rody P. Marshall, Jr., son of a widely known criminal lawyer, succumbed following a relapse.
