## Proposed Bills Would Okey And Tax Gambling

(Continued From Page One)  
monies are now prohibited by Florida laws.

The racing business carries a 3 cent tax and the money is divided equally among the 87 counties of the state. The cut for each city this year will be about \$600, almost enough to run county governments in the more sparsely settled parts of the state, it is common knowledge that gambling, in almost every form, is conducted at many state fair resorts, some of it as a carry-over proposition in most of larger centers.

Among bills before the Legislature, some requiring amendment, the State Constitution by vote of the people, are proposals to: regulate and tax all forms of gambling, except lotteries, for benefit of old-age pensions; legalize lotteries to be conducted by the state for the support of oral governmental activities; legalize wagering on the Spanish game known as jai alai.

Give the public schools the present revenue from bets on horse dog races and to increase the rate from 3 to 6 percent, with odds getting half of the revenue.

Legalize slot machines, with cities taxing each machine \$100 a year for the benefit of schools.

Givens Offers His Arguments On Chain Stores

Tampan Says Florida Recovery Act Will Benefit Consumers

TALLAHASSEE, Apr. 13.—The legislature, with nearly one-fourth of its allotted 60 days passed, is in week-end recess today with all major problems still unsolved while Governor Sholtz repeated "There won't be a special session."

Legislature was not among the 600 measures introduced since the session started April 2.
