WASHINGTON (AP) - The Senate may vote today on a measure to fund production of neutron warheads that are designed to kill without inflicting widespread destruction. Sen. Warren Magnuson, D-Wash., said the matter would be taken up in a rare closed session. President Carter has not yet decided whether to approve the new generation of nuclear weaponry. But an administration official said Carter wants the money for the warheads voted to maintain his options.

Former Secretary of State Henry Kissinger also may visit on Saturday, Barrett said. The Fords arrived here Thursday and plan to stay through Labor Day. For security reasons, they have stayed at Bass' home on their Vail solourns since Ford became president in 1974. A condominium they own two blocks from the Bass home has been unused for years.



Pollution Law Takes Effect

JACKSONVILLE (AP) Effective today, a permit is requied for dumping dredged or fill material in any U.S. waters. but Col. Donald A. Wisdom said the Corps of Engineers in Florida will be reasonable in processing permit requests This is the third phase of a program under the 1972 water pollution control act that began in 1975 by requiring a permit for such dumping in coastal waters, inland navigable waters and nearby wetlands

The second phase also required permits for such discharges in primary tributaries of navigable waters This final phase covers all rivers and streams to their headwaters. Headwaters is defined as that point in the stream above which the average annual flow is less than five cubic feet a second

jail to begin serving their sentences. Mitchell is the first attorney general in the history of the Republic to have been convicted of a felony while in office. Haldeman is the man who as White House majordomo, according to Rep. Bob Wilson, R-San Diego, was the kind of an SOB who gives SOBs a bad name

Both men were harsh, dogmatic and autocratic in their official demeanor. They made many enemies, some of whom will rejoice that they have been brought low.

We do not feel any rejoicing, simply sorrow and perhaps a quiet satisfaction that the mills of American justice, although they grind slowly. grind exceedingly fine. Justice is and must be in this country no respecter of persons, no matter how high placed.

The deep disillusionment with White House power that the Watergate affair engendered in every thinking American who has lived through these years will remain as a lasting heritage in the American grain.

It will be healthy if we turn our skepticism on ourselves and realize that even in the moments when we are most convinced of our own - in fact, precisely in those moments - we may be preparing our own down-

Thus it was at Miami Beach in 1968 that the Republican National Convention exploded with passionate applause and cheers when Richard Nixon promised to appoint a new attorney general if he were elected president — an attorney general who stood for law and order, in place of the liberal Ramsey Clark

Nixon was elected, of course, and the attorney general he chose is now behind bars.

Taking serious note of Mayor Glasscock, some enterprising congressmen might propose to "spread" unemployment to the hinterlands not, of course, by disfranchising people from their jobs, but by relocating unemployed persons to "underunemployed" cities. The argument would be that an influx of unemployed would qualify such cities for federal aid that could be spent on public jobs, thus helping everyone

The Unemployment Relocator Plan - URP as it might be dubbed - obviously would be attractive to a variety of constituents. But we shudder upon thinking not only of the cost of relocating thousands of Americans, but also of what might happen after relocation. In Hondo, for example, Mayor Glasscock suggests housing the imported unemployed in an old air base, having made barracks out of it. HUD no doubt would object, and in time URP would have to have help from HURP. which would be, of course, Housing for URPees.





people's lives today. Where have we gone wrong? Answer: We've gone wrong in believing what the world says ove is, rather than believing what God says. When we believe what books, magazines, and television tell us about love, we're being taken in by a totally false idea. I don't have to argue this point, because we see the result in the divorces and broken lives

The world says husbands and wives, fathers and mothers come and go - love is a matter of today. Who knows how I'll feel tomorrow? What is called love begins in selfishness - please yourself, do your own thing, get what you want, and get out when you don't - and ends in loneliness.

God is love. He invented love, and He knows more about it than anyone else. His idea of love is different from the current "what can you do for me?" In fact, it's exactly the opposite. Love pleases the other person and cares about the other's happiness, at least as much as his own. And love is permanent and life-long. St. Paul says it all in the thirteenth chapter of I Corinthians.

It may be that the meaning of your life is how well you love and also how long. How long, because I think the test of true love is faithfulness. It's not putting a time limit on love. It's not saying to a husband or wife or child, "I'll love you just so long as you please me." Love is staying, no matter what happens.

You can only be your real self or reveal yourself to someone you trust to love you forever. That's why marriage is a committed relationship, just as a relationship with God is. When you commit yourself and your life to God, then He commits Himself to love and care for you forever. God's love is faithful and steadfast, "I will never leave thee, nor forsake thee" (Hebrews 13:5). God's relationship with His children is the pattern for all human relationships, the formula for peace and joy in human love.
