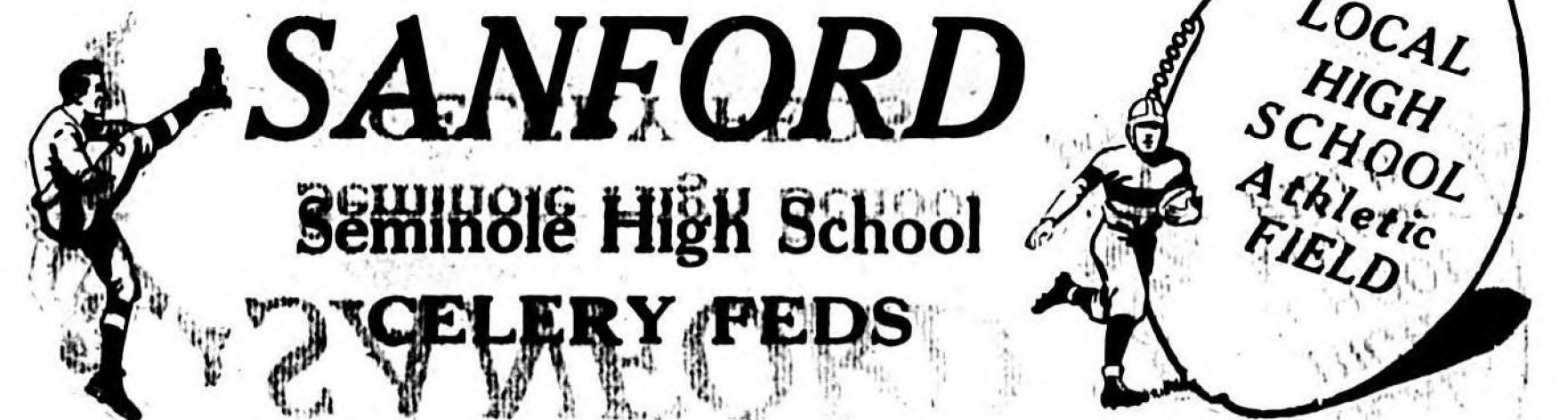

Committee Gives Valuable Aid To German Refugees

Workers Help Bewildered Arrivals Find Relatives And Jobs

By LYDIA GRAY SHAW
NEW YORK, Nov. 25.—Some of the saddest people in the world are finding their way to the heart of the gray White Way at the end of a cross-Atlantic trek in search of security and happiness.

In the middle of the theater district is an undistinctive office building. In that building is the clearing house for German and Italian refugees.

There, 80 workers of the National Coordinating Council for Aid to Refugees and many thousands of others are busy every day planning to help Italian and German refugees find jobs, find relatives, find a home.

Late into the night, the staff labors to help bewildered arrivals find relatives, jobs, places to live. And it is always the same story—relatives help to help them find a home.

Founded in the summer of 1934 by James G. McDonald, League of Nations refugee commissioner, the organization now has a staff of 20 cooperating units, each for Jewish and Protestant refugees.

The Catholic Committee for Refugees from Germany maintains a separate staff of workers.

At the office of the coordinating committee, at which in New York City, a Catholic university law professor, serving as chairman, there is a large room. Every evening brings a group of German-speaking men and women to the large waiting room. Newly arrived refugees sit at long desks seeking to help relatives abroad.

Phones ring constantly. The man at the information desk answers questions all day long, speaking with a heavy German accent. He is patient, encouraging smile never wavers.

Money is a necessity. Most of the refugees have lost all their money. They are now waiting for the committee to help them. Some of the refugees have lost all their money. They are now waiting for the committee to help them.

When the first refugees began to arrive, the immigration authorities allowed many who had converted their cash into valuable articles like cameras and microscopes to bring those things in duty-free. But as the pressure has become greater, they have enforced restrictions to the extent that it may mean confiscating the refugees' only means of obtaining money.

Immigration Quota Increase
The American quota on immigrants from Germany, which had been 25,957 a year, was changed a few months ago to 27,770 because Germany took over Austria.

Until this last year, immigration was considerably under that figure (see chart). But in the 12 months ending June 30, 1938, 17,001 German immigrants were admitted. The Austrian immigration during the same period was 864, double that of the preceding year. And the Italian figure was 3,128, an increase of 60%.

The difficulty of meeting immigration requirements has retarded immigration to some extent. Difficulties with government regulations abroad also are believed to have restricted the total.

But the state department says immigration from Germany will probably continue to do so for some time in view of the large demand for visas required in consular offices abroad.

So far, 16 to 18 percent of the Germans coming in are Jews, but since the Austrian annexation, in March, a new group, consisting largely of Catholics and some Protestants, has begun to arrive.

Methods Used In Processing Iron Given Kiwanians

(Continued from Page One)

dominate the charge for the blast furnace in which the melting and reduction takes place, it is composed of alternate layers of coke, stone and iron ore.

"The simplest possible statement of the reactions in the blast furnace is that the oxygen of the ore combines with the carbon of the coke to form the acids combined with the bases to form a fluid slag. The iron, being heavier, settles to the bottom or hearth of the furnace and the slag, being light, floats on top of the iron.

"At various intervals, a plug is drawn from the side of the furnace and the slag runs off. At other regular intervals, a hole is tapped to the bottom of the furnace and the iron is forced out. This iron may be at once molded into suitable size pigs for shipment as pig iron or it may be taken in the molten state to a steel mill for further refining to various grades of steel.

"The principal difference in pig iron and steel is the carbon content. Pig iron contains from 3.50 to 4.00 percent carbon while steel may contain as low as 10 percent of carbon. Automobile body sheets contain 10 percent or less of carbon while cutlery steel will contain in excess of 50 percent of carbon.

"The air, furnishing oxygen to support combustion, is pumped in at the bottom of the furnace and the weight of such air is in excess of the solid materials used. Three and one-half tons of solid, and approximately three and three-fourths tons of air.

"It will thus be seen that all blast furnace plants must be equipped to supply hot air in generous quantities. The iron blast furnace may properly be called a chemical laboratory and the action and reaction, physical, chemical and mechanical, which occurs is so vast and complicated that volumes have been written about it and yet much remains to be learned."

Warning Against Fire Hazards Is Made By Cleveland

To date, firemen have inspected approximately 300 homes in Sanford, Chief Cleveland said, adding that while it is not the practice of the fire department to inspect all Sanford homes periodically as in the case of business buildings, a thorough inspection will be made at no cost to the owner on request.

The fire chief reported that during his inspections he has found many hazardous arrangements for providing heat. He said he has found heater pipes run through the windows and in many instances very close to inflammable materials such as curtains.

Urging co-operation with the fire department, Chief Cleveland stated "it is best to stop the fire before they are started."
