





Andrei A. Galagan of the Soviet Ukraine told the General Assembly's No. I political committee that it should order troops from the neighboring Arab states of Egypt, Trans Jordan, Syria, Lebanon and Iraq out of Palestine.

He said an independent Arab state should be set up alongside the new Jewish state of Israel and opposed giving the Arab section of the Holy Land to "the British puppet of Trans-Jordan."
