We suppose there is as much justification for government subsidies guaranteeing the cost of production for citrus growers, as for potato growers, wheat and cotton farmers, but unless such subsidies are accompanied by strict government control, what is to prevent everybody else from going into the citrus business where he would be insured against any possible loss, could gamble freely for a big return, a sort of "heads I win, tails the taxpayers lose proposition?"

CIO President Philip Murray's program for avoiding another major economic depression strikes us as a sure way to cause one. He would suggest price controls (but no wage controls), levy an excess profits tax (and with the rest of his program there wouldn't be any excess profits), government subsidies to hold large prices up, and minimum wages of at least \$1 an hour.

America at the present time is more concerned over the welfare of its minorities than ever before in its history, and Congress is considering new bills in the Senate to prevent the passage and secure enactment of anti-lynching legislation. Yet the filibuster is the best device which any politician has in preventing discharge of a bill from the majority.

A new pilot plant to experiment with the conversion of coal to gas and liquid fuel has just been opened near Pittsburgh, Pa. Practical results for the present are expected to be in the form of new processes for manufacturing gas for industrial and home uses.

Hewlett Johnson, Dean of England's ancient 'Canterbury Cathedral, who is known as the 'Red Dean' because of his extreme left views and his great friendship for Soviet Russia.

The 'Red Dean' was denied a visa by the U.S. State Department last August when he sought to come here under sponsorship of the National Council of American-Soviet Friendship. That organization is an attorney general Tom C. Clark's 'subversive' list.

So we have Dean Johnson with us, extolling the virtues of the Bolsheviks. As a matter of fact, the National Council of American-Soviet Friendship is sponsoring a rally in New York's Madison Square Garden Dec. 13 and among the speakers will be the 'Red Dean' and Soviet Ambassador Alexander S. Panichukin.

Twice the 'Red Dean' has been publicly rebuked by the prime minister of all England. But to give the dean credit for steadfastness of purpose, he hasn't seemed to give in to the dean's denials.

On second thought, maybe that line wouldn't impress the dean. After a trip to Russia in '38 he said that 'it is totally wrong to say these people are irreligious if they deny God. It does not matter what they say with their lips; it is what they mean in their hearts.'

Of the world's states, Russia is the largest, with 8,349,000 square miles.

Governor-elect Fuller Warren has reserved a table for the occasion, and is expected to be the top notable from Florida to attend the occasion. Congressman-elect A. Syd Herlong is also expected to be here for the gala event.

President Horace Stoneham of the Giants will be on hand to inspect the spring home for his Minneapolis Millers and Jersey City Giants. Feeley, attorney and treasurer for the organization, are also expected to attend the affair, Charles Maxton, Giants executive, revealed. Carl Hubbell, director of the New York Giants farm club organization, and Mel Ott, former manager of the New York club, were expected to arrive in Sanford today, and will probably begin to make plans to reopen the training base "hotel" at the Municipal Airport.

### Negro Star Named Captain Of Yale Grid Club For '49

NEW HAVEN, Conn., Nov. 23, (AP)—Levi Jackson's election as Yale's 1949 football captain was being cheered today, both on and off the campus.

Town and gown alike hailed the native born New Havener who yesterday became the first negro in history to captain a Yale sports team and the first "townie" to lead the Blue since Albert J. (Able) Booth captained the 1931 team.

For Jackson, Monday was a day never to be forgotten. It started out with his selection to the first string backfield of the Associated Press All-Eastern team followed by his unanimous election as Yale's 70th captain. Then at night, more than 400 New Haveners packed him welcome at the annual awards dinner of the New Haven Gridiron Club at which he was awarded a plaque as the "outstanding football player of 1949 in the Yale bowl."

Campus comment on the election was almost entirely favorable. Head Coach Herman Hickmun, former Tennessee star, said: "Levi is a great boy and a fine football player. He is an excellent choice and I believe Jackson will make a good captain for us. We are all happy with his election."

### Gator Gridders Get Warning To Watch Passing Of 'Bama's Salem

GAINESVILLE, Nov. 23, (AP)—The University of Florida Gators today continue grid drills, preparing for their 1948 finale against the Alabama Crimson Tide in Tuscaloosa Saturday afternoon.

The game will celebrate the "Bama homecoming"—fourth homecoming appearance of the season for the Gators.

At this writing, the game appears destined to be another wide-open affair which will pit the strong Florida running attack against the sure-footed passing of Alabama.

The Gators heard about Salem yesterday when backfield coach Bartling Dupree gave the scout report. Dupree warned that the club would face one of the most dangerous backs of the season in the Crimson Tide ace, "Ho's" tricky and he's tough," Dupree said.

This will mark the first meeting between Florida and Alabama since 1931, when the Crimson Tide marched in a 41-0 win. The two teams have met eight times previously with the Gators emerging victorious three and the Crimson Tide winning the other five.

There are no serious injuries prevalent in the Florida camp, the players suffering from only the usual bumps and bruises that were incurred in the Miami game.

Florida will be seeking to keep above the 500 mark in the game with Alabama, and should they emerge victorious, it will be the best season the Gators have enjoyed since 1934 when they had a 6-4 record.

Three Gators will make their final appearance in a Florida uniform this Saturday. Captain Fletcher Groves, quarterback and Alternate Captain Doug Heiden, and center John Gilbert will be rounding out highly successful collegiate careers.

Most of the workouts for the rest of the week will probably be devoted to pass defense and offensive running plays, as the Gators received a well-warded scout report on the aerial ability of Alabama's Salem.

### SMU And North Carolina Favored For Cotton Bowl

DALLAS, Nov. 23, (AP)—The odds today appeared to favor Southern Methodist and North Carolina in the Cotton Bowl.

There was nothing official and the name of the visiting team being sought was kept a closely guarded secret, but unofficial sources said Southern Methodist's football squad, host team in the Dallas New Year's Day Bowl game, voted North Carolina their preference. Now it's up to the Cotton Bowl to get the Tar Heels.

Chairman Dan D. Rogers of the board of the Cotton Bowl Athletic Association said announcement of the visiting team would be made this afternoon.

The squad, which clinched the host spot in the Cotton Bowl for the second straight year by beating Baylor 13-6 last Saturday, voted in secret yesterday afternoon. Coach Matty Bell would not reveal the choice and neither would bowl officials.

Reports indicate that the Orange Bowl is giving the Cotton Bowl strong competition for North Carolina, an unbeaten, once-tied team that whipped Texas of the Southwest Conference 34-7. The Cotton Bowl offers \$105,000 to each team—more money than the Orange Bowl affords.
