already embarked on it if you are a public relations chairman. This is an excerpt from a program conducted by The Herald Editor at the Sanford Pilot Club dinner meeting Tuesday night at the Civic Center.

A set of rules for reporting club news and other releases, which I compiled, appeared in The Herald on Sept. 7, and is available upon request.

For the benefit of other organizations and groups, I will relay the general consensus of the procedure I explained to the Pilot.

A good release begins with a "lead" sentence—only that dynamic—to make the reader want to continue reading the second. Ordinary run of the mill programs make dull reading. Keep your programs full of spirit, imagination and vitality.

If you are affiliated with international, in its your account with a national organization. Your public relations chairman is actually the most important officer in the organization in that she is responsible for the success of all fund raising enterprises and the cooperation of the newspaper or other media. Public relations is the overall policy and policy of your organization. The newspaper offers you the widest audience at no cost for your publicity. An average of 90 per cent of the adult population read the newspaper.

If your account is well written, preferably typed, chances are you will get the right spots. Remember that competition for newspaper space is high. Your copy will vie for space with war, crime and politics as well as with news from over 100 other organizations.

A news story should contain answers to the questions: WHO, WHAT, WHY, HOW, WHERE and WHEN in the first paragraph. The following paragraphs should add supporting details. A basic rule for copy is: Put in all that is needed to tell the story in the right order, in the most direct and simple language possible—and that and no more. The Herald is glad to print all names involved.

It is to the advantage of the organization to have all news releases written for the paper and not phoned in. Make sure that all facts, names, initials, dates and figures are correct. We do not have a research department, and many people become irate if the names in their names is not correct.

When requesting a reporter or photographer to cover a special event, extend your invitation via the proper editor well in advance. Give him as much information as possible when the reporter arrives. Have someone on hand to answer necessary questions. Never request your own personal relations when dealing with the press. Common sense, honesty, efficiency, the play and humor, friendliness bring good results with the press, and radio-TV, as well as with anybody else.

We give much advance publicity to fund raising events and special events. The press needs will benefit various charities. We never hear from the outcome of a majority of these benefits, which are poor public relations. People who invest their money to give a cause, would like to know the outcome and see in print where their money went and how they assisted a civic project.

# Workmanship Counts Smart Shopper's Guide

Each season brings something new to the clothing field. But there are certain basics that men and women shoppers cannot overlook, especially in the money management guide offered by a nationwide finance corporation. If you know what to look for, you can shop in any store with confidence.

—Garment parts hang on the grain or along the thread of the material but better and more readily stretch out off the grain.

—Matching of pattern is important. Quality garments match at armbands, waistline and center seams. Pockets, sleeves and collars should match and look well in relation to the body of the garment.

—Hand-and-machine stitches should be small, even, neat, continuous, straight and secure.

—Seams should be flat and even in width. Look for wide seams which can stand good wear and allow alterations.

—Bar-tacks are at the point of strain: extra rows of stitching, metal rivets, patches and bar tacks.

—Buttons, fast and even in the width for better hang, and generous for alterations. Invaluable stitching on the right side of the garment. Invaluable stitching for top of the hem neatly finished with seam binding.

—Lining, padding, trim and interfacing should be of quality material to stand up under washing or dry cleaning.

—Closure should be flat, inconspicuous and long enough to permit getting into and out of the garment easily.

—Hooks and eye, snaps, buttons and trimmings secure-ly attached. With soft or open weave fabrics, these need to be reinforced.

—Buttonholes, neither too long nor too short to fit over buttons. They should be cut on the grain of the material; be evenly and firmly stitched or bound with well-reinforced ends.

With synthetics, labels are very important to read them. Are the yarns colorfast? Will they hold up when dry-cleaned and against fumes, rubbing off of dye, rubbing or perspiration? Is the material shrink-proof? New techniques, such as Pak-silk, are guaranteed not to shrink up to one per cent.

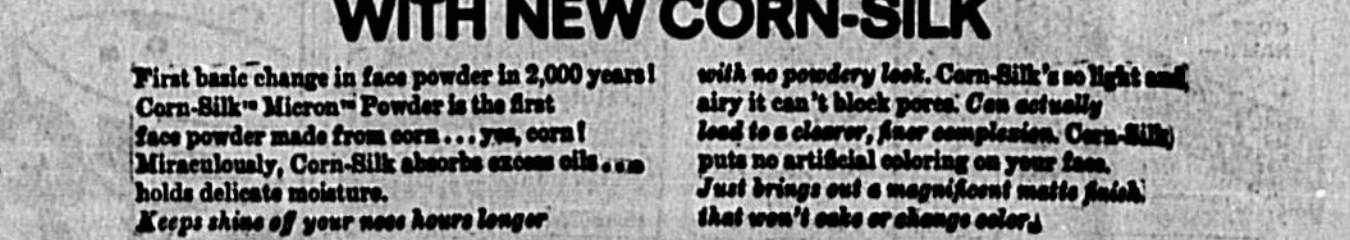

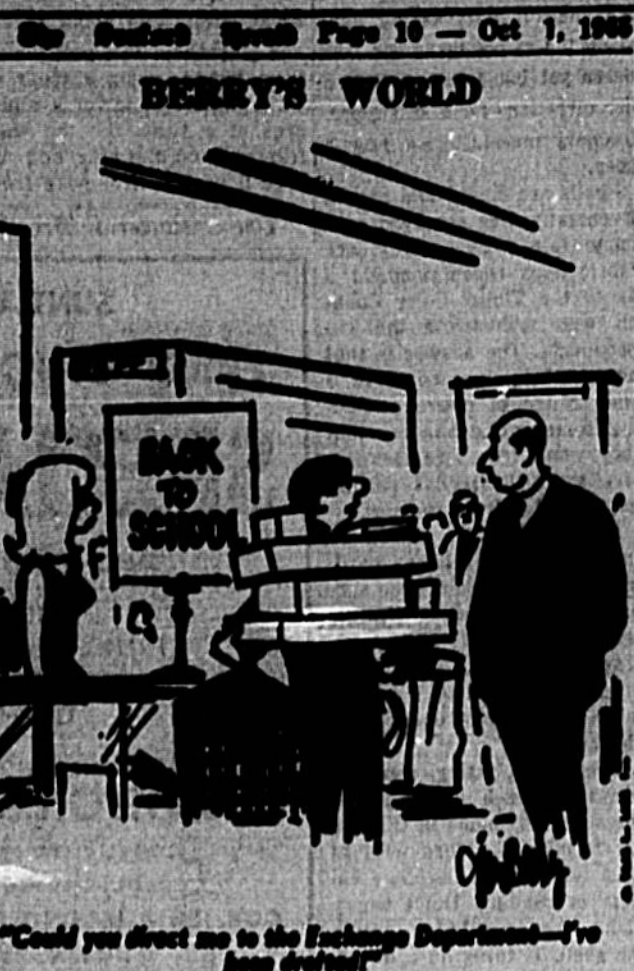

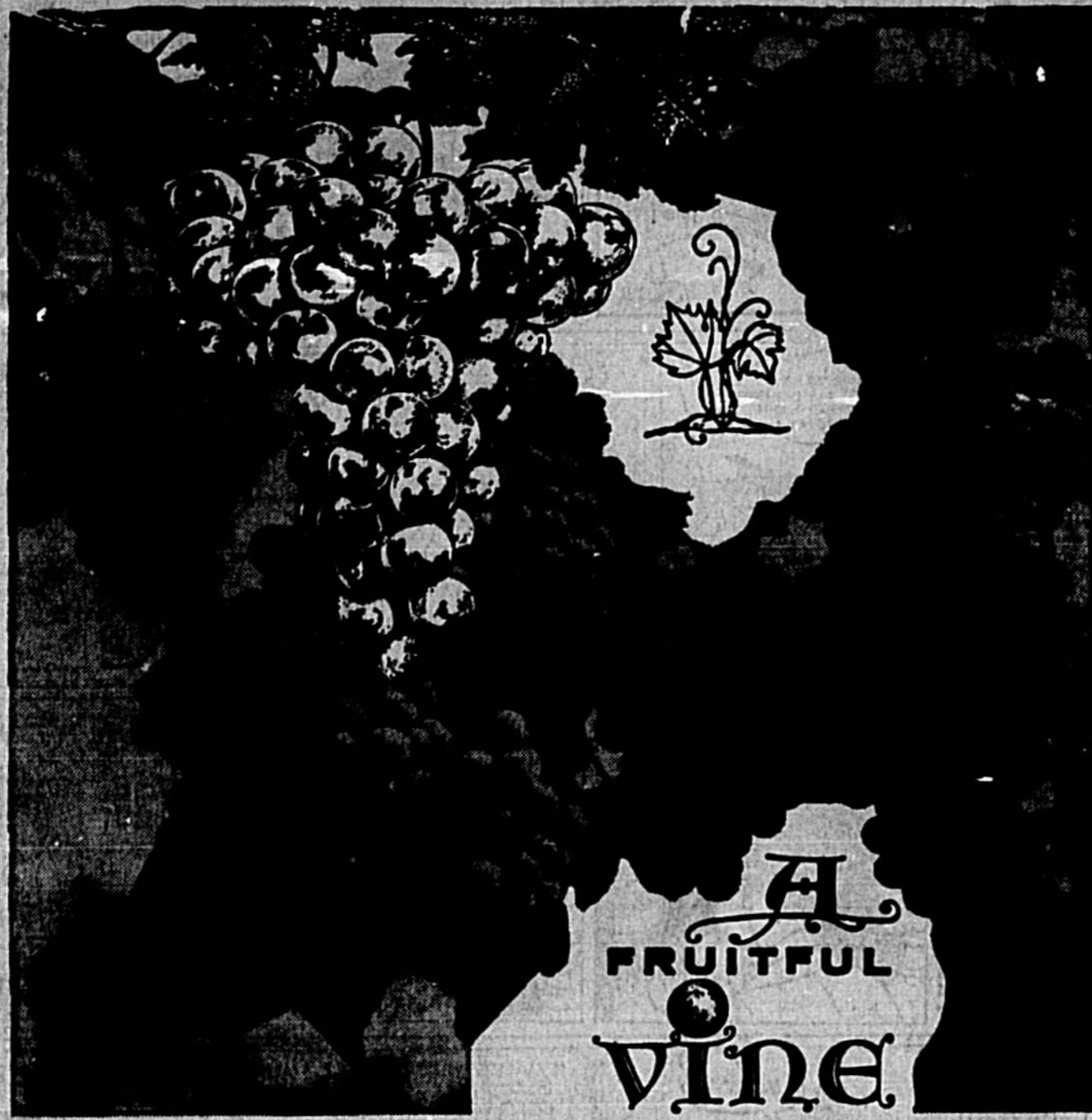

# 'Pilgrim Pope' Paul VI Arrives To Plead For Peace

NEW YORK (UPI)—Pope Paul VI arrived in America as a pilgrim of peace today and held cheering crowds that he was delighted to be in "a country so free, so strong, so industrious, so full of wonders." As he stepped from the big DC8 jetliner which brought him here from Rome, the smiling 68-year-old pontiff extended a warm paternal greeting to America's 45 million Roman Catholics. The first Pope to set foot upon your land since you with all his heart," he said.

The "Pilgrim Pope," who has traveled farther during the 27 months of his reign than all his predecessors put together, landed at Kennedy Airport after a 4,315-mile air voyage across the Atlantic.

Wearing a white cassock and a full-length red and white cape to ward off the breezes whipping through the airport, the slight, acholony pontiff waved to the crowd of some 4,000 invited guests on the airport ramp, and then went down the official red-carpeted runway to the waiting hands of United Nations Secretary General Thani U. Secretary of State Dean Rusk and New York Gov. Nelson A. Rockefeller.

The Pope warmly embraced his old friend and host, Francis Cardinal Spellman, archbishop of New York, who was dean of business administration at Harvard-Simons University in Allston, Mass.

It was a bright, sunny day but a little cool for October, with the thermometer in the mid-forties and fairly gusty winds.

The Pope was originally scheduled to ride in an open-top car on a 34-mile tour through the city, but the heat broke down the motorcade to what is a bus-top trip.

The Pope visited the whole-hearted support of the United Nations—"that greatest of international organizations," he said.

During 14 hectic hours of American and Roman Catholicism, the Pope also will confer privately with President Johnson after a Mass for peace in Yankee Stadium, visit the Vatican Pavilion at the World's Fair, and receive the acclaim of an estimated four million persons lining the route of the 50-mile motorcade through the city.
