Americans have been guilty of taking life too seriously, of not allowing social amenities or minor pleasantries to en-ter into their business lives in the fear that they might in-terfere with attaining the ultimate goal of success, which,

It is this interpretation of success which probably has caused most of the unhappiness among our people and has often resulted in strained looks and haggard expressions.


