Judge Disqualifies Himself In Courthouse Row

Circuit Judge Volle A. Williams Jr. today disqualifed himself from any "judicial functions" related to the injunctive suit filed this week by three South Seminole residents to stop construction of the new courthouse.

In the disqualification order filed in the clerk's office, Judge Williams stated, "Since this law suit is a likely prelude to the removal of the county seat from Sanford and since this judge has been a resident of Sanford for 40 years, it would appear more seemly if he followed the admonition given Casar's wife and rescued himself."

Judge Williams further stated, "To preserve the integrity of our court and its respect of our people, all parties, including the court itself, need believe the cause has been disposed of by an impartial and disinterested trier of the facts. As the Supreme Court of Florida has said, "Every party litigant is entitled to nothing less than the cold neutrality of an impartial judge."

Chicago Eyes \$6 Billion Face-Lifting

CHICAGO (AP) — Chicago has charted a 15-year, \$6-billion campaign to rebuild large areas of the city and to seek lasting solutions to its social and racial problems.

The long-range, comprehensive plan will carry the city through the year 2000 and includes the reshaping of virtually every area of its life and basic structure.

Called by Mayor Richard J. Daley as "a practical design for the city's future," it provides for better neighborhoods, more housing and schools, new parks and recreation facilities, more and faster transportation and a revitalized central core.

The plan was made up by the City Planning Commission. Much of the cost, an estimated \$400 million a year, will come from federal and state aid, Daley said. The program will double present expenditures for such improvements.

In the social sphere, the plan calls for measures to bring more white families back into the city, to open more job opportunities for all persons and to expand greatly the educational system at all levels.

It provides for open housing for all of Chicago's citizens and recommends that "fair housing" laws be adopted throughout the metropolitan area.

The plan envisions Chicago in 1980 as composed of more and younger families. It projects a rise in population to 4.7 million, including a nonwhite population of more than 1.5 million. But it maintains that general improvements in the city will attract

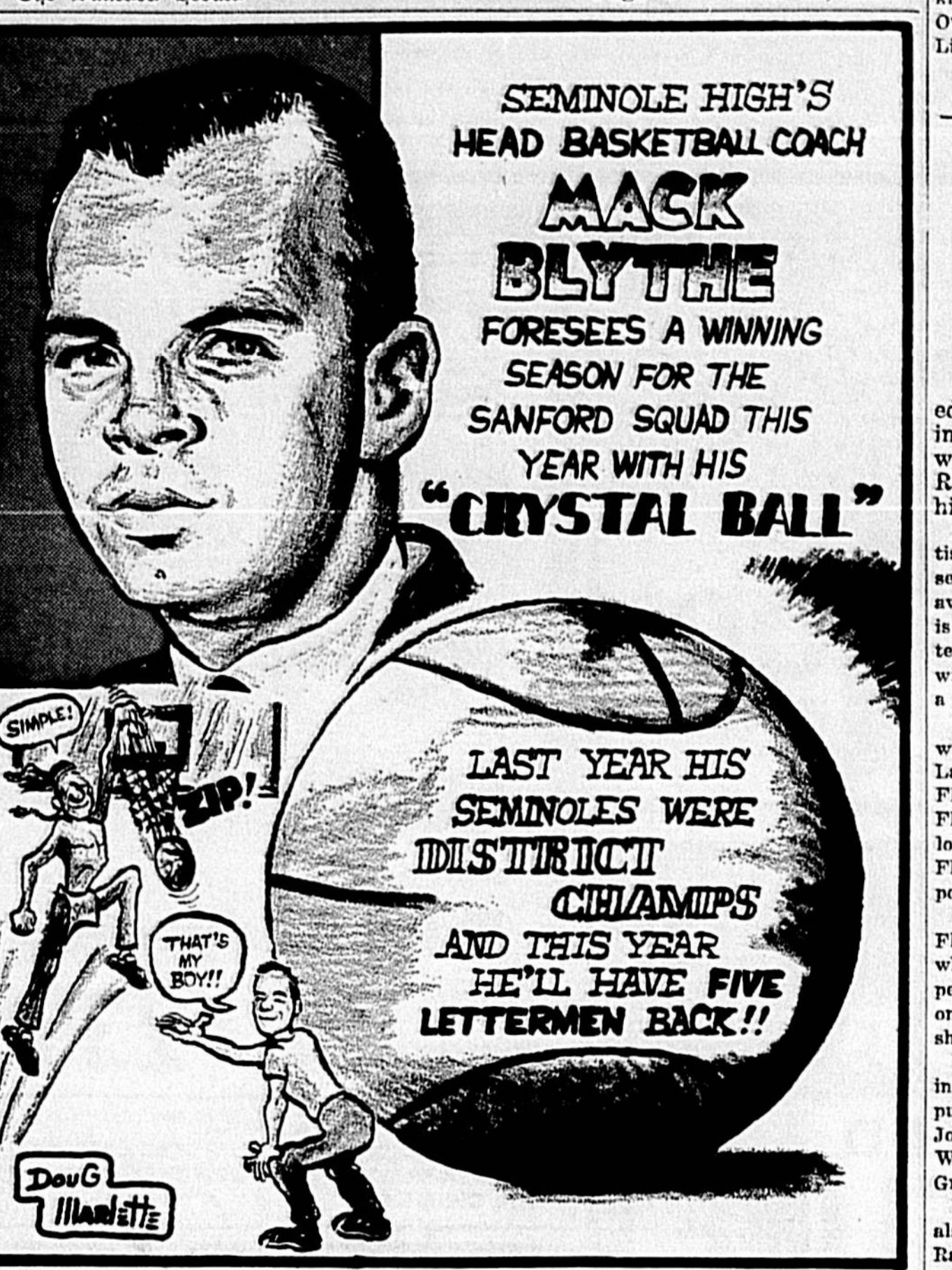

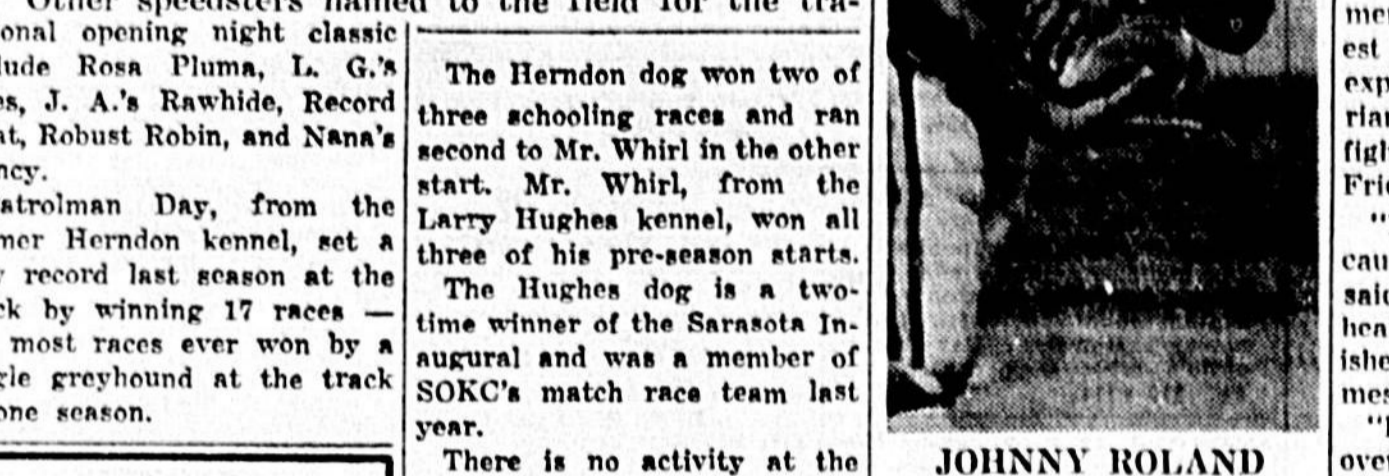

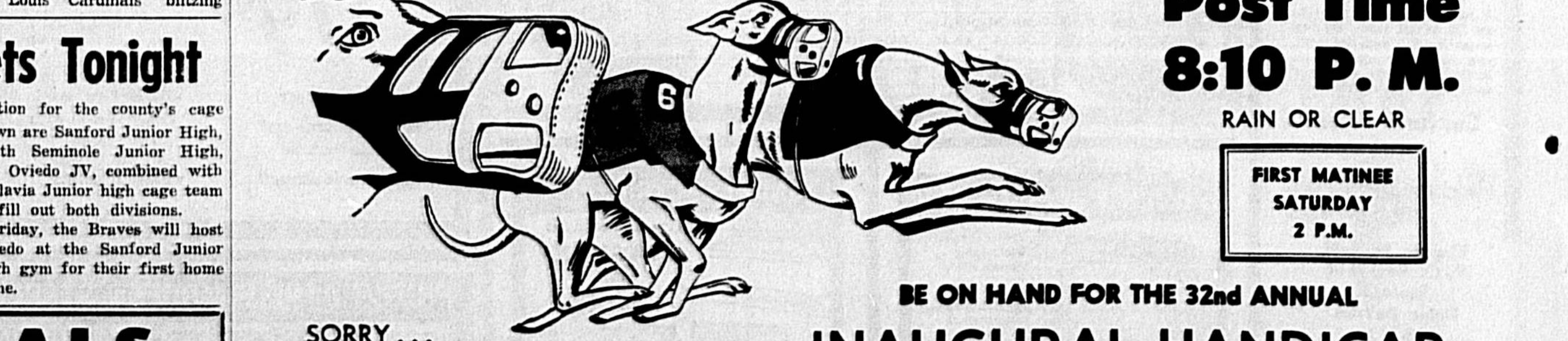

Rep. Powell Probe May Include Wife

WASHINGTON (UPI) — A House subcommittee may subpoena the wife of Rep. Adam Clayton Powell (D-N.Y.) to testify next week at an investigation of some of her husband's activities.

Mrs. Yvette Powell serves on the congressional committee of the New York lawmaker and receives the maximum salary of \$20,576 a year while living in her native Puerto Rico.

Rep. Wayne L. Hays (D-Ohio), chairman of the investigating subcommittee, said that 37 congressional members would be summoned to appear before the panel when it opens three days of public hearings next Monday.

He would not say, however, whether Mrs. Powell was among the 37, but other sources said the subcommittee has been thinking of calling her.

As for Powell, himself, the subcommittee was having trouble sending him as "invitation" to appear. The House education and labor committee, which he heads, refused to accept a registered letter requesting his presence at a hearing next Wednesday.

These were the latest developments in the tangled affairs of the celebrated congressman.

LBJ Seeks End-The-War Talks With Commies

WASHINGTON (AP) — President Johnson is seeking to open a new opening for talks with the Communists on ending the war in Vietnam.

Johnson made known through a White House comment Wednesday night that he was ready to discuss an extended cease-fire in Vietnam, including a freeze on troop reinforcements "if the other side is responsive."

When press secretary Bill D. Moyers was asked whether that meant the United States was ready to talk over with the other side in the war the specific issues of an extended cease-fire and a "stand fast" by both sides he replied, "Yes."

Behind this new White House move lies a double purpose strategy, reflecting some guarded speculation among top officials here in recent weeks that holiday truce maneuvers might possibly open up some interesting possibilities for peace talks of much broader significance.

One major purpose behind the President's willingness to have discussions on the length and conditions of a cease-fire, therefore, is to find out whether the

Communist side is willing to exchange views directly or indirectly on any subject and whether it would be willing to go beyond the immediate issues into consideration of peacekeeping.

The second apparent purpose of the President's strategy is to make certain that the United States does not show signs of lagging in developing peace possibilities, however slender, and that if current efforts to prolong the cease-fire fail, the Communists will have to take the blame before the world.

Opposition to an extended cease-fire was expressed Wednesday by Sen. Milton R. Young, R-N.D., who recently returned from an inspection tour in South Vietnam. He said Gen. William C. Westmoreland, U.S. commander in Vietnam, and

South Vietnamese officials also oppose lengthening the holiday cease-fire.

The enemy has the most to gain from any short or long truce," Young said in an interview. He said "the toughest fighting yet" of the war in Vietnam will start soon in the rich Mekong Delta area.

Wednesday night's White House statement was prompted by a proposal by Senate Democratic Leader Mike Mansfield that the presently planned brief holiday truce be extended to a single cease-fire lasting just short of two months.

The Communists and the United States and its allies already have set one 48-hour truce for the period of Dec. 24-26 and another 48-hour truce for Dec. 31-Jan. 2. The allies also have proposed, but the Communists have not yet accepted, a 90-day suspension of combat for the Vietnamese new year, Feb. 8-12.

Homemaker's Corner

I am very sorry that I could not be with you last week but the flu bug caught up with me so had to spend a few days in bed.

Well, it's cookie baking time again. With Christmas just a short time away let's talk sweets for a while.

BUTTER SPITZ
(For cookie press)
1 tsp. almond extract
1/2 cup sugar
2 cup butter

1 egg
3/4 cup sifted flour
1/2 tsp. baking powder
1 tsp. almond extract
1/2 tsp. salt

Cream butter, adding sugar gradually. Add egg unbeaten. Then add sifted dry ingredients and extract. Force through cookie press. Bake in 400-degree oven 10 to 12 minutes.

KISSINGS
(Can be made 2 weeks ahead of time as the flavor will better.)

2 cups fat (2 sticks oleo and 2 sticks butter)
4 cups flour
1/2 cup powdered sugar
1/2 tsp. vanilla
2 cups nuts, chopped
1 lb. sugar

Cut fat into flour with blender and hands. Add sugar and mix. Add vanilla and nuts. Roll into small balls the size of marbles with hands. Bake in 325 degree oven for 30 minutes. (Do not let them brown). Remove from oven. Cool slightly on rack. Roll in sifted sugar while warm. Cool completely on rack. Roll again. Store in tight container. (Two-three weeks makes flavor better.)

DONUT BALLS
(Serve while hot and have more coming)
2 tbsps. shortening
2 eggs
3/4 tsp. baking powder
1/2 tsp. nutmeg
3/4 tsp. milk
1/2 cup sugar
4 1/2 cup flour
1 tsp. salt
1/2 cup cinnamon
1 egg
1/2 cup shortening
1 cup granulated sugar
1 tbsps. light molasses
1 egg, unbeaten
1/2 cup prepared mince meat
1 tsp. vanilla
1 cup rolled oats

Blend fat, sugar and eggs. Stir in dry ingredients alternately with milk. Chill. Roll out 1/4 inch thick. Cut with floured center from donut cutter. Fry in deep fat. Drain and sugar. Makes 2 1/2 dozen regular donuts or 6 dozen balls.


BRAZIL MinceMEAT COOKIES
1 cup sifted flour
1/2 tsp. baking soda
1 tsp. baking powder
1 tsp. salt
1 tsp. cinnamon
1/2 cup soft shortening
1 cup granulated sugar

1/2 cup prepared mince meat
1 tsp. vanilla
1 cup rolled oats

Sift together flour and next four ingredients. Cream shortening, sugar, molasses, egg with light and fluffy. Beat in mince meat. Beat in flour mixture along with vanilla, oats and nuts. Drop by tablespoon onto greased cookie sheet. Bake in 250 degree oven for 10-12 minutes. Makes 6 dozen. Store in canister or cookie jar.

GOLDEN KUMQUAT BREAD
2 cups sifted flour
1/2 tsp. soda
1 tsp. cream of tartar
1/2 tsp. salt
1/2 cup sugar
1 egg
1 tbsps. sour cream
3/4 cup silvered pitted preserved kumquats

2 tbsps. kumquat syrup
Sift flour, soda, cream of tartar and salt into a bowl. Soften butter to room temperature and cream with sugar. Add egg and beat again; then add cream. Fold in the kumquats and syrup. Add liquid ingredients to the dry and overmix. Spoon batter into a lightly buttered and floured loaf pan. Bake in 350 degree oven 50-60 minutes or until loaf tests done. Remove

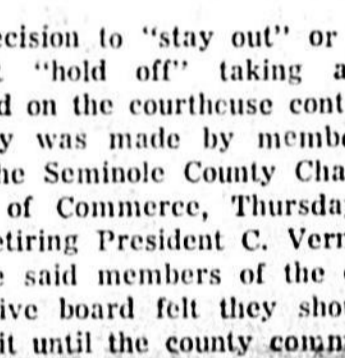
