Senator Edge Says Election Should Inure Revision of Volstead Act Within Constitutional Limits Soon

WASHINGTON, Nov. 4.—(AP)—The unusual haze inherent in prohibition as a political issue clouded the outcome in Tuesday's elections with the result that victory was claimed today by leaders of both wet and dry forces. The election, in the opinion of Senator Edge, Republican, New Jersey, and wet leader, "should inure Volstead act revision within constitutional limits," but Wayne B. Wheeler, general counsel for the Anti-Saloon League, declared that "in every state where the dries had a fighting chance, except Massachusetts, they won in the Senatorial contests, according to reports received at our headquarters." "From every significant angle of approach," said W. H. Stayton, national chairman of the Association Against the Prohibition Amendment, the results "may be fairly considered to constitute unqualified victories for the advocates of a substitution for some regulatory liquor laws for the prohibitory Eighteenth amendment and the vicious Volstead act."

STOCKHOLM, Sweden, Nov. 4.—(AP)—In the presence of the crowned heads of four nations, Princess Astrid, 20 year old niece of King Gustav of Sweden, was married today to Crown Prince Leopold, the Belgian heir apparent. Mayor Carl Lindhagen of Stockholm officiated at the civil ceremony, which will be followed by an ecclesiastical wedding in Brussels, next Wednesday. Seven crowned heads of Europe were present in Stockholm for the marriage. They were King Gustave of Sweden, uncle of Astrid, and his Queen, Victoria; Albert and Elizabeth of the Belgians; Haakon and Maud, of Norway, and Christian and Alexandra, of Denmark. In addition numerous Princes and Princesses and notables from foreign states had come to Stockholm for the ceremony. The Socialist mayor of Stockholm was designated to officiate at civil rites. The streets of the capital were bedecked with flags and bunting.

While the game with Winter Garden is not feared still Coach Whelchel is not underestimating the strength of the team and is working his charges very hard so that they will be in shape for a strenuous game. The game with Winter Garden will be followed immediately with one of the hardest games on the schedule which will be played with Daytona Beach in Daytona Beach.

Daytona Beach has one of the best teams in this section of the state and is making a strong fight for the state championship. It will be quite an upset in dope for Sanford High to defeat the East Coast team, but if the boys can keep up the pace that they are going at the present time they have a splendid chance of defeating Daytona. If they can shake the jinx that has been hanging on to them in the last three games they will bring the season to close with one of the strongest teams in this section of the state.

Coach Whelchel is working hard to eliminate some of the bad faults of the team and there may be some upset in the team when it takes the field against Winter Garden Saturday. The constant fumbling of the backs has kept the team from scoring many points that should have been without trouble. Bad passes from the center has been one of the causes of the constant fumbling and Sands is working hard to perfect his passing. With the fumbling eliminated there will be a great deal of difference in the work of the team and the backfield will find that it has a hole wherever they want to go for Sanford High has a forward wall that is always fighting hard. Lack of confidence has been a big drawback to the team all season and the game with Winter Garden should do a lot to destroy this evil.

The return of Angus Fordham to the squad will be a big help for the team. Sanford High has a strong line man and also a very capable backfield man for Fordham not only is able to play in the line but has also had quite a bit of experience in the backfield. However he will be needed more in the line than in the backfield and will doubtless play there.

Sanford High has a very good backfield in Mobley, Maxwell, Etodenbery and Captain Thompson, with Russell, Walker, Zachary and others waiting for a chance to display their wares. In the line Sanford High has a fairly heavy team with Fordham and Yancey at guards, both of these boys weigh right over 200 pounds.

Speer at left tackle though rather light has been playing a fine game all season. Nordgren at the other tackle is also light but has also played good football this season. The chances are that he will give way to Fordham who is both heavier and more experienced. Stoinoff and Entzinger at the wing positions leave little to be desired for both have played jam up football all season.

Notre Dame Will Be Admitted To Big Ten, Reported

CHICAGO, Nov. 3.—(AP)—Notre Dame's looming again as a national football champion, is now the question of Notre Dame's admission to the Big Ten.

Today, it was reported that five of the six votes necessary for the action were assured when the faculty representatives of the Western conference met here in executive session Nov. 26 and 27.

Two Outstanding Grid Contests Are On Schedule For East Saturday

NEW YORK, Nov. 3.—(AP)—Princeton and Harvard, headlining Saturday's football bill of traditional rivals, are not alone among Eastern friendly foes of long standing. The University of Pennsylvania and Penn State renew a football controversy after suspension of hostilities for a year, extending over a period of 25 years.

The first game between Princeton and Harvard was played in 1877, a total of 28 contests having been compiled in the meantime. Princeton has amassed a lead with 16 victories against nine triumphs for Harvard. Three were no-decision contests. Princeton has won four of the last five games. Harvard's only success since 1921 being scored in 1923. Harvard won five straight games from 1911 to 1916 inclusive when the series was interrupted by the war. Resuming the struggle, ties were recorded in 1919 and 1920.

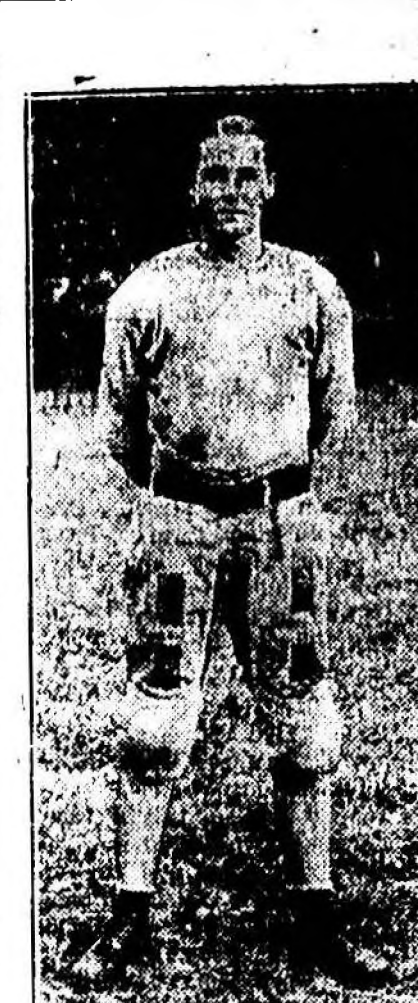
Pennsylvania and Penn State began to debate the football issue in 1890 a total of 26 returned Pennsylvania the victor 19 times and Penn State six times. In 1933 Pennsylvania nosed Penn State out 7 to 6 but was crushed by the Nittany Lion the following season 21 to 0.

West Virginia and Pittsburgh do not face each other as strangers. In recent years the games have been uniformly close. Pittsburgh won last year by a 15 to 17 score and the year before 14 to 7. West Virginia's margin of victory in 1928 was 13 to 7, the second successive triumph, the previous season's score being 9 to 6. Pittsburgh was 21 to 18 in 1921 and 24 to 15 in 1920. Both teams have scored in every game since 1919 when they first met.

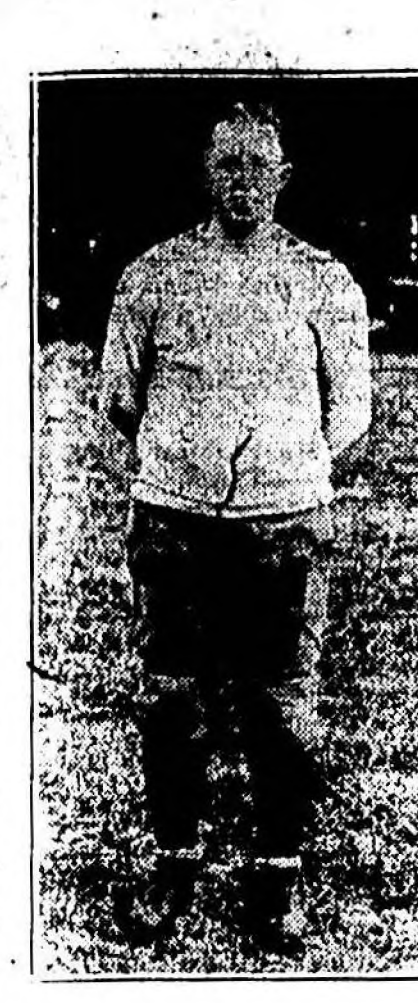

CHICAGO, Nov. 3.—West-coast conference football this week is a battle royal of personalities. And not all of them are beet-footed backs, because the Illinois-Chicago game is essentially a duel between A. A. Stagg and Bob Zuppke, who for years have taken their football out in coaching.

The Northwestern-Purdue engagement is, in addition to affording one of the three strongest battles in the Big Ten title chase to top out of the running, a contest between "Moon" Baker, veteran leader of the Purple, and "Cotton" Wilcox, back, who has played largely in making Purdue a conference threat this fall.

At Iowa it will be Kutzbach, who already has made his reputation with the Hawkeyes, and Herb Johnson, of Minnesota, who strengthened his bid for recognition by a brilliant share in last Saturday's routing out of Wisconsin.

In the way of personalities, Frosty Peters and the two they gave the Illini a 3-0 decision over Pennsylvania will be the head liners at the Illinois-Chicago game, but in the main the game matches "Old Man" Stagg and Zuppke.

Zuppke has all the best of it, on season's performance, but followers of the game recall a day in 1924 when the relative situation of the two teams was somewhat similar and Illinois had Grange and the late Walter Camp called the 21-21 tie one of the greatest games he had ever seen. On the strength of the tie, Chicago won the conference championship.

Stagg's attention was divided today between defense and a rhythmic shift which met with some success against Ohio State and which he hopes a backfield intact for the first time in weeks will make effective against his old rival.

At Michigan, Yost, too, worked on some new attack strategy with a team chastened by the altogether unexpected downfall before Navy. At Wisconsin, George Little drilled the Badgers against Michigan plays as executed by his freshmen.

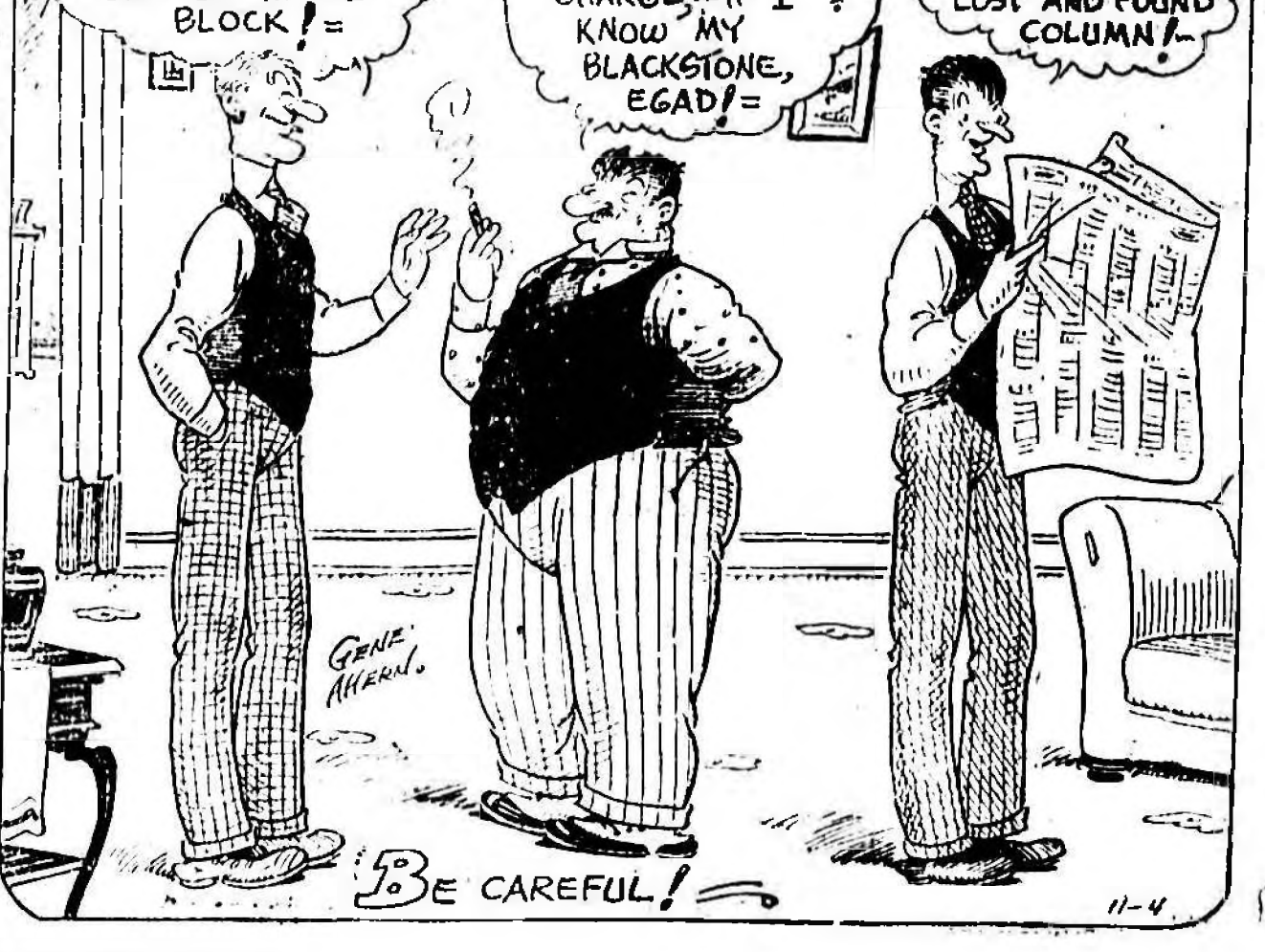
