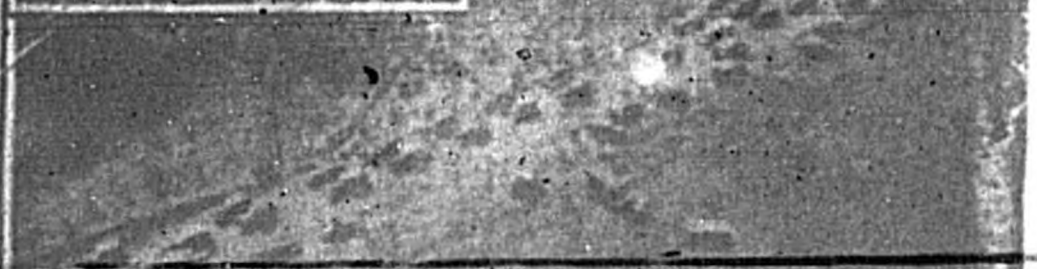

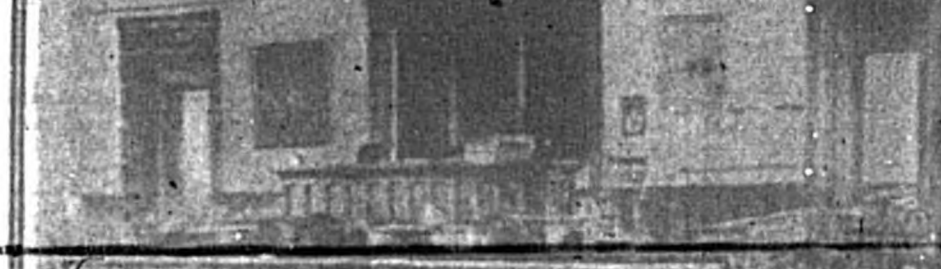

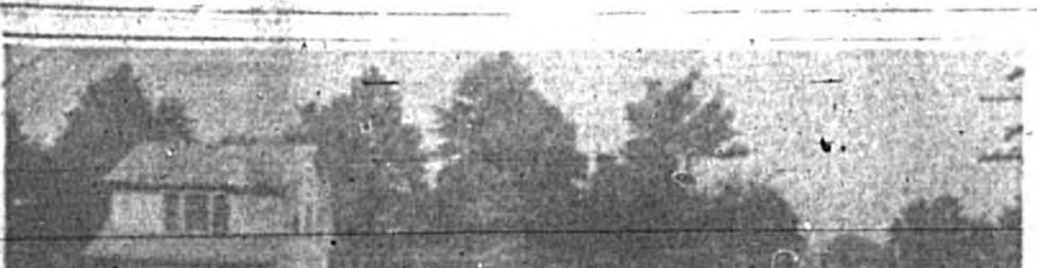

THE SOCIAL LIFE of the community is shown in this photograph. A group of people are gathered for a social event, and the atmosphere is festive.



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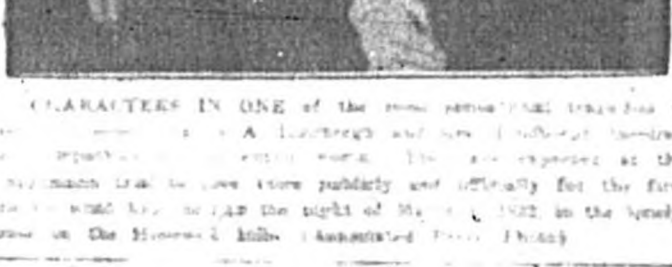
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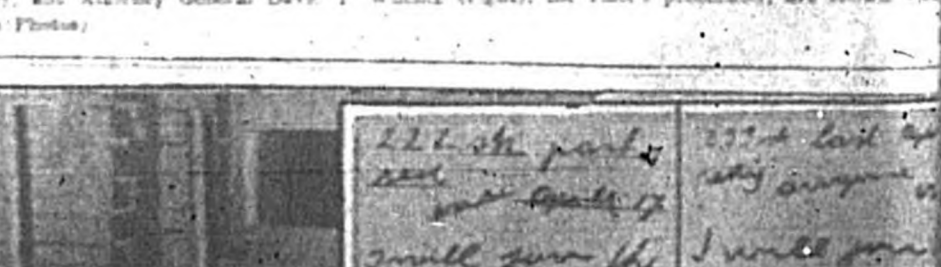
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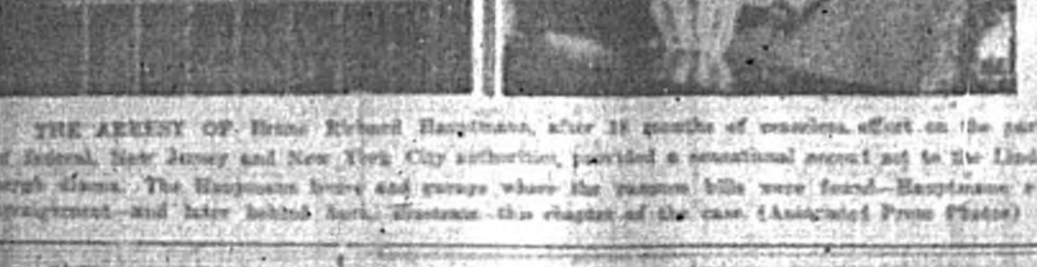
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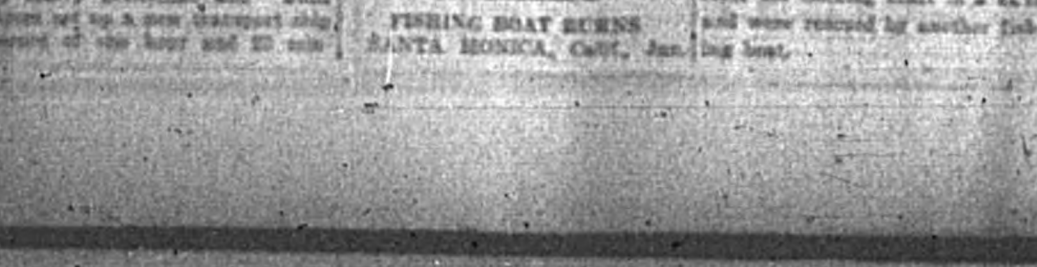
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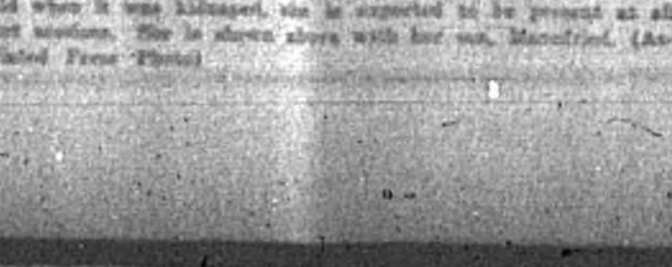
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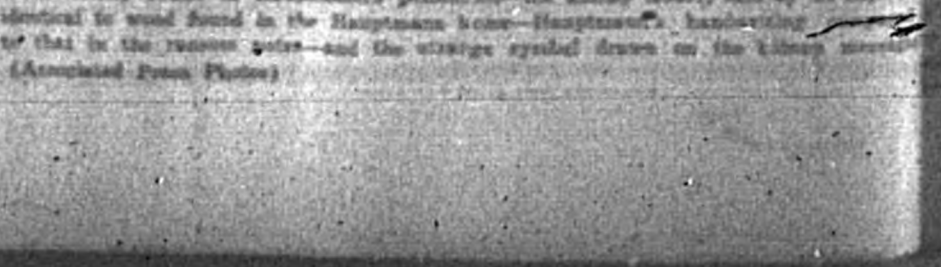
