

Mother Teresa Receives A 'People's Peace Prize'

OSLO, Norway (UPI) - Mother Teresa, the frail nun who has devoted her life to the starving and destitute of Calcutta, led a torchlight procession in sub-zero temperatures just hours before she was to receive the 1979 Nobel Peace Prize.

The procession Sunday night moved quietly from Oslo Cathedral to a mission hall where Mother Teresa. wearing sandals and a threadbare coat over the blue and white sari of her Roman Catholic order, received \$72,000 collected by Norwegians in all parts of the country as a "people's peace prize."

Instead of the celebrations after the official awards

ceremony at Oslo University, the 69-year-old nun last week persuaded the Nobel Foundation to spend the \$5.800 set aside for a banquet on an extra day's food rations for some of the 250,000 starving, pavementdwellers of Calcutta.

Embassy Attacks Must Be Halted

Officially, the Libyan government has apologized to the United States for the attacks on our embassy in Tripoli. That isn't enough. William L. Eagleton, the charge d'affaires at the embassy, says it was obvious the government of Col. Moammar Khadafy made no attempt to interfere with the mob that stormed and burned the U.S. mission.

Exchanges of protests and apologies between two governments after such an incident might fit the accepted diplomatic procedure. But attacks on U.S. missions abroad have become a pattern since the seizure of our embassy in Tehran, and the solution is not to pick up the pieces after they occur. There must be assurance that foreign embassies everywhere in the world — and not just those of the United States — will be protected by their host governments.

The United Nations should realize that normal international relations depend on that assurance. The United Nations must deal eventually also with the larger issue: What to do when a govern- is a heavy-handed attack on any individual or ment willfully fails to fullfill its internationallyrecognized obligation to protect foreign diplomatic personnel and the embassies they






