





#### Americans Like Their Ice Cream

How a practice started in fun has turned out to be one of the largest industries in the United States is inerestingly described in a recent story appearing in the press of the country. Seventy-seven years ago, Jacob Fussell, a Baltimore milk merchant, started an enterprise which has ultimately developed into a big factor in American commerce, that is the \$650,000,000 wholesale ice

The story of how ice cream came to be manufactured dates to reverses, which Fussell suffered in his milk business. He had a limited outlet for his product and to solve the problem he conceived the idea of freezing his surplus Of terrible brightness hard to to place it in storage. It was only a matter of a short time that through experimentation sugar and flavoring were added to the milk and the basis for the present industry was established.

The first factory for manufacturing ice cream was Terested in Washington in 1856 and in 1862 another was constructed in Boston. Soon one was built in St. Louis It flees into abstraction merged and others followed in quick succession. Artificial refrigeration, discovered in 1867, contributed a great deal to the success of the ice cream makers, whose product became popular at once although it was considered a luxury. 
