

Position Gives Soviet Union Command Of Sea Routes Through Lower Baltic Area

In this day, when Moscow, London and Washington are engaging in making flerce faces at one another, it has become popular to view Soviet Russia's foreign tactics through two sets of glasses. One is, that every Russian move is acculated as part of an imperialistic chess game for world dominion. The other is that the Russian maneuvers only are part of a defense to secure all of the Seviet Union's frontiers.

Moscow regards the first viewpoint as just so much strange nonsense. It looks upon the second—that of security—as a legi-timate and necessary aim. In this, Russian spokesmen have continue on her way, not turning aside, but not making attempts

whereby the Russians command il the sea routes through the lower Baltic.

It was on May 10, 1945, that the Russian forces stormed the Danish island of Bornholm, and liberated it from the Germans. That was one day after British warships, racing in from the west, had caught remnants of the German fleet in Copenhagen Harbor. Rad Army units quickly rounded up the Nazi occupation forces on Red Army units quickly rounded up the Nazi occupation forces on this assistance of Denmark, and sent a delegation to the Danish capital in June to announce that the Russians would stay as long as Stalin, Truman and Churchill found it necessary. At the time, the big three were preparing for the Potsdam conference.

Congratulations to Sanford on maintaining a swell showplace, and may the growth of your zoo be steady now that the war has ended and difficulties are less".

Builing the last few years before the war when automobile travel was easy and Monkey Island had first been constructed, it was not unusual for as many as five thousand people to visit the Zoo during a single afternoon. During the war this attendance dropped considerably due to the difficulties of travel and the scarcity of time for such entertainment.
