# City takes steps to collect water bill

SANFORD - As residents stream out of embattled Ridgewood Villas apartment complex, the city on Thursday shut off water in two additional buildings because of unpaid water bills.

Water was shut off in buildings three and five Thursday because no one had come forward to make payments for the Some Ridgewood residents still haven't paid rent

buildings. The apartment and condominium complex is located near Seminole High School.

City officials believe there are only two lifted an injunction preventing the city families now living in the two buildings.

Water is also off in building four, which

Tuesday. The city agreed to leave water on if rent and condo association payments were made that could then be credited toward paying the water bill.

"We were hoping to receive payments for buildings three and five," said City Manager Tony VanDerworp. "We never

# Police arrest man who threatens to spread AIDS virus

SANFORD- A 22-year old Sanford man, recently released from prison following a fouryear sentence, has been arrested and charged with armed robery, armed sexual battery, and attempted murder.

Sanford police apprehended Brian Wynn at approximately 5:37 p.m. Thursday at his West

11th Street residence. Police reports indicate that late Wednesday night and shortly after midnight on Thursday, Wynn used a .25 caliber pistol to force two male victims to have sex with him at a wooded area on South Marshall

Street in Sanford. He also forced at gunpoint the male victims to have sex with each other. Wynn told the victims he had AIDS (HIV) and was going to spread it to as many people as possible.

Sanford police identified Wynn with the help of the two victims who picked his photo out of a police mug book.

"He was recently released after a four year term for felony delivery of a weapon among other charges," said Sanford detective Kris Ziegler.

Ziegler could not comment on whether Wynn has tested positive for HIV or whether the two male victims will undergo medical screening.

# Oviedo residents protest location of water treatment plant

OVIEDO - Oviedo residents are fighting plans to place a water treatment facility behind the Winn Dixie shopping center on Lockwood Boulevard.

An analysis performed by **Public Resources Management** Group of Maitland recommends that the city consider financing construction of a water treatment facility that could process 8 million gallons per day.

City officials said the size of the tank at the proposed treatment facility has yet to be determined. There is \$6.5 million in funding available for the treatment system. The facility could be ready for use in two years.

In 2002, the city's water system may have a revenue deficiency of \$540,000, leading to an increase in the average monthly water bill of \$2.90 per account, according to the analysis report.

Four residents from subdivisions near the Winn Dixie shopping center spoke in opposition to the treatment facility at Monday's Oviedo City Council meeting.

"We moved into an area with a beautiful view," Mildred Woodman said. "We've got a wonderful community. This will destroy the property values."

The residents said they were concerned that property values would decline, and that vehicles will transport waste products See Oviedo, Page 2A

along private streets. "Such a large, deadly facility doesn't belong anywhere near our fine community," Joan Gudencauf said.

In a move that will help to pave the way for the treatment facility, the City Council on Monday voted 3-2 in favor of a \$177,587 agreement with CPH Engineers for the design of the reclaim water transmission main and pump station.

The first part of the project, at a cost of \$156,095, provides for ... work needed to meet state revolving fund requirements and to prepare contract documents for the pump station at the McCulloch Road-Lockwood Boulevard intersection and transmission line from the pump station.

If Seminole County agrees to fund the second part of the project, costing \$21,492, the transmission line will be provided

from the McCulloch Road-Lockwood Boulevard intersection to the State Road 434-McCulloch Roach intersection.

Councilmen George Veile and Gary Gotwalt voted against the agreement, saying they are concerned that the project could cost more than the estimates indicate.

Chairman Tom Hagood said that while he is also concerned about the final cost of the project, work needs to be performed to determine whether the storage facility is needed while state revolving trust funds are still available for the project.

"How much money are we going to pour into this until we decide that it is not feasible?" Gotwalt said.

In addition to the water treatment facility, the analysis by **Public Resources Management** Group also recommends that the city consider construction of a residential reuse distribution system which would make treated effluent available to 4,900 residents.

Williford said construction on the reuse distribution system could begin in 12 months, and be complete in 36 months.

The analysis said the water treatment facility would increase the city's operation and maintenance costs, and that it is expected to lead to a loss of revenue because of the use of the reuse distribution system as an alternative for potable water for. irrigation.

Actual increases in the monthly water bill for residential and commercial users will be determined after the city performs a review of the rates.

When the first reuse customers are connected during fiscal year 2001, the monthly implied bill for the reuse distribution system is expected to be

\$12, the analysis said.

Sun and Moon

The rate assumes that all residences where the service is available will be required to pay for the reuse distribution system. If the city does not adopt a mandatory connection requirement, the monthly implied rate could increase to \$18 per month.

If the city only constructs the water treatment facility, and not the distribution system, the analysis said rates for service may not immediately increase as much. However, the analysis said the city would probably need to increase water treatment capacity to meet potable water

A public meeting to discuss the proposed treatment facility and other aspects of the city's reclaimed water distribution system is scheduled for Aug. 17, 7 p.m., at the Memorial Building on Central Avenue.

church again, and he never did He took up other pursuits Most surveys show that friendliness ranks among the top reasons people



# WIN AT BRIDGE

### The textbook deal at the table


Real deals rarely look like those from a bridge class. Yet sometimes they do - like this one from the North American Swiss Teams in Vancouver, which was spotted by Henry Bethe. How should the play go in six no-

trump after a spade lead? North might have responded two notrump, but with nothing in clubs he

preferred to let the very strong hand become the declarer. Also, if South held a long suit, North had support and could push the bidding into at least a small slam. There are seven winners in spades


and diamonds, so declarer needs five more from the hearts and clubs without losing two. As there are two ways to broach the clubs (either finesse immediately or cash the ace first), but only one way to play the hearts (finesse), it is right to take the heart finesse first. If it loses, you need three club tricks

without conceding a trick. So you must play East for the king by finessing the



jack and queen. Here, though, the heart finesse works. Again you need three club tricks, but you can afford to lose one. This changes the best play. You should start with the ace from hand. When the king drops, you are home. But if only low clubs appear, you enter dummy in diamonds to lead toward the queen-jack of clubs. You succeed whenever East has the club king, and also when West has the singleton king, doubleton king-10, or any king-third, -fourth or -fifth without the 10. That's much better than taking a first-round finesse.

At the table, both declarers immediately finessed the club queen and couldn't recover.

# Should humans avoid dairy products?

DEAR DR. GOTT: Is it true that lactose intolerance is actually normal and that humans aren't meant to consume dairy products after they've been weaned?

DEAR READER: I don't know whether humans "aren't meant" by nature to eat dairy products. Maybe we're not meant to eat oysters, snails, sushi, blue cheese or chocolate pudding, either. But we do.

Actually, we have an astonishing ability to digest almor anything, iron and calcium included. Part of this ability is due to a remarkable process called "enzyme induction."

In order to digest lactose (milk sugar), we need an intestinal chemi-cal called lactase. Babies don't have it. They are born with enzymes to digest mother's milk, not cow's milk.

However, over time, when infants are fed cow's milk, their intestines get the message to begin producing the appropriate enzyme. În general, as long as humans continue to drink cow's milk, they continue to produce lactase for digestion. When they stop consuming dairy products, they make far less of the enzyme. As people age, their ability to make digestive chemicals declines, so elderly folks may

develop an intolerance to the lactose in milk. This intolerance will become more pronounced if they avoid milk altogether. Lactose problems lead to abdominal pain, bloating and diar-

For people with lactose intolerance, pre-digested dairy products are a real boon. Such individuals can continue to receive the protein and calcium benefits of milk-containing foods without the unpleasant symptoms. Lactaid is a widely available product for this

Therefore, while it's not my job to regulate what we "aren't meant" to eat, I can suggest that people avoid foods they know will upset their digestive functions and use Lactaid if they are lactose intolerant.

DEAR DR. GOTT: What can I do for a post-nasal drip? I wake up at night with an itchy throat and dry cough.

DEAR READER: Post nasal drip is a common consequence of allergies and can ordinarily be controlled by

taking an antihistamine, such as Actifed, Allegra, Claritin or Zyrtec. If your sleep is being consistently disrupted, you may want to see your doctor and discover to what you are aller-



gic. Once you can avoid the allergen, your post-nasal drip may disappear without the use of medicine. To give you related information, I am sending you a copy of my Health Report "Allergies." # Crossing guards trained and ready

SANFORD- Motorists will be seeing a familiar site around school zones come Monday morning. The county's 160 school crossing guards will be out in force, safely escorting elementary and middle school kids across intersections that

"They're trained and ready to go," said Linda Moss, Supervisor of the School Crossing Guard

Each of the county's part-time employees receive eight-hours of formal training and must be certified by the State of Florida and the Department of Transportation.

"We split the training into segments," Moss explained. "The crossing guards take four hours of classroom training, then we go out to actual sites and practice on the street for two hours."

She said the final portion of training consists of more classroom instruction and video tape train-

The majority of the crossing guards are retired persons and mothers with young elementary school-aged children who like to stay on the same schedule as their kids while working part

Crossing guards work weekly shifts of either 10 hours or 20 hours depending on the type of school and location they are assigned to. They earn \$8 per hour for their work in helping guide youngsters safely to and from school campuses.

Mosa said although training for this year is complete, her division is still looking for five more crossing guards to add to its staff. Applicants must be a minimum of 18-years old, possess a valid Florida driver's license, have a high school diploma or GED equivalent, be fingerprinted and submit to a Florida criminal background investigation.

Prospective crossing guards may contact Moss at the Seminole County Sheriff's department by dialing 665-5600.

complex. The water bill for building two was paid in full by Jack Sirianni, the general manager of Ridgewood Villas, Inc. The water bill for building one was also partially paid by Siranni.

Sirianni said that it would be up to residents in the buildings to make rent or condo association payments, which would be credited in full toward paying the water bill for the buildings.

"It's on the residents," Sirianni said. "If they would pay rent, this water problem would not exist. They can pay their rent to the city or to (Central Florida) Legal Services, who will pay the city."

VanDerworp said the city is now owed \$17,000 in unpaid water bills. He said that while an estimated 28 of the 60 units in the complex were occupied early this week, residents appear to be moving out of each of the buildings.

"There's no way of knowing right now how many are living there," VanDerworp said. "But, the number has significantly decreased. We think some residents in buildings three and five may be living in vacant units of buildings one or two."

Each of the buildings are now being inspected daily by the city to protect the safety of the remaining residents, and building four is boarded up, VanDerworp said.

A state inspector issued a closure notice on the complex on July 7 after finding health and safety code violations. The operating license at the complex was revoked.

Charles Rowe, director of community development for the city, said that condemnation of Ridgewood Villas is being considered.


If staff decides to request condemnation for the complex, the matter would come before the Sanford City Commission on Aug. 23 at the earliest, Rowe said.







ORLANDO - The Orlando Magic have obtained former first round draft selection Pat Garrity. two-time All-Star Danny Manning, and two future first round draft selections from Phoenix, in exchange for Anfernee "Penny" Hardaway in a sign-and-trade deal, Magic General Manager John Gabriel announced Thursday evening.

"We are looking forward to a new era of Magic basketball," said Gabriel, adding, "one which we believe will be extremely exciting with the young talent we have and will assemble.

The Magic have now accumulated 10 first round draft selections over the next five years.

Hardaway was acquired by the Magic in a 1993 draft day trade from Golden State in exchange for the rights to Chris Webber and three first round draft picks. He spent six years in a Magic uniform, averaging 19.0 points per game,

6.3 rebounds per game and 4.7 assists per Last season, he averaged 15.8 points per game, 5.7 rebounds per game and 5.3 assists per game, while shooting 42 percent from the

As a rookie last season for Phoenix, Garrity (6foot-9, 231-pounds) averaged 5.6 points per game and 1.9 rebounds per game in 17.3 minutes per game, while shooting 50 percent from the field. He saw action in 39 games, while starting nine contests.

As a starter, Garrity averaged 13.8 points per game and 5.3 rebounds per game, while shooting 59 percent from the floor. He became the first Suns rookie since Michael Finley (April 10, 1996) to lead Phoenix in scoring in a game with his scason-high 25 points against San Antonio (April 10th). In his first start, Garrity responded with 16 points at Portland (April 3rd).

Garrity averaged 9.0 points per game and 3.0 rebounds per game, while shooting 53 percent from the floor, in three playoff games (first round series vs. Portland) as well.

Garrity was originally the 19th overall pick in

the 1998 NBA Draft by the Milwaukee Bucks. He was then traded to the Dallas Mavericks with Dirk Nowitzki for Robert Traylor. He then was acquired by Phoenix from Dallas on draft day with Martin Muursepp, Bubba Wells and an unconditional 1999 first round pick in exchange for Steve Nash.

Garrity finished third on the Notre Dame alltime scoring list with 2,085 points, trailing only former NBA stars Austin Carr and Adrian Dantley. He was named the Big East Player of the Year as a junior and was First Team All-Big East as a junior and senior.

He was a All-America (second team) selection as a senior and finished sixth in the NCAA in scoring (23.2 points per game). He finished with a 3.7 grade point average in pre-med at Notre Dame and was one of 22 Irish student-athletes involved in the Academic Honors Program at No-

Danny Manning (6-foot-10, 244-pounds) fin-ished his 11th NBA season and fifth with Phoenix last year by averaging 9.1 points per game and 4.4 rebounds per game. He placed 18th in the NBA in field goal percentage (48.4) and saw action in all 50 games after recovering from surgery to repair a torn anterior cruciate knee liga-

He is the first professional athlete to return from three ACL injuries (surgery on April 24, 1998, right knee; December 28, 1995, left; January 14, 1989, right). Manning averaged 12.7 points per game in Phoenix's first round playoff series vs. Portland (three games) last


Manning has averaged 16.6 points per game and 6.0 rebounds per game over the course of his career, while shooting 51.6 percent from the floor. He has seen action in 675 regular season games and 33 playoff contests, averaging 17.5 points per game in postseason play.


Manning was originally the No. 1 pick overall of the 1988 NBA Draft by the Los Angeles Clippers after being named the college National Player of the Year and leading the University of Kansas to the 1988 national title.

He played the first five-plus years of his career with the Clippers, before going to Atlanta and then signing with Phoenix in the 1994 offseason. He led the Clippers to their first playoff berth in 16 seasons in 1991-92.

Over the course of his career, Manning has ranked in the top 10 in field goal percentage three times [9th in 1996-97, 8th in 1994-95, 8th in 1991-92). He was an All-Star in 1993 and 1994, and was winner of the NBA's Sixth Man of the Year Award in 1997-98.
