Seminole County property will be appraised for tax purposes at 100 per cent of its value, according to the constitutional mandate that real estate be assessed at "full cash value."

Comptroller Ray E. Green has prepared a tax manual which tax assessors must follow in figuring the worth of real estate for tax purposes. The law requires that assessors use the "yardsticks" in the manual. Failure to do so could lead to suspension by the governor.

Thus, it appears that Dowling Appraisal Co., which now is appraising all county property, must change its cards to show the 'full cash value" of property already appraised. Cards on property yet to be appraised will carry the "100 per cent value" requested by Mrs. Mary Earle Walker, Semiaole County lax assessor.

The Commission is one body; the tax assessor's office tra separate and distinct part of our government. Commissioners have no jurisdiction over assessment rates, just as the tax assessor has no jurisdiction over the millage rate for county taxes.

Mrs. Walker agreed to the hiring of Dowling for appraisals. However, she is not obligated to accept these figures. It is her duty to appraise and assess county proper-
